Now Second Class Seaman; Sent to Radio School

Charles R. Lux, 23, son of Mrs. Ida M. and the late John Lux, 606 Fiot Street, Fountain Hill, has completed his "boot" training at the U. S. Naval Station at Sampson, N. Y., and yesterday he was transferred as second class seaman to Jacksonville, Fla., to take instruction in the radio school for six weeks.

He was inducted into the service on June 10 last, while his mother resided at 764 Pawnee Street, Bethlehem, and he left for Sampson on July 2. On August 17 he completed his boot training with the rating of seaman second class.
