**Capt. Henry Mack  
To be Returned to  
Inactive Status**

SEYMOUR JOHNSON FIELD, Goldsboro, N. C.—Captain Henry Mack, a former resident of Bethlehem, who graduated in 1939 from Lehigh University, has been transferred from this First Air Force base to the Separation Center at Camp Blanding, Fla., prior to being returned to an inactive status under the Army Adjusted Service Rating system, according to an announcement by Col. Dudley B. Howard, commanding officer.

A reserve officer by virtue of his ROTC training, Captain Mack was called to active duty on September 23, 1941. Assigned as a squadron adjutant, supply officer and personal affairs officer, he served in the European Theater of Operations from July 16, 1942 until February 8, 1945. He wears the Unit Badge Citation, the American Defense Service Medal, and the European-African-Middle Eastern ribbon with bronze battle stars for the Egypt-Libya.
