Technical Sergeant William Kreshka and his brother, Corporal Alex Kreshka, 1637 Eleventh Street, Bethlehem, recently met at Chalon, France, their first meeting in four years.

The former is a member of the Signal Corps of the 9th Air Force, the latter assigned to the field artillery of the 75th Division. Both saw active service in the European theatre of operations.

On a routine mission from his base at Bad Kissingen, Sergeant Kreshka learned while traveling over one of the French boulevards, that he was 50 miles from Chalon, and with sufficient gas in the tank he made the trip in a short time... The meeting was an occasion for celebrating.

Inducted into the armed forces at Washington, D. C., where he was engaged in the insurance business, Sergeant Kreshka has been in the service for 44 months, most of which he spent on foreign soil.

His brother joined the service while residing in Minnesota. He has worn the uniform for the past three years, and was on European soil since November of last year.
