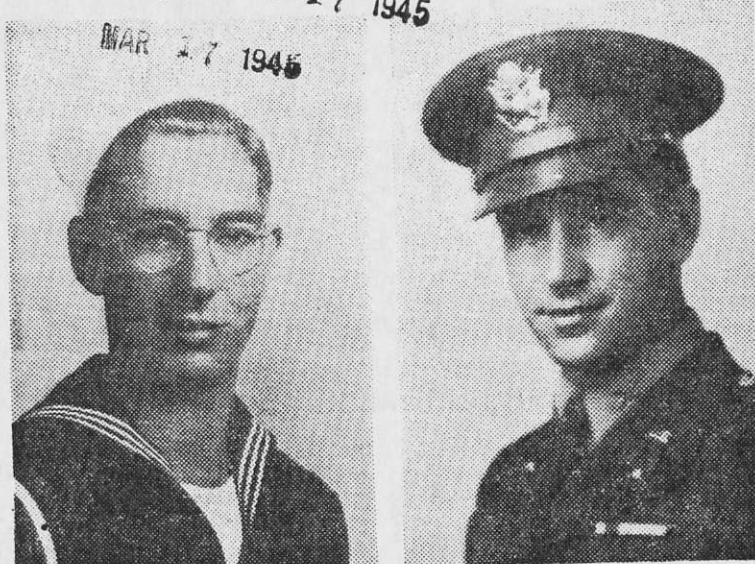

He left for service with the 213th Division in 1940 and was with it until July, 1942, when he was sent to Electrical Fire Control School. Prior to entering the service, Lieut. Bartholomew was employed at the Roller-Smith Company. He is home on a five-day leave at present. Richard R. Bartholomew was advanced to Seaman First Class. He entered the service in June, 1944, and completed his boot training at Sampson, N. Y. He was sent to Corpus Christi, Texas, U. S. N. A. S., after spending a brief leave at his home, during which he met his brother, Howard, for the first time since entering the service. Before putting on the blue-jacket Richard was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company.
