Nazareth Man **Killed in Italy** On June 26

Lieut Fred Druckenmiller, 26, of Nazareth, who was previously reported missing in action since June 25 during operations in Italy, is now officially reported killed in action on June 26 a message from the War Department informed his parents, Mr. and Mrs. B. W. Druck-enmiller, 433 E. Center Street, Nazaareth.

Lt. Druckenmiller has received considerable recognition for having been one of the first tank drivers to enter Rome. A member of an armored tank division, the Nazaareth serviceman had been in service for the past two years and had spent 16 months overseas.

After graduating from Ben Avon High School, Pittsburgh, Lt. Druck-enmiller attended the University of Pittsburgh for two years. He re-ceived his basic training at Fort Knox, Ky.

He is survived by his parents, a brother, Pfc. Garrett Druckenmiller, who is attached to the Canine division at Fort Royal, Va.; and a sis-ter, Mrs. Ravmond G. Benjamin, of Nazareth. He is a nephew of Dr. Stanley Druckenmiler, Lansford.
