LEHIGH GRADUATE DIES FOLLOWING AIR CRASH

Commissioned as Ensign on Graduation Day-Resigned Rank to Become Air Cadet.

Aviation Cadet Willard P. Bear, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis G. Bear, of Friedens, Slatington, R. D. 1, died at the Naval Reserve Air Base, Lambert Field, St. Louis, Mo., Monday of injuries received in an airplane crash Sunday.

Cadet Bear was born in Weisenberg Township, Lehigh County a son of Francis G. and Sallie M., nee Welker, Bear. He graduated from North Whitehall Township School, 1932, and from Slatington High School, 1936. He took a postgraduate course at Slatington High in 1937.

He attended Lehigh University,
graduating in 1941 as an electrical
engineer. On the day of his graduation he became an ensign in the
Naval Reserve. He spent seven
weeks of training at the Naval Reserve station, Washington, D. C.,
and then was sent to Hawaii, where
he spent a year being promoted
to a lieutenant, junior grade.
Cadet Bear then resigned his
commission and was transferred to
California, where he became a preflight student as a naval cadet. He
was assigned to Lambert Field, Mo.,
November 11, 1942, where he remained until his fatal crash.
He was a star scout in the Boy
Scouts and was a cornet player in
the band while attending Lehigh.
