Battle Wounds Fatal To Pvt. Groeger

MAY 11 1945

Injured by mortar shell fragments on April 16 during the fighting in the Italian Alps, Pvt. Albert F. Groeger, son of Adolph Groeger, Sr., 817 Carlton Avenue, this city, died from his injuries on May 1, according to a War Department telegram received last night by his father. The Bethlehem soldier, who would

have been 25 years old on July 18, was a member of Co. G, 37th Mountain Infantry of the Fifth Army. He had been in the service since February 10, 1943, and was sent overseas after training periods at Camps Wheeler and Swift. He attended the Holy Ghost Parochial School and was a graduate of Liberty High and employed by Bethlehem Steel prior to his entry into the service.

Pvt. Groeger is survived by his father and these brothers and sisters: Rose, wife of Frank Shamenek, Bethlehem; Adolph, Jr., of Easton; Francis Groeger, Bethlehem; Theresa, wife of Ralph Rau; Agnes, wife of William Deetz, Jr.; Anna, wife of Ellsworth Johnson, and Marie Groeger, at home.
