BETHANY E.-R. CHURCH DEDICATES HONOR ROLL

**Plaque Includes 29 Names—
Seven of Group Present—
Army, Navy Men Attend.**

During its morning service Sunday Bethany Evangelical and Reformed Church unveiled and dedicated a plaque in tribute to these members of the church who have been or will be inducted into the services of the nation. Twenty-nine names are inscribed upon it.

Seven Army men stationed in Bethlehem under Lieutenant W. H. Squartz, of York, attended the service as did ten Ensigns of the Navy under Ensign W. T. Hollis, of New Mexico, at present doing graduate work at Lehigh.

The Roll of Honor was unveiled by Betty A. Ruhe, of 1516 Spring Street. It includes the names of three of her brothers: Edwin M., of the Marine Corps, George H., of the Navy, and Harry J., of the Army.

The section of the sanctuary nearest the plaque was received for the families and friends of those in the service, and a red rose was presented to the mothers for each son or daughter whose name appeared on the roll, and to each wife whose husband is enrolled.

Three of the men themselves were present, namely Pvt. Herbert Shadler, Jr., of Ft Eustis, Virginia; Apprentice Seaman Conrad Seifert, of Manhattan Beach, N. Y.; and Sergeant Harold Hottentstine, of Fort Sill, Okla.
