tanks and trains, cutting vital railroad lines and otherwise helping in
the aerial offensive aginst Germany.

and two daughters reside at R. D. 3,
Easton, is in the Army Air Corps for
two years and received his commission in February, 1944, at Craig Field,
Selma, Ala, Before joining the
Army Air Corps he was employed by
the Sparrows Point plant of the
Bethlehem Steel Company.
