The sailors are: S. J. Blum, Signalman 3/C, son of Mrs. J. S. Blum, 55 East Walnut Street; R. R. Hartzell, Fire-man 2/C, son of Mrs. M. Hartzell, 1414 Cortland Street; L. K. Heft, Seaman 1/C, son of Mrs. P. Heft, 2112 Linden Street, and W. E. Koch, Signalman 3/C, son of W. Koch, 131 East Elizabeth Avenue. Their cruiser participated in car-rier strikes against Okinawa and Formosa, and took part in the epic battle for Leyte Gulf alding in the sinking of an enemy cruiser shoot-ing down two planes and assisting in the destruction of another.
