Sgt. Carl M. Husser, the eldest of the boys, is stationed at Fort Monmouth, N. J., where he is attending Officers' Candidate School. He graduated from Liberty High School in 1938. Sgt. Husser is married to the former Theresa Madl and is a member of the Holy Ghost Parish and Choir. Before entering the service he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company. He has been in the service since June 13, 1942.
