Norval Ramson, Jr., to Join
Federal Communications In-
formation Center.

City Council today granted Norval K. Ramson, Jr., of 856 Media Street, a leave of absence for the duration of the war. He had been in the employ of the city for more than three years serving in the capacity of assistant city electrician.

He will join the forces of the Federal Communications Commission, and will be assigned to duty at an information center, at Charleston, S. C.

A son of Mr. and Mrs. Norval K. Ramson, Sr., of 912 North Bergen Street, Fountain Hill, he has a keen knowledge of radio in all its phases, and shortly after the installation of the two-way police radio system in this city, he was placed in charge.

About three years ago he built and installed the present system at the local police headquarters, this modern equipment replacing the original set. He also installed the receiving and transmitting sets in the police cruiser cars, and has serviced both the control center and the cars, since the installation.
