

Sgt. J. Bruno Dies in Mishap In California

Master Sergeant John M. Bruno, Seventh Armored Division, with a base at Camp Young, California, died on Tuesday, the result of a motor vehicle accident at a desert training point. Information relating to his death was received late last night by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John M. Bruno of 1128 Stanley Avenue, Fountain Hill, from Lt. Col. Byron De La Mater.

Born in Bethlehem, he was a son of John and Mary (Barilko) Bruno, and was a lifelong resident. He graduated from SS. Cyril and Methodius parochial school, and from Bethlehem Business College.

In November 1925 he entered the employ of the old Bethlehem National Bank; later became clerk to the bank's receiver, serving in that capacity from March 1933 to December 1940, when he returned to the new Bethlehem National Bank as a teller. He was inducted into the armed forces on March 12, 1942.

He was prominent in bowling circles, having been affiliated with the City Bowling League and independent teams. He was a member of the Catholic Sokols; Bethlehem Lodge of Elks, No. 191; Bethlehem Police Social Club; Holy Name Society of St. Ursula Church, and the Hogan A. C. of Allentown. He was a former grand knight of Trinity Council No. 313, Knights of Columbus.

Besides his parents he is survived by four brothers, Andrew, Bethlehem; Joseph, George and Michael, Fountain Hill, and a sister, Anna, at home. Funeral arrangements will be announced.
