## Nazareth Man Killed in Italy On June 26

Lieutenant <sup>31 1944</sup> Fred Druckenmiller, 26, of Nazareth, who was previously reported missing in action since June 25 during operations in Italy, is now officially reported killed in action on June 26 a message from the War Department informed his parents, Mr. and Mrs. B. W. Druckenmiller, 433 E. Center Street, Nazareth.

Lt. Druckenmiller has received considerable recognition for having been one of the first tank drivers to enter Rome. A member of an armored tank division, the Nazareth serviceman had been in service for the past two years and had spent 16 months overseas.

After graduating from Ben Avon High School, Pittsburgh, Lt. Druckenmiller attended the University of Pittsburgh for two years. He received his basic training at Fort Knox, Ky.

He is survived by his parents, a brother, Pfc. Garrett Druckenmiller, who is attached to the Canine division at Fort Royal, Va.; and a sister, Mrs. Raymond G. Benjamin, of Nazareth. He is a nephew of Dr. Stanley Druckenmiller, Lansford.
