Foot Soldier Recovers From Battle Hurts

THE 232ND STATION HOSPITAL, ENGLAND — Wounded by machine gun fire in the legs while his infantry unit was moving up to attack German positions in Belgium, Corporal George E. Wagner, 37, of 812 Center Street, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, is now recovering at this United States Army station hospital in England. He has been awarded the Purple Heart.

"Cpl. Wagner is recovering satisfactorily and will be able to return to duty after a course in reconditioning exercises which he is taking in the hospital remedial gymnasium," said his ward officer, Captain Herbert B. McLauthlin of Denver, Colorado.

Cpl. Wagner was given first aid by medical soldiers soon after he was hit and was taken to a dressing station. He was transferred to an evacuation hospital and brought by boat to England.
