Roseto Soldier Home On Furlough After Invasion

Pfc. Rudolph Trigiani of the United States Army, son of Mr. and Mrs. Antonio Trigiani, of Garibaldi Street, Roseto, has returned home for a short furlough. He was wounded in France on June 8 after taking a very active part in the D-Day invasion as a leader of a bazooka assault force.

He had been in a hospital in England for the past two months recovering from injuries to his jaw and arm and is presently convalescing at a hospital unit at Mitchel Field, N. Y.

His parents operate the Trigiani store in Roseto and he has three brothers also serving in the armed forces. They are Pvt. Raymond Trigiani of Fort Meyers, Fla.; Pvt. Romeo Trigiani, of the U. S. Army now in Italy, and Cpl. Albert Trigiani of the U. S. Army now at Fort Meade, Md.
