West Bangor Soldier Visits Italy Relatives

Word has come from Italy of the promotion of Ernest Cali, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Cali, of West Bangor, to corporal. He entered the Army in November, 1941, and was first stationed at Fort Bragg, N. C., later being transferred to Camp Blanding, Fla. He went overseas to England in July, 1942, where he was stationed until November when he participated in the invasion of North Africa. He saw action with the Field Artillery in about five different engagements and was also in Sicily.

While in Naples he discovered his father's brothers and sisters whom he had never seen before. These newly-discovered relatives took Corp. Cali to see his father's birthplace and other places which were of family interest. Through them he was able to learn much

of the condition of Italy and the reactions of the Italian people. He is still in the Italian theater of war.

Corp. Cali attended Pen Argyl schools and before his induction

was employed as a foreman at the Imperial Shirt Co.

He has a brother, John, in the service, who is stationed at Laury Field, Denver, Colo., serving with the Air Corps. John was inducted in September, 1943, and took his basic training at Miami Beach, Fla., going to Colorado to attend gunnery school last month.
