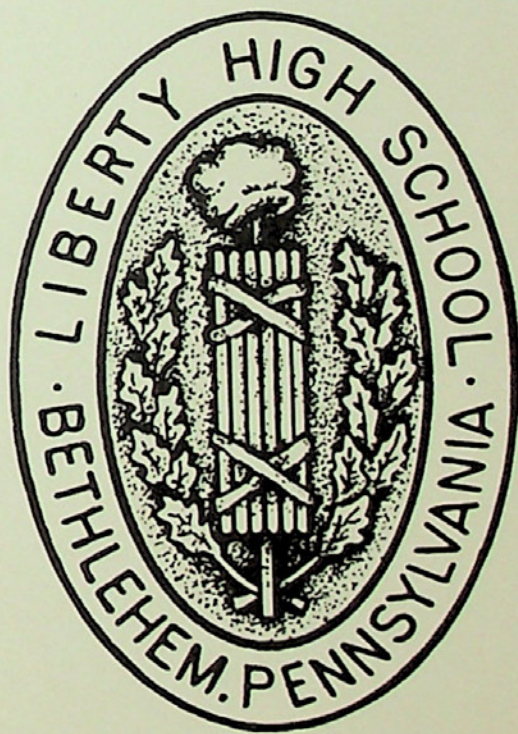

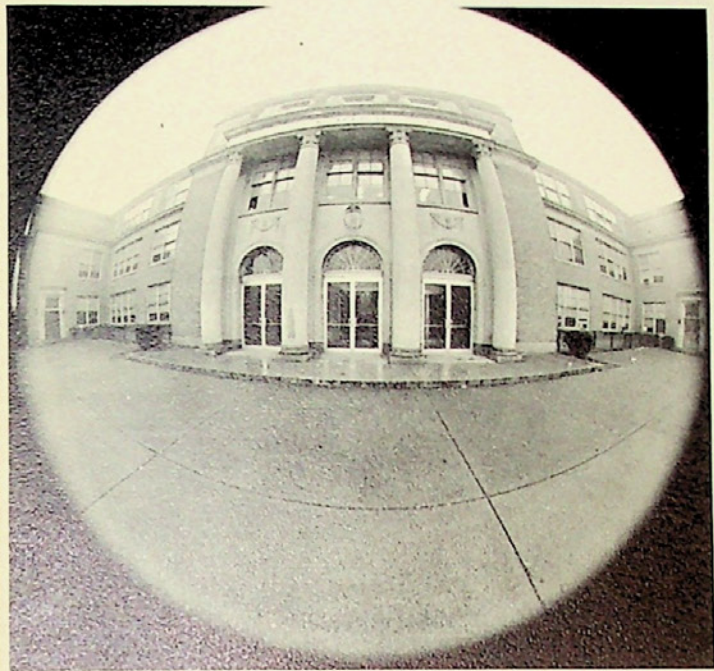

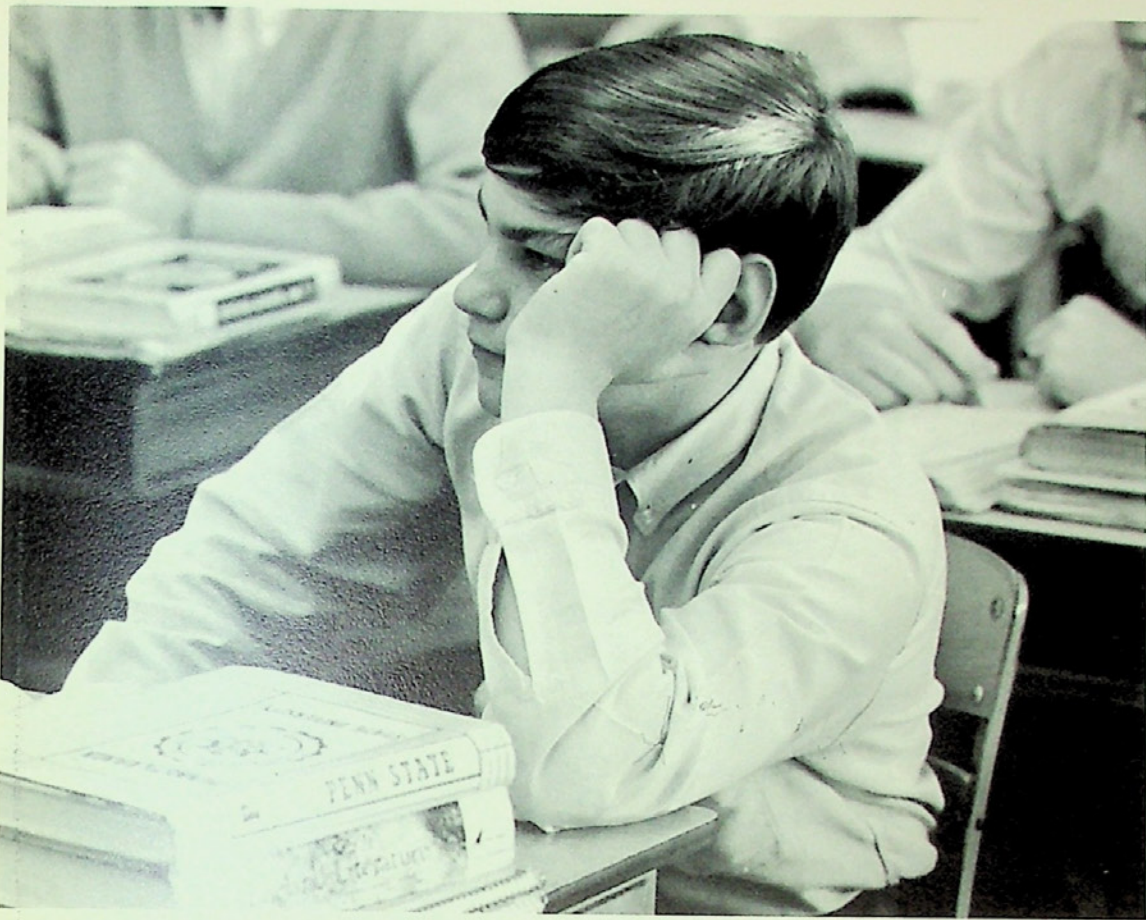


Liberty High School . . .

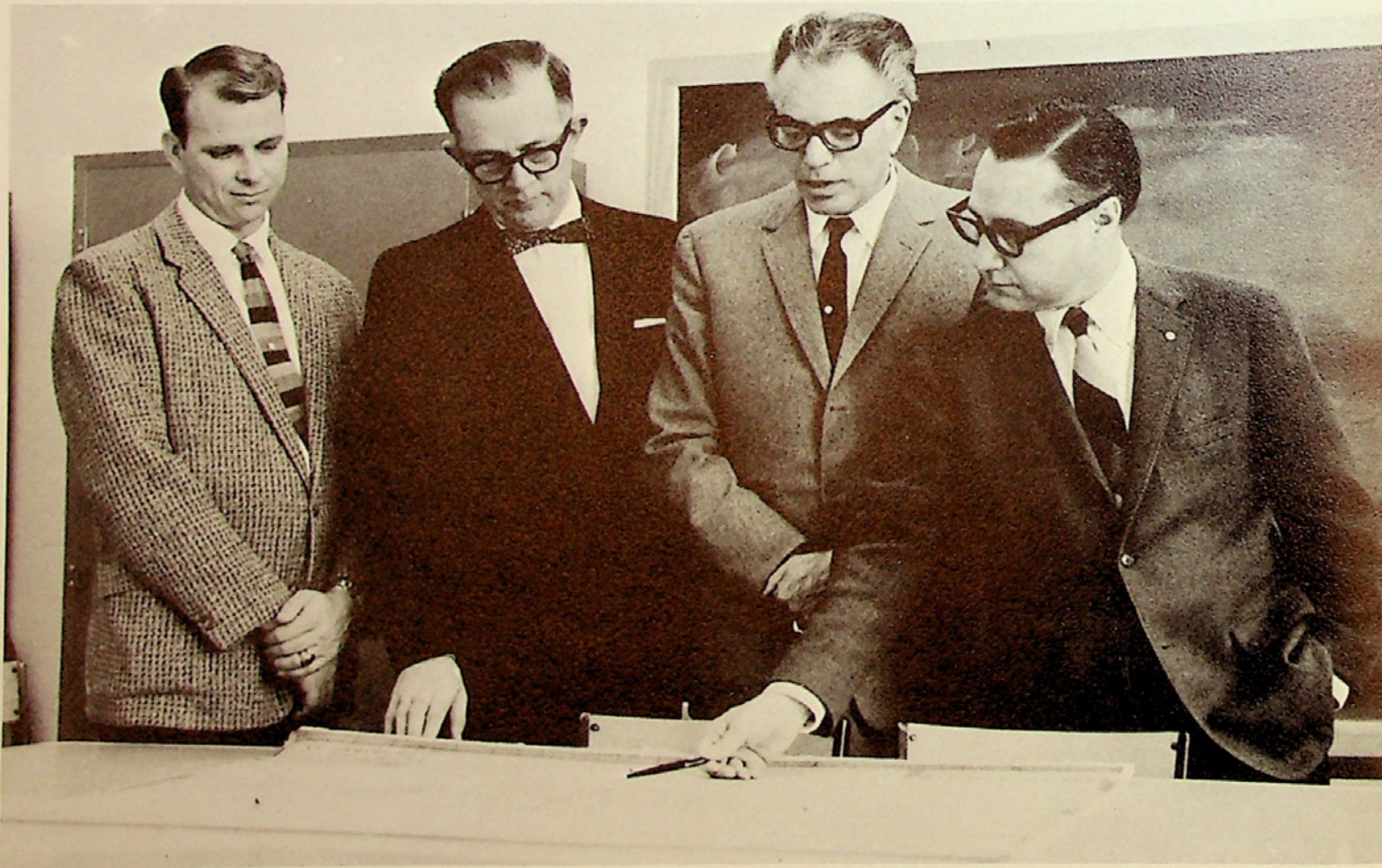
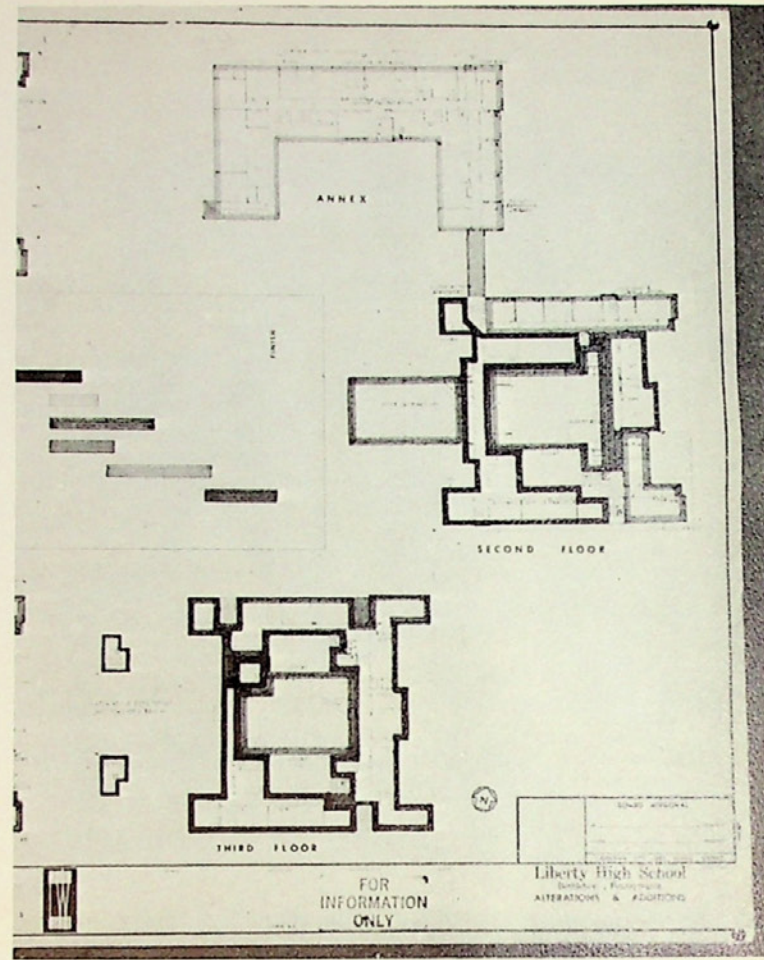


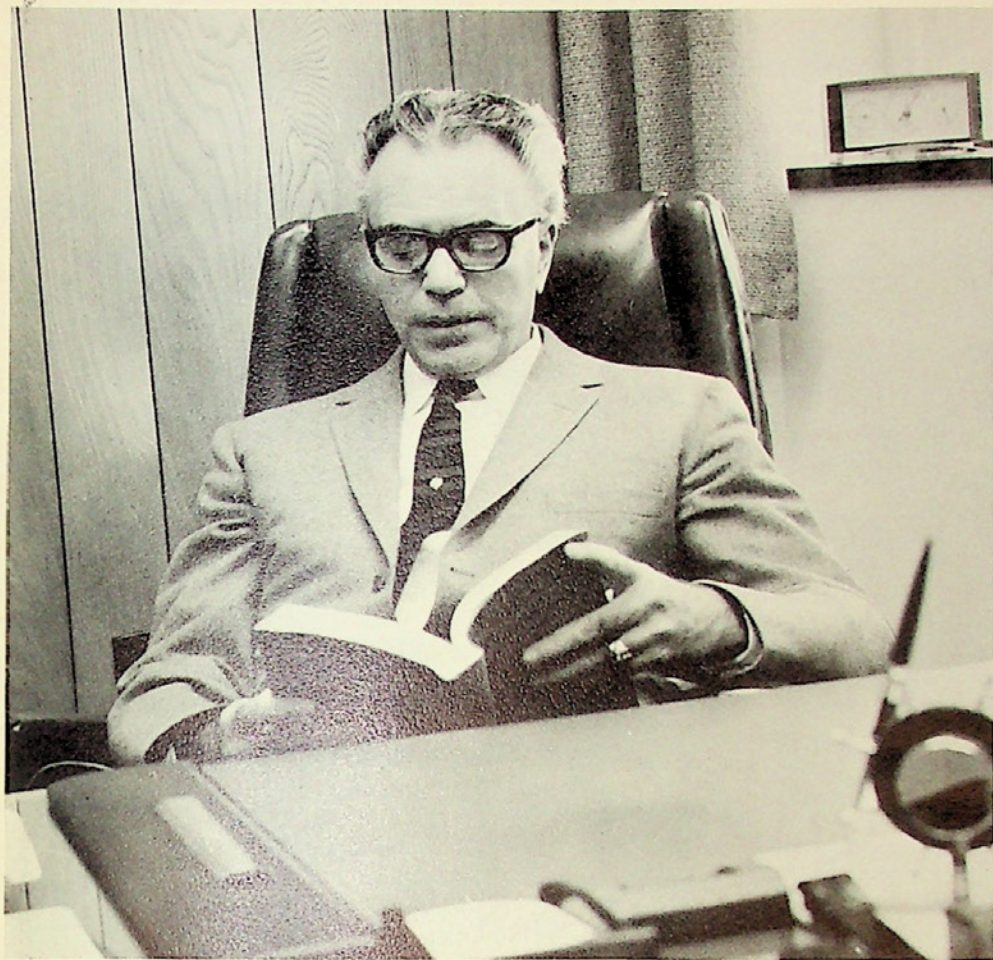
ADMINISTRATION

As the chief administrative officer of the Bethlehem Area School District, Dr. John W. Khouri acts as a liason between the school, the school board, and the community. His chief duties as superintendent are the coordination and direction of the programs and services of the schools; the planning for and evaluation of the instructional program; and the selection of professional and non-professional employees. His responsibilities also include those of research; operation and maintenance of buildings; and the provision for auxiliary services such as health programs, transportation, and cafeterias.

The new assistant superintendent, Dr. Roy A. Brown, who assumed his position in July, 1967, assists Dr. Khouri in many areas of school district planning and operation, but is primarily responsible for the instructional program and curriculum development.

This year Dr. Khouri and Dr. Brown worked with Mr. Klein and the architects from Coston-Wallace on the plans for the renovation program at Liberty.

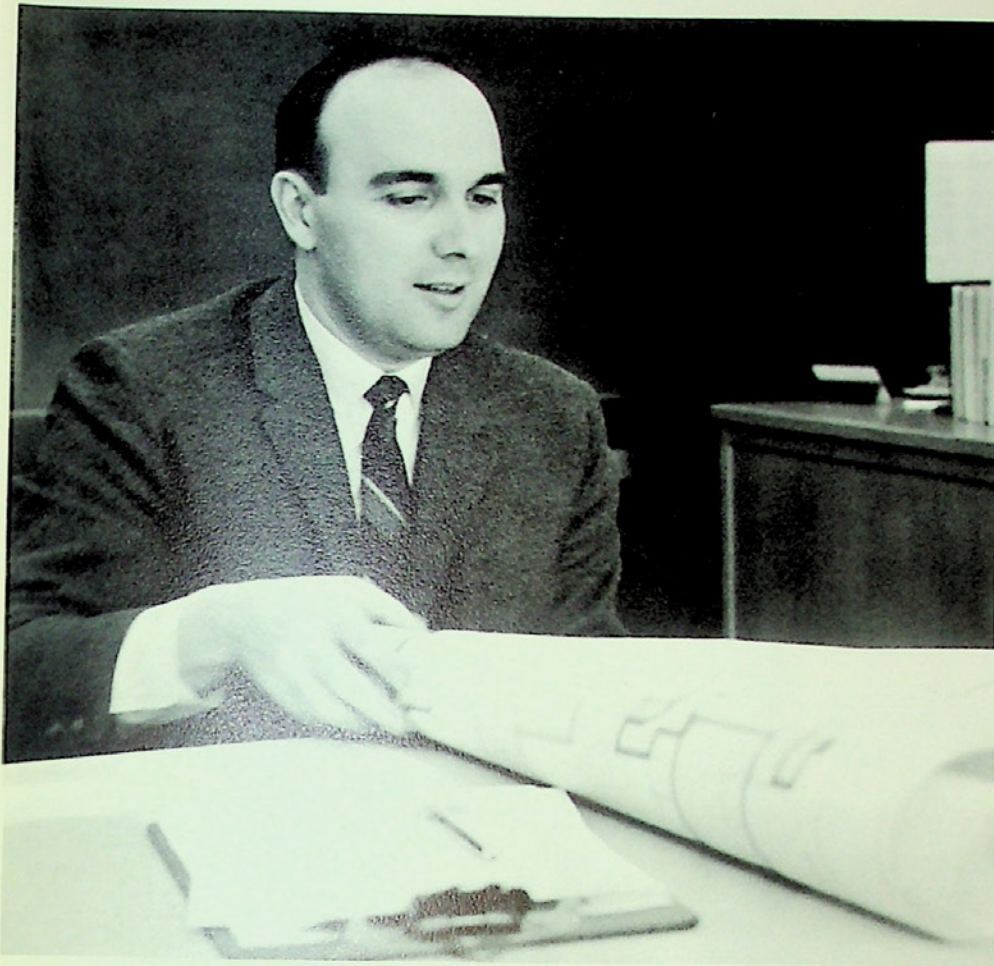
ADMINISTRATION

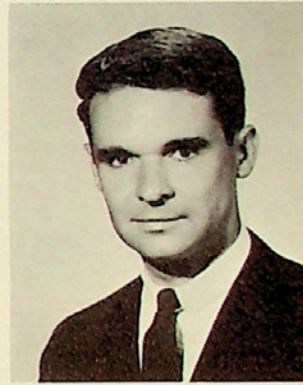

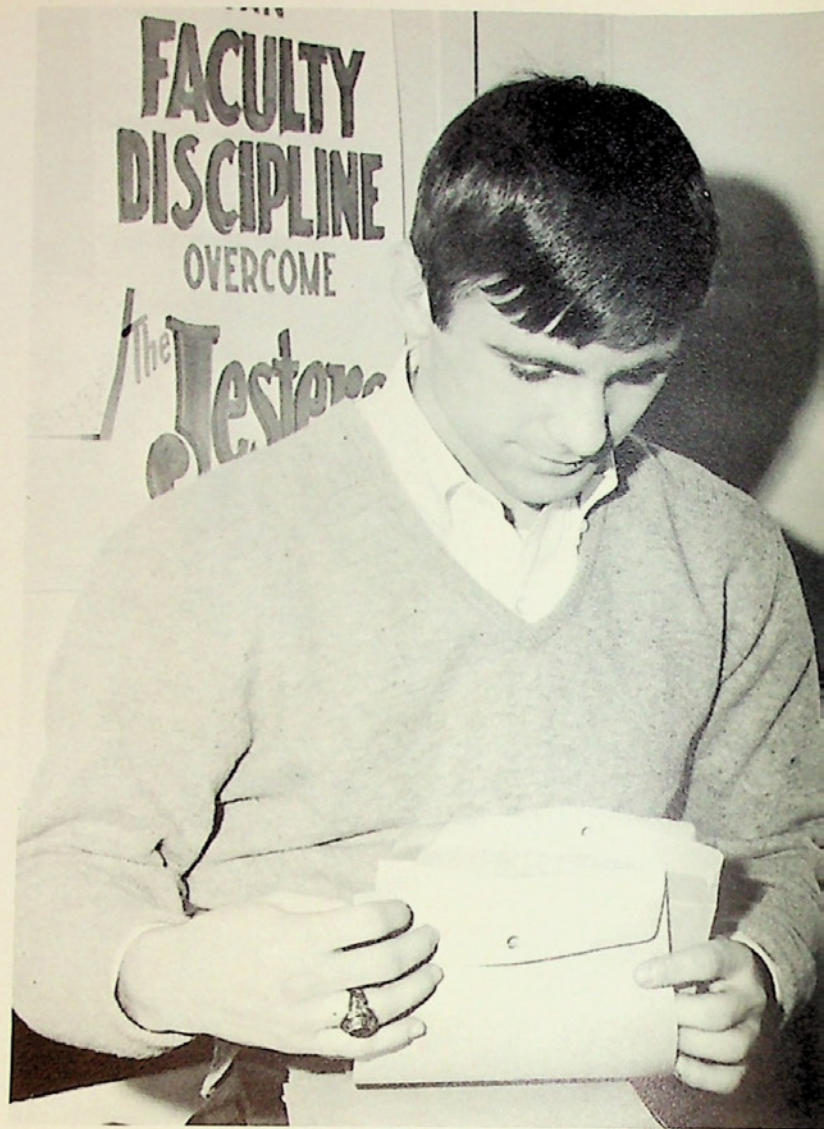
STUDENT ASSOCIATION

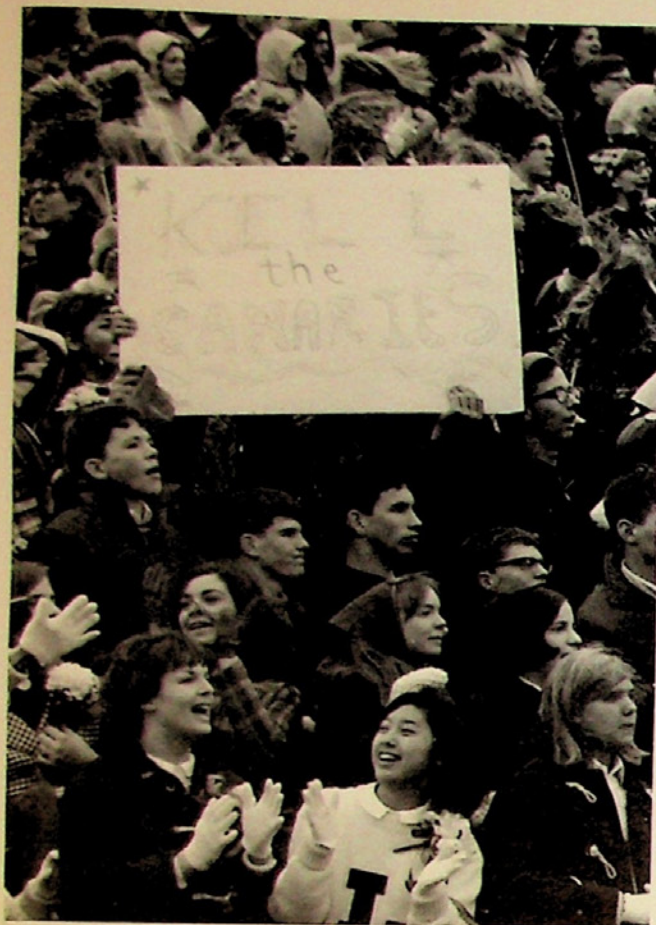

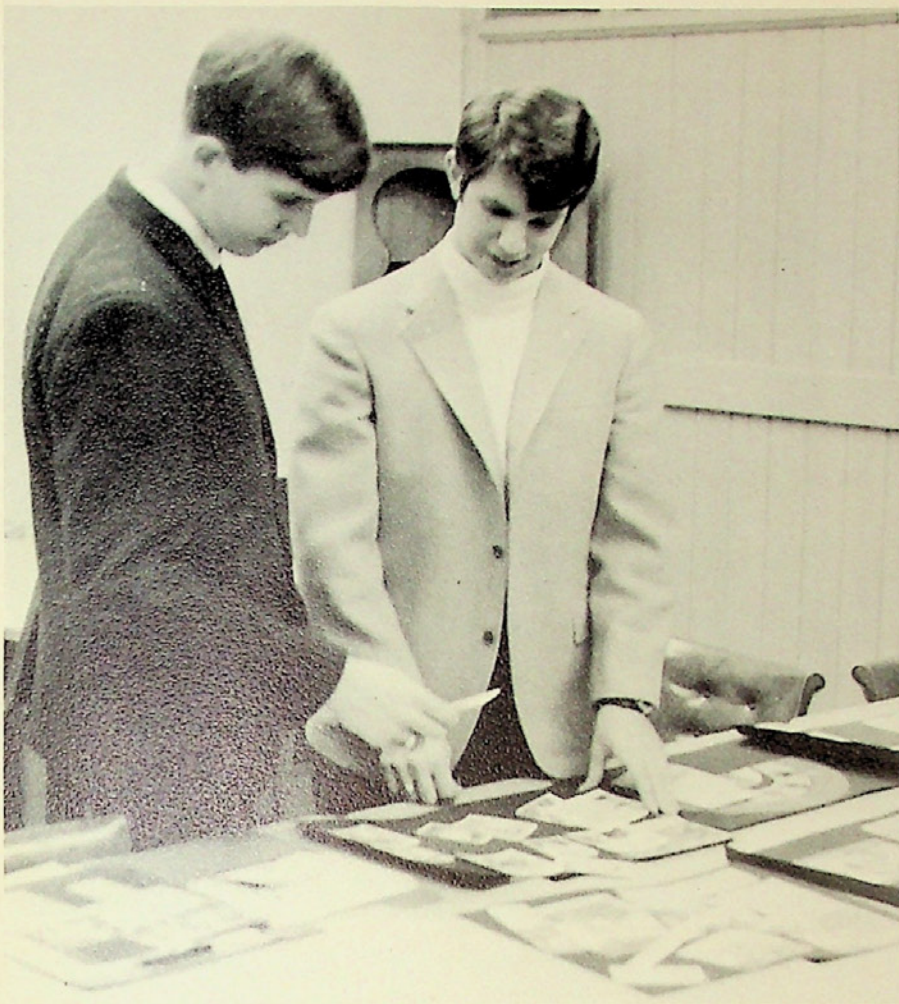

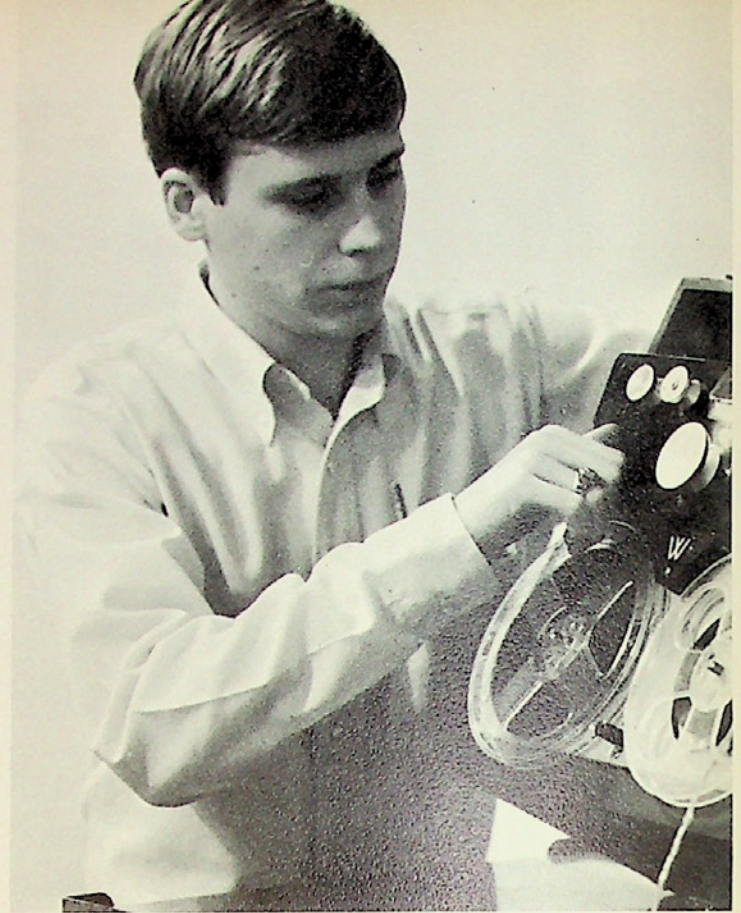
LIBRARY CLUB

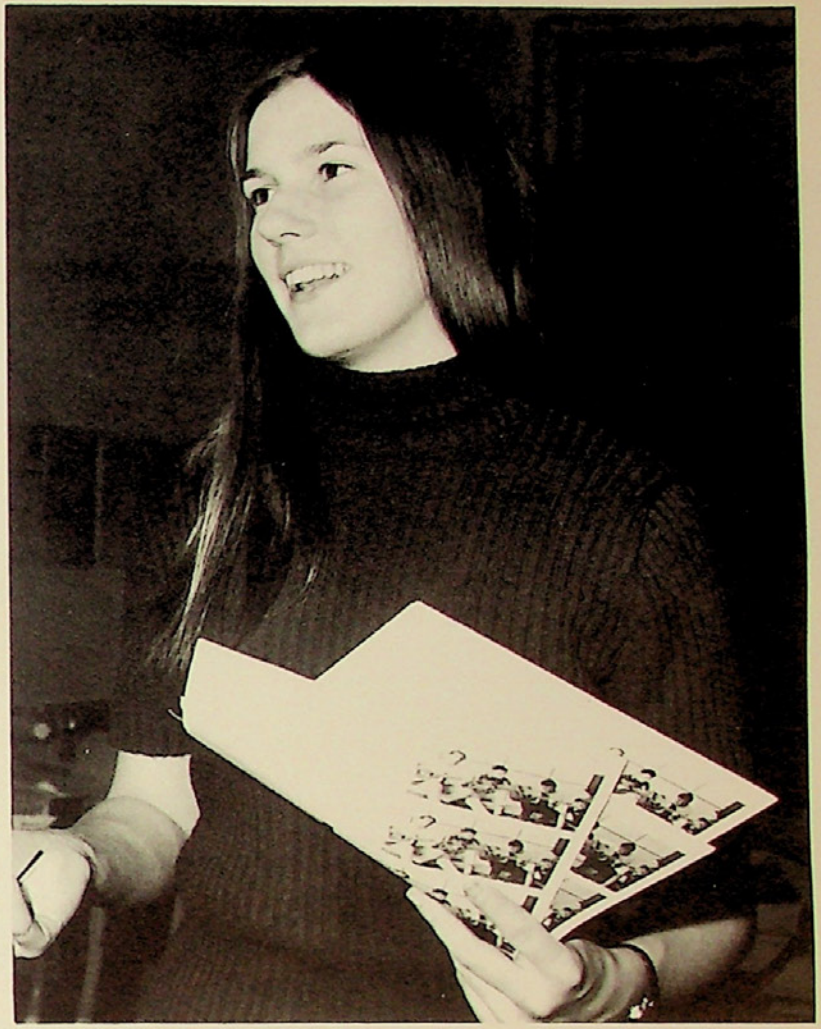

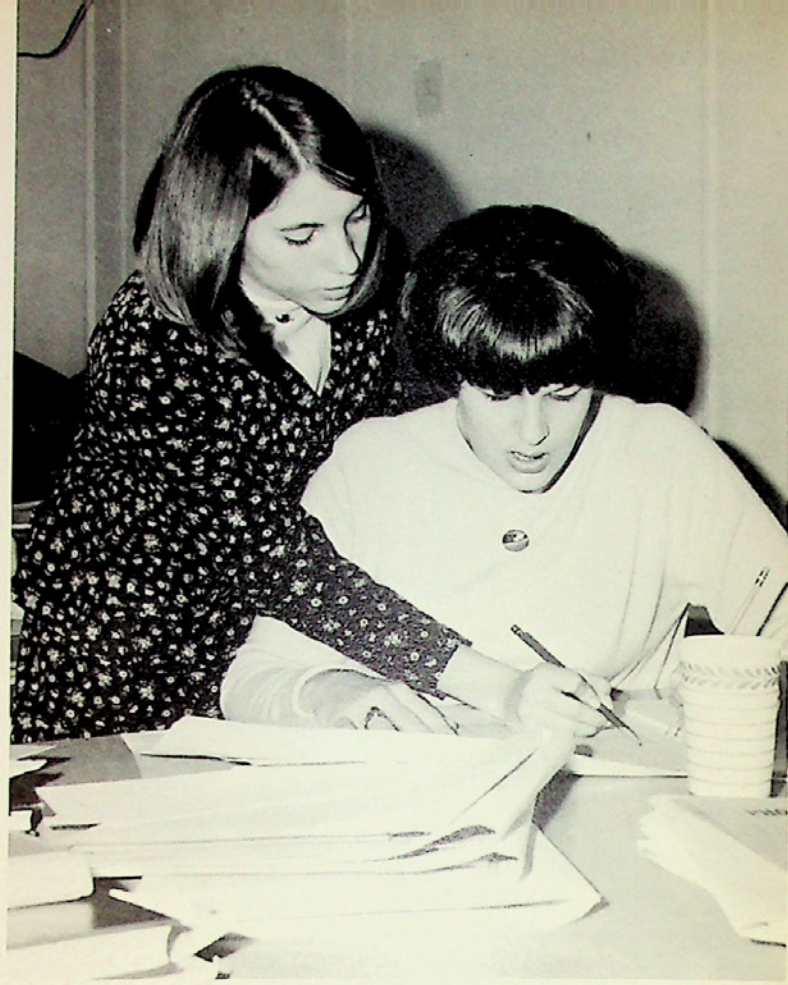

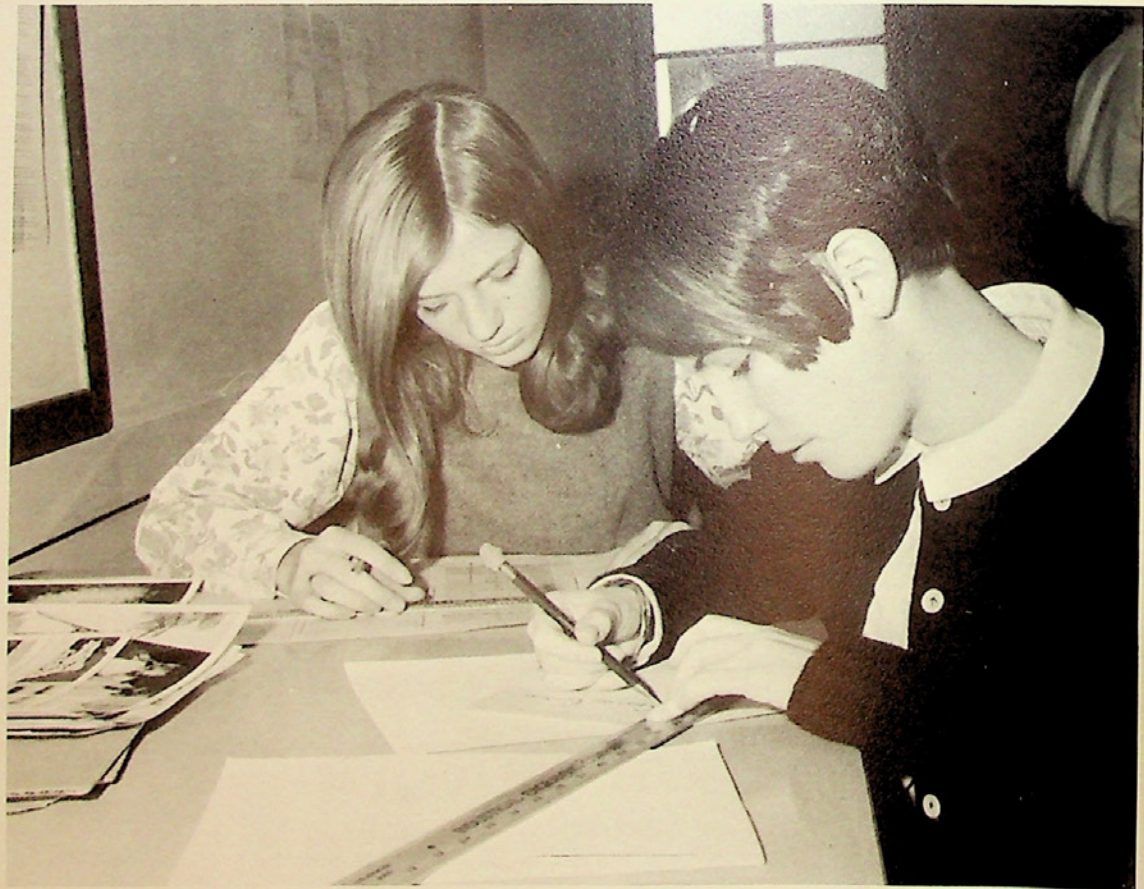

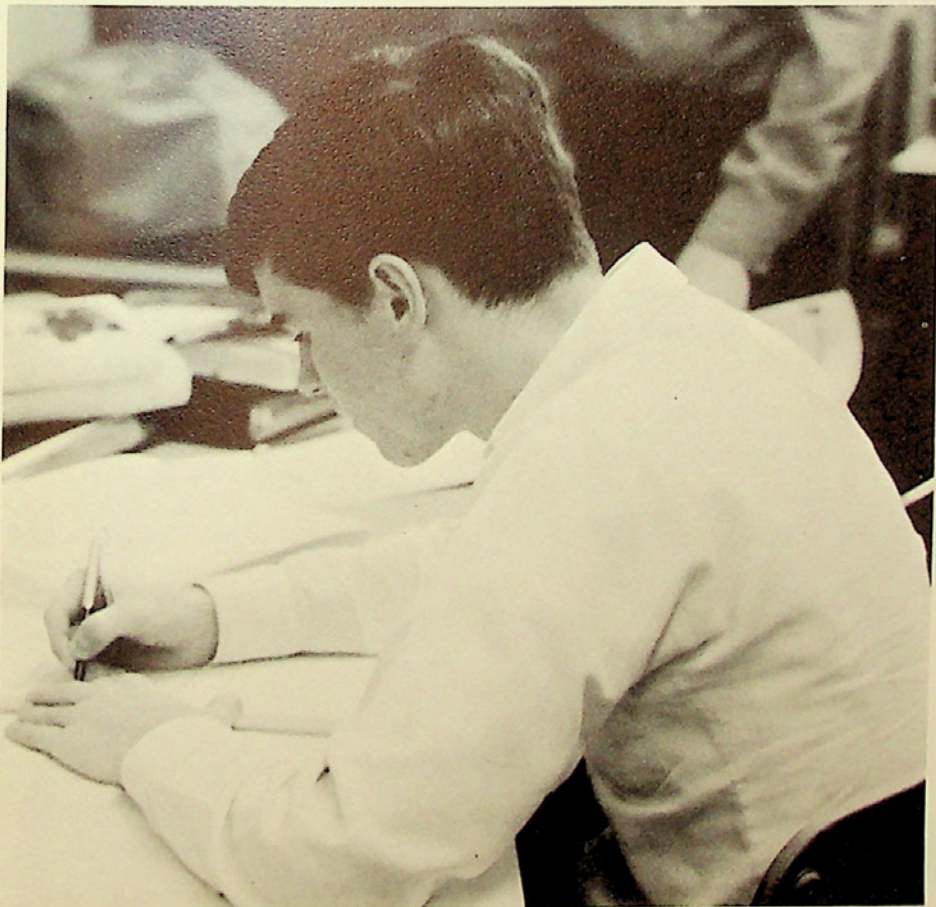

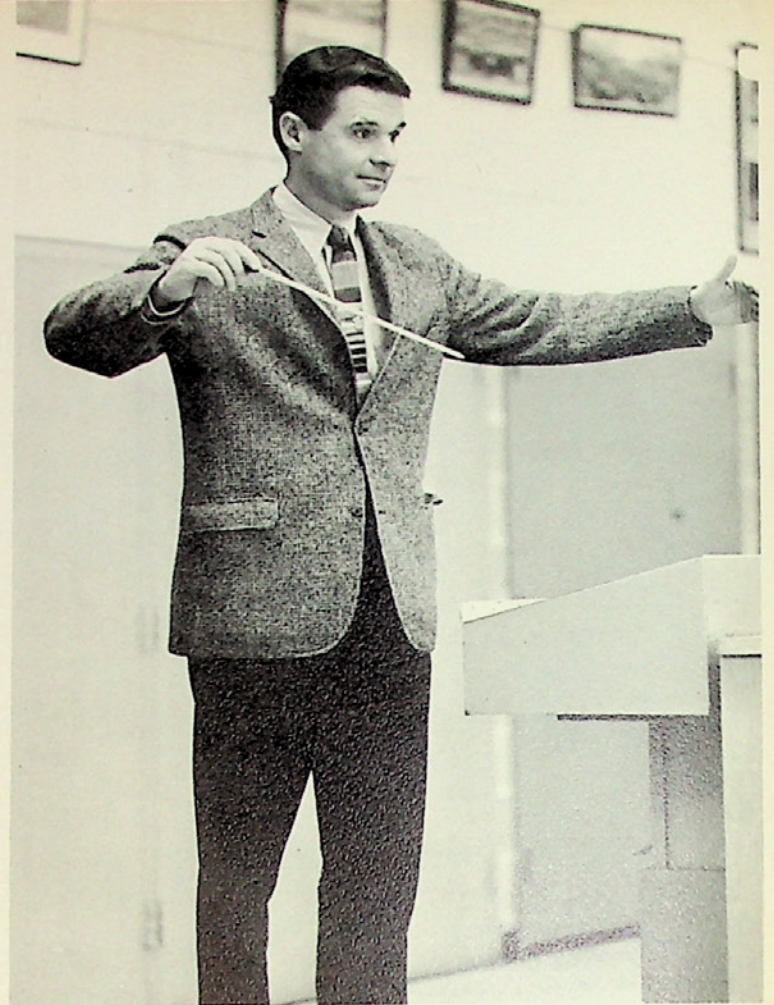

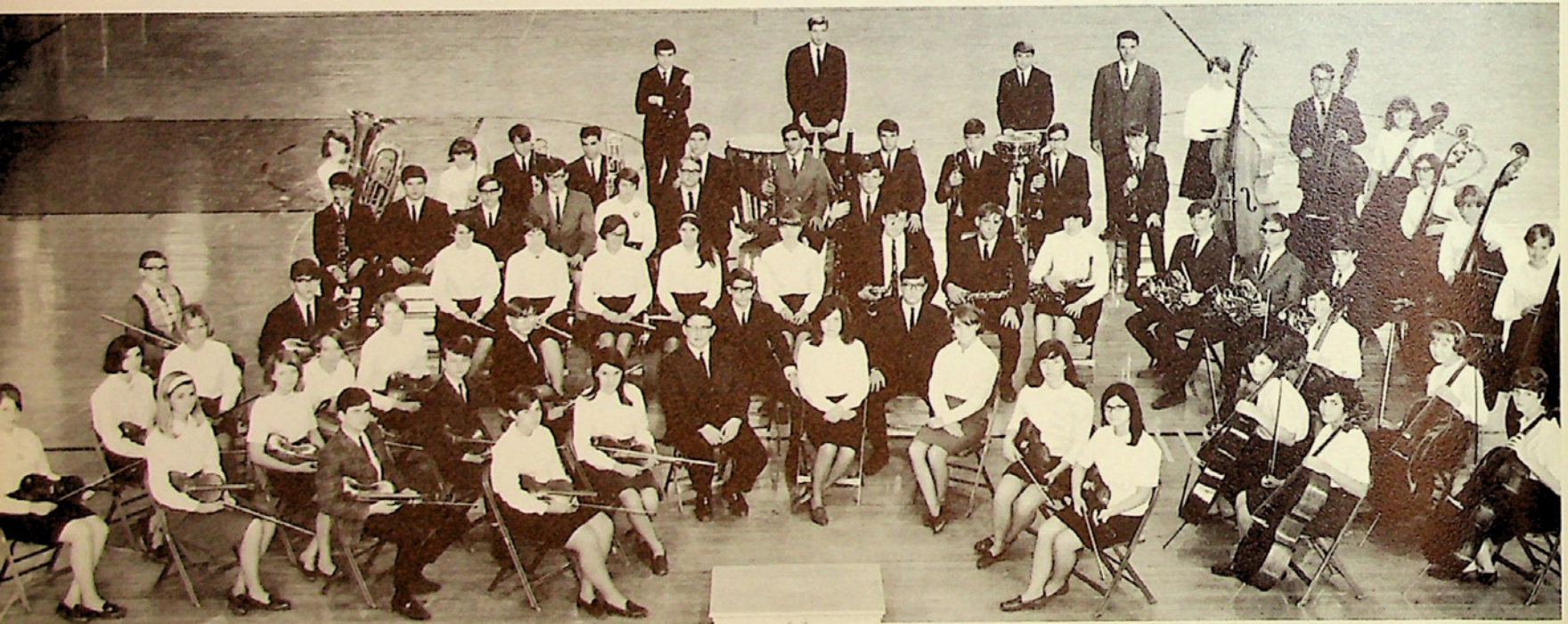
ORCHESTRA

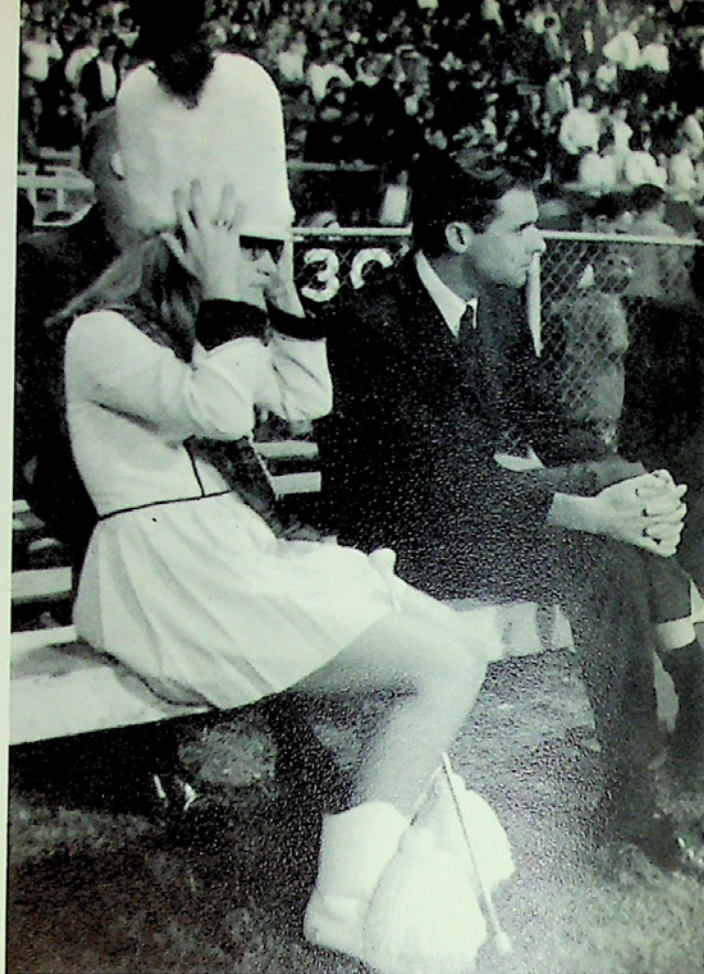

L.H.S. GRENADIER BAND

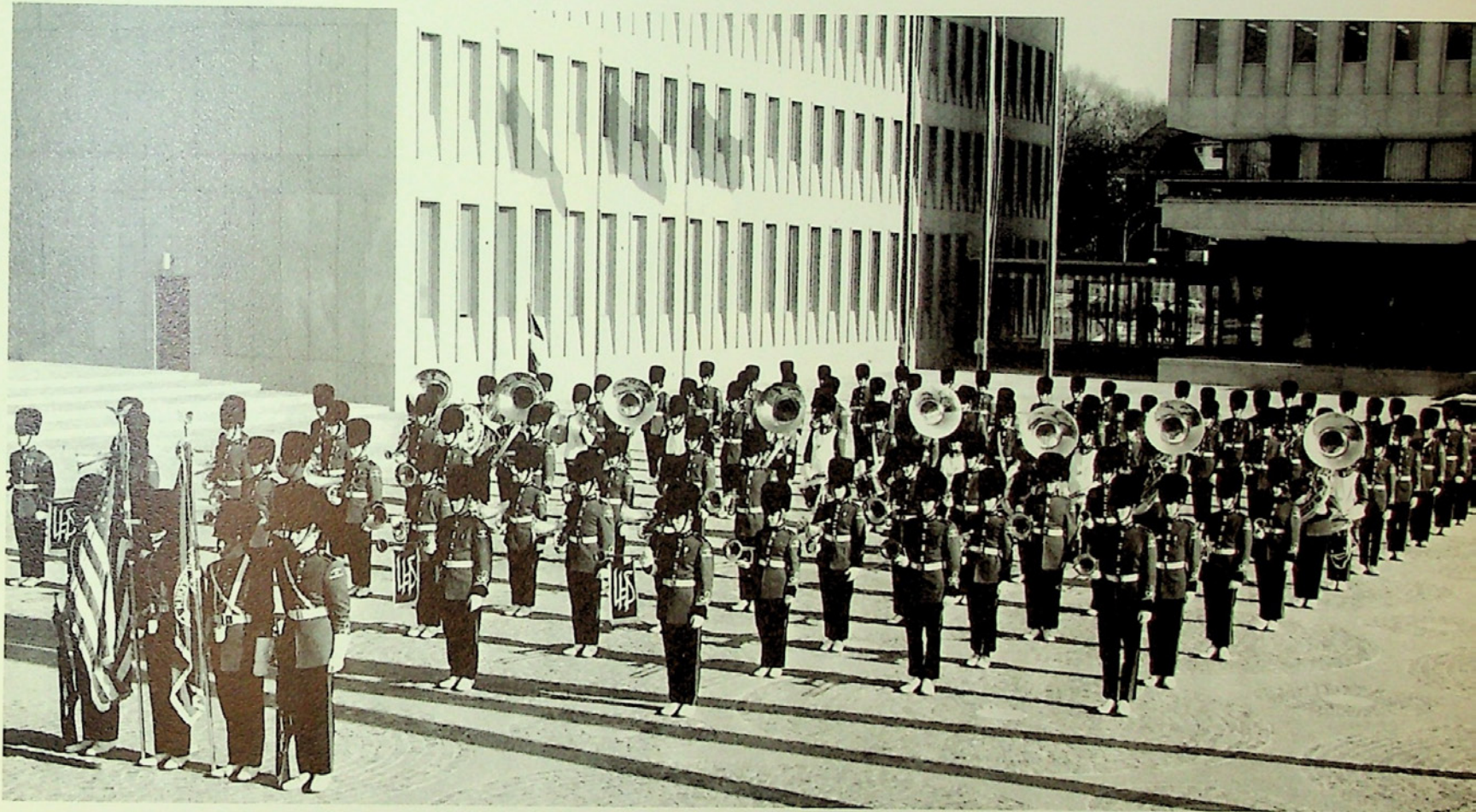
"Rule Britannia, Britannia rules the waves . . ." The tune associated with these words introduced to the audience the Liberty High School Grenadiers in their half-time performance.

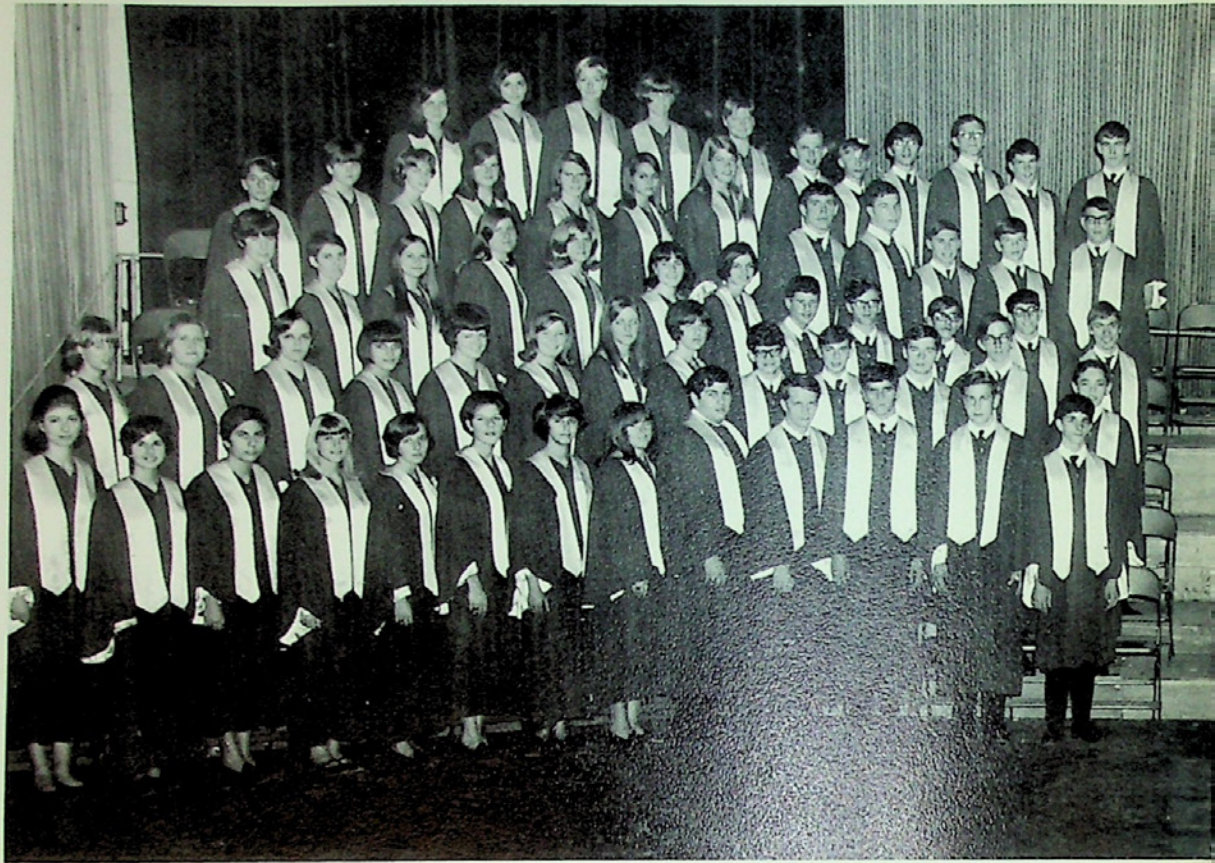

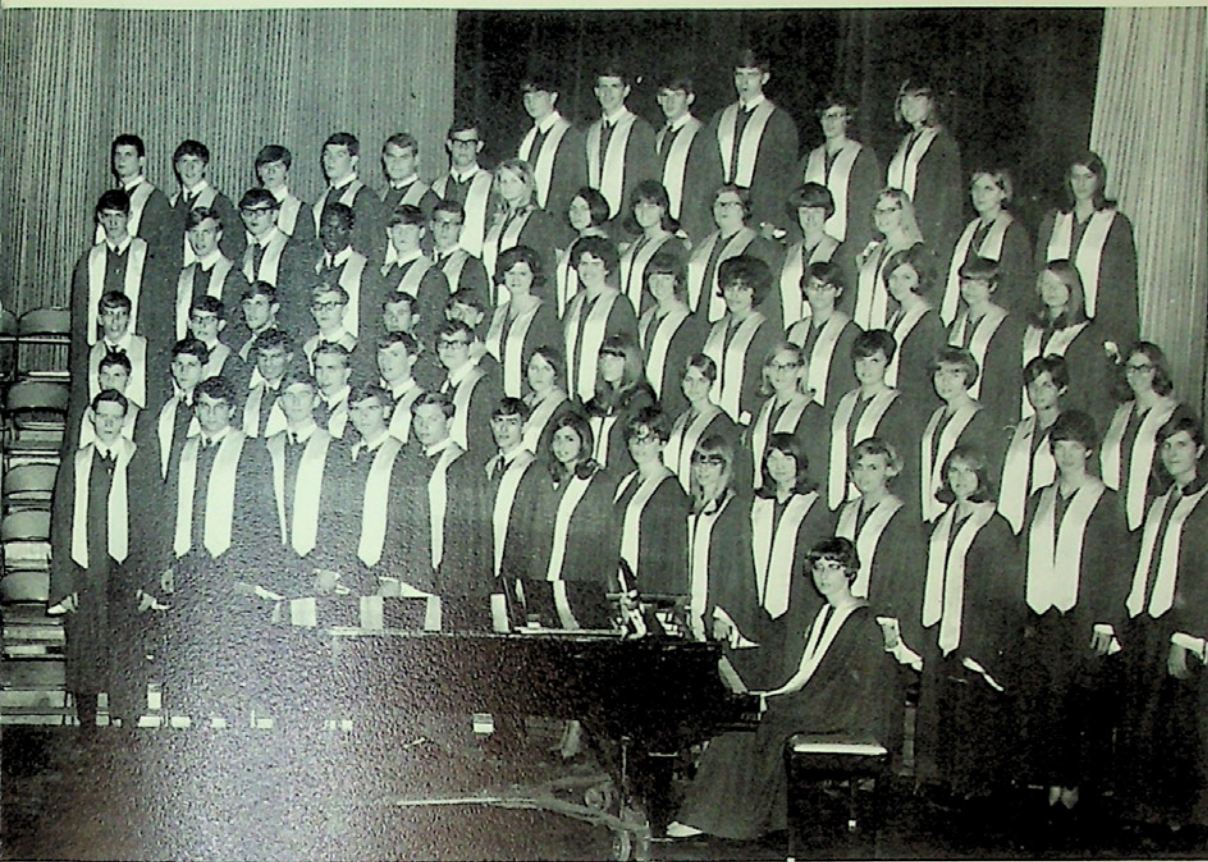
GLEE CLUB

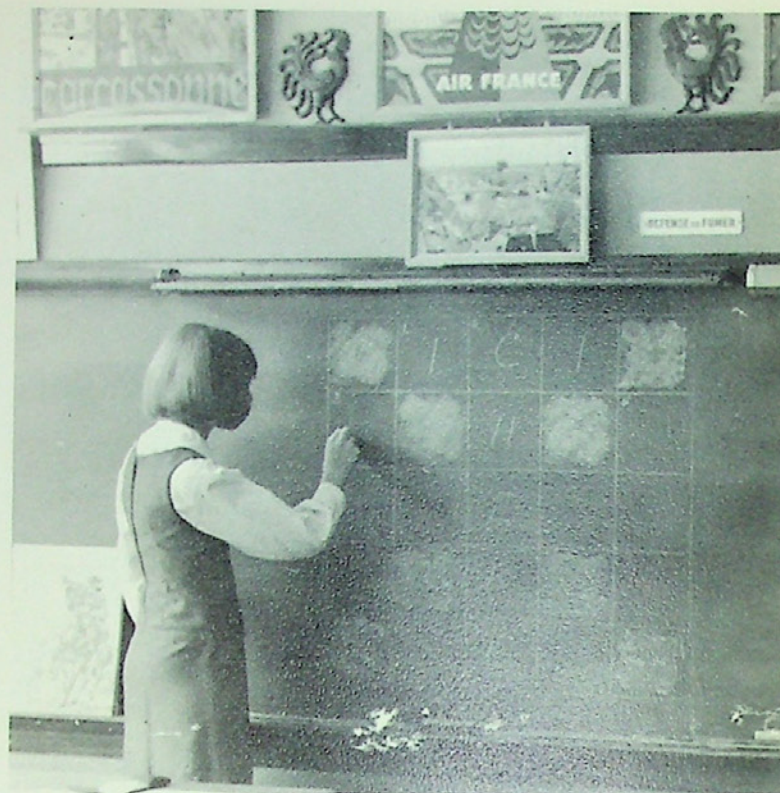

GERMAN CLUB

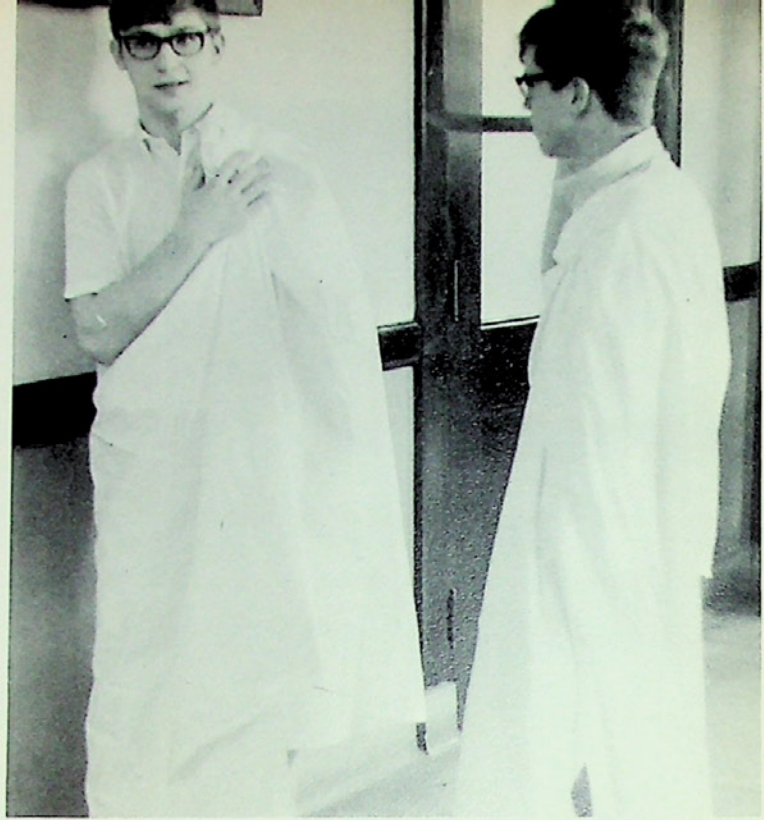

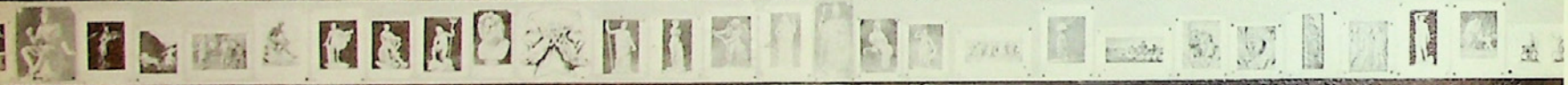

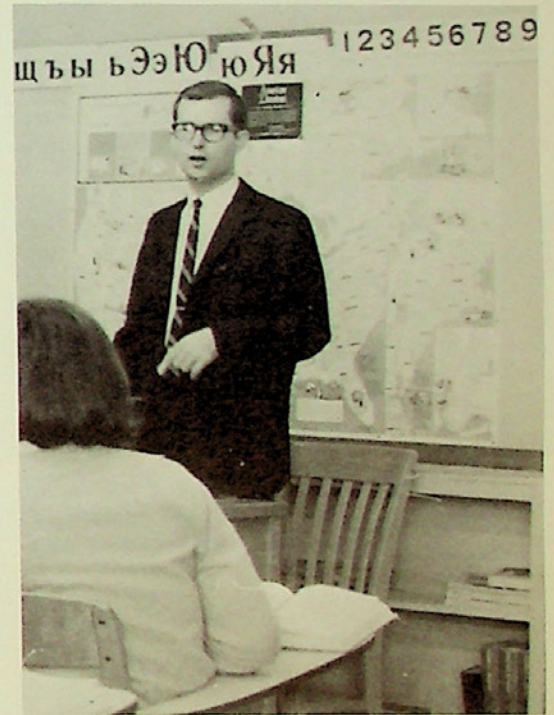

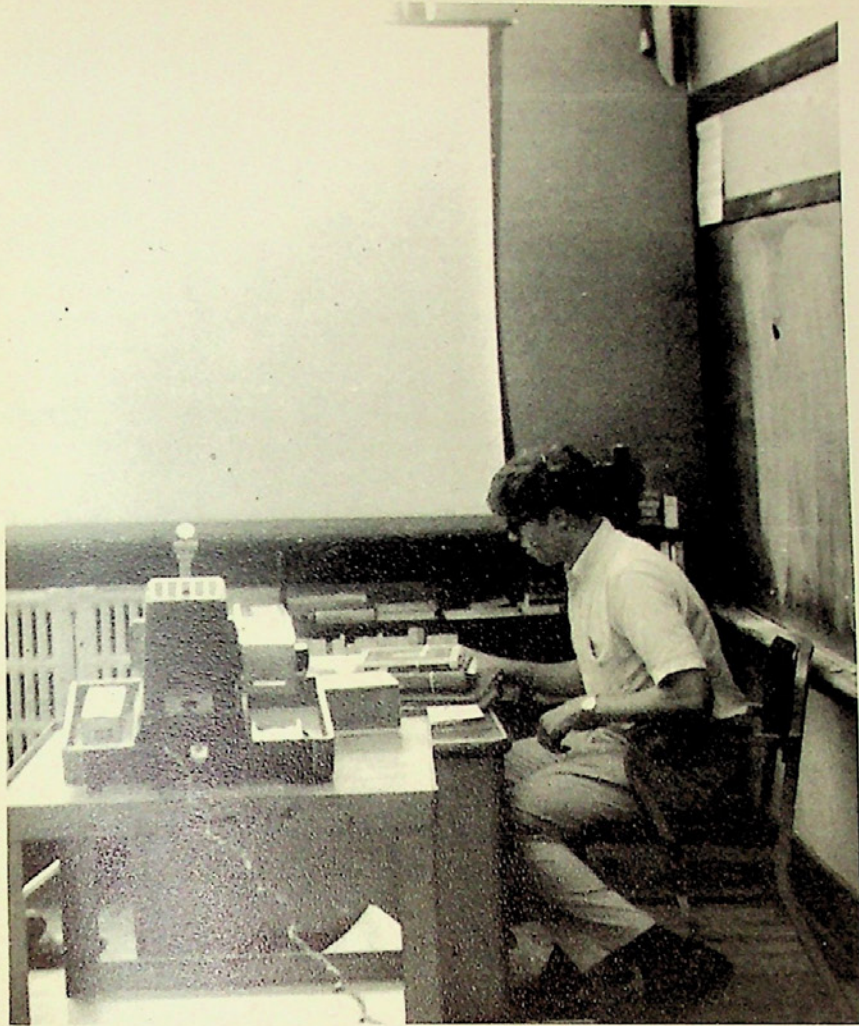

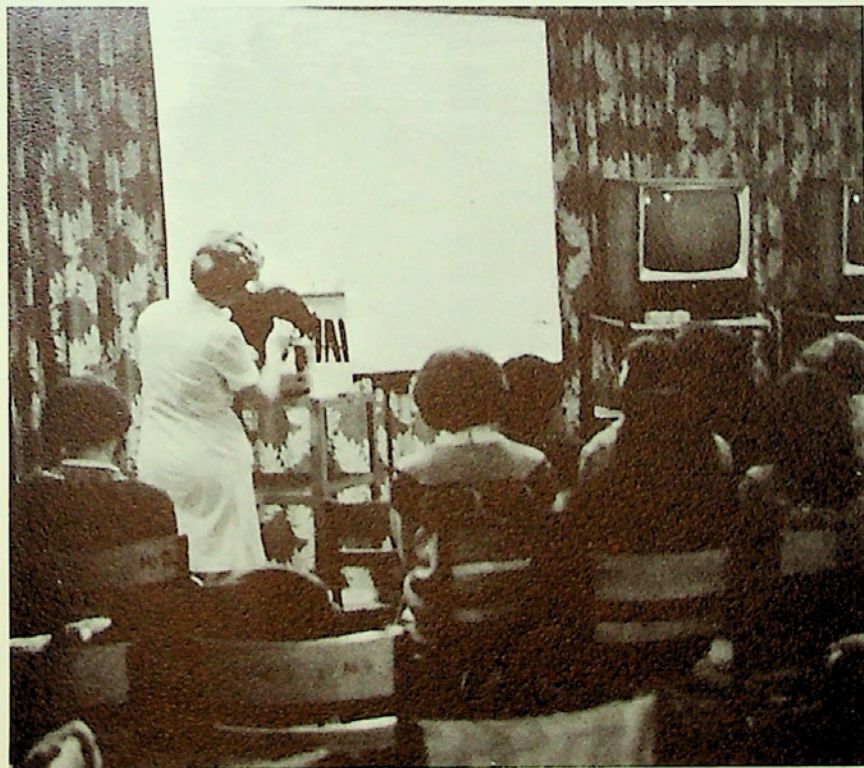

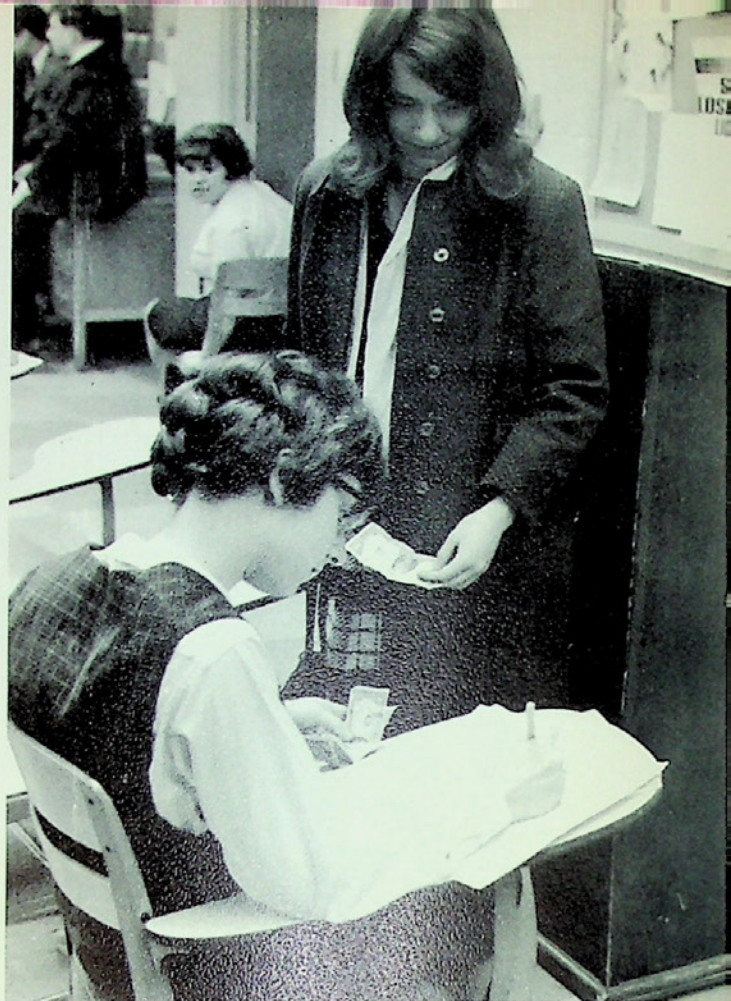
COMMERCIAL CLUB

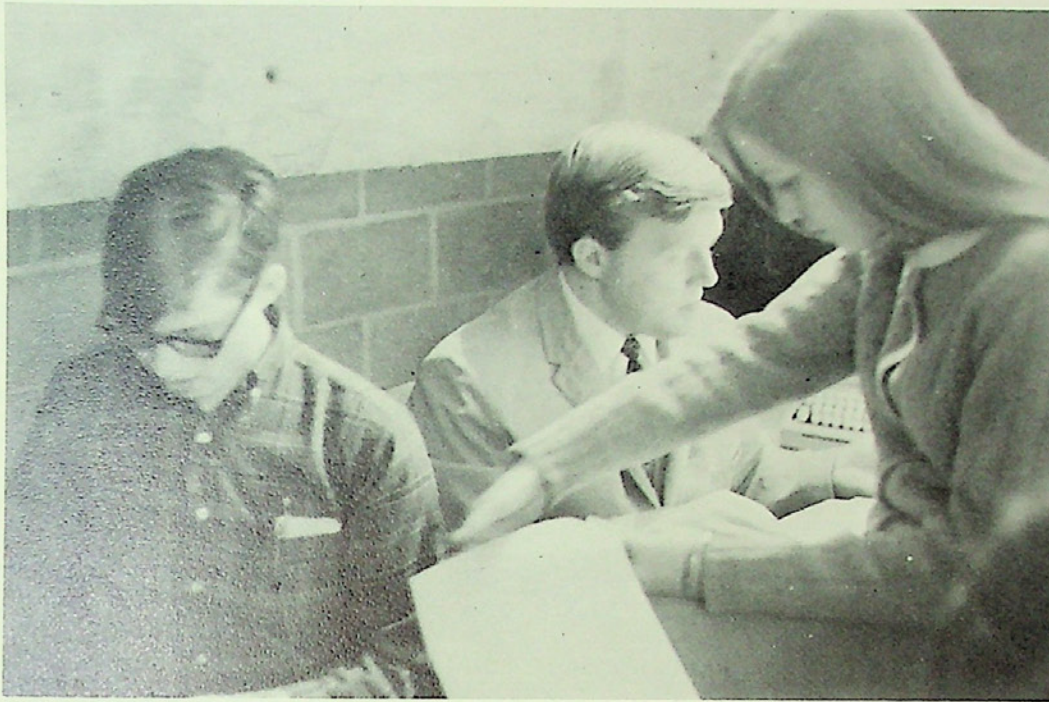

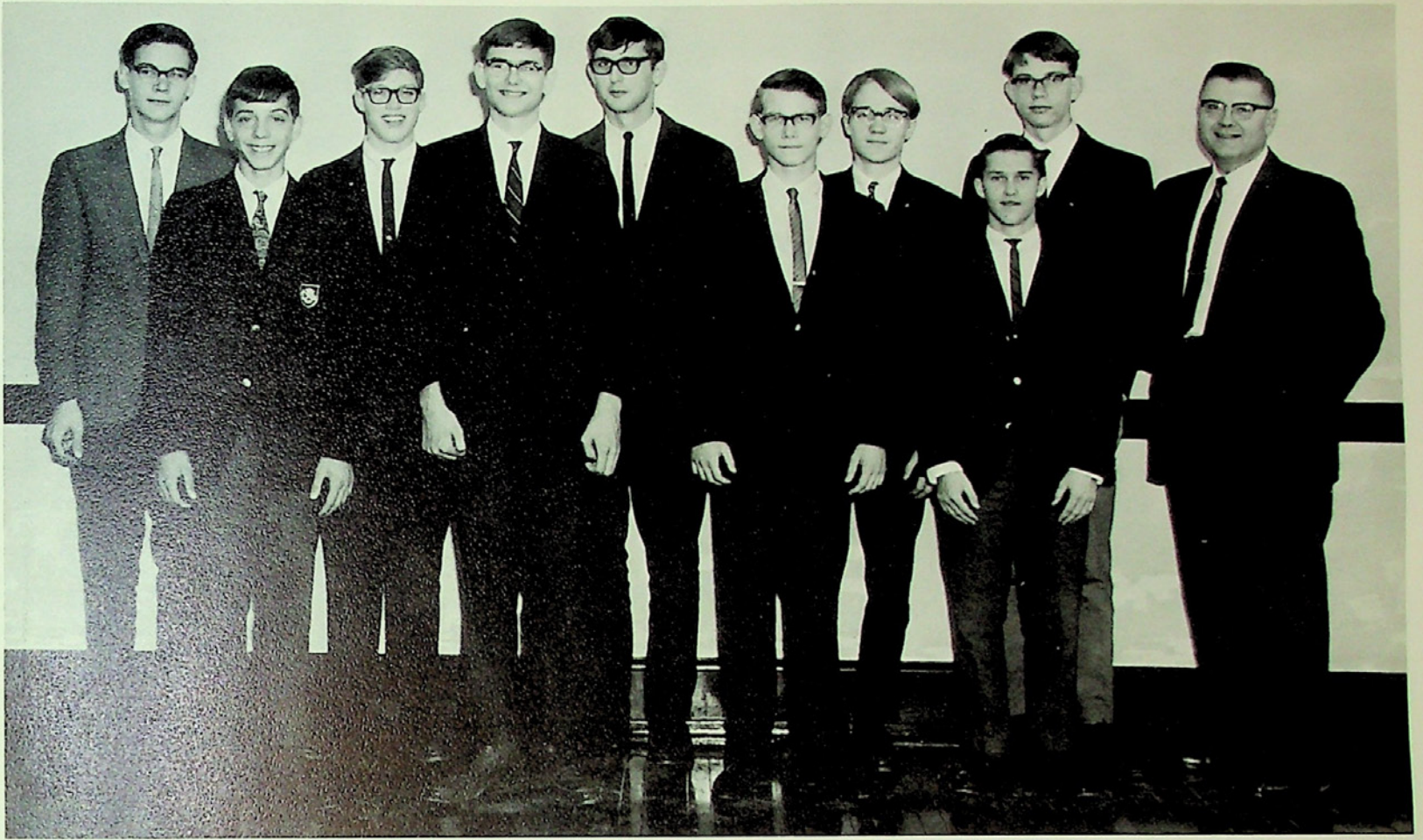

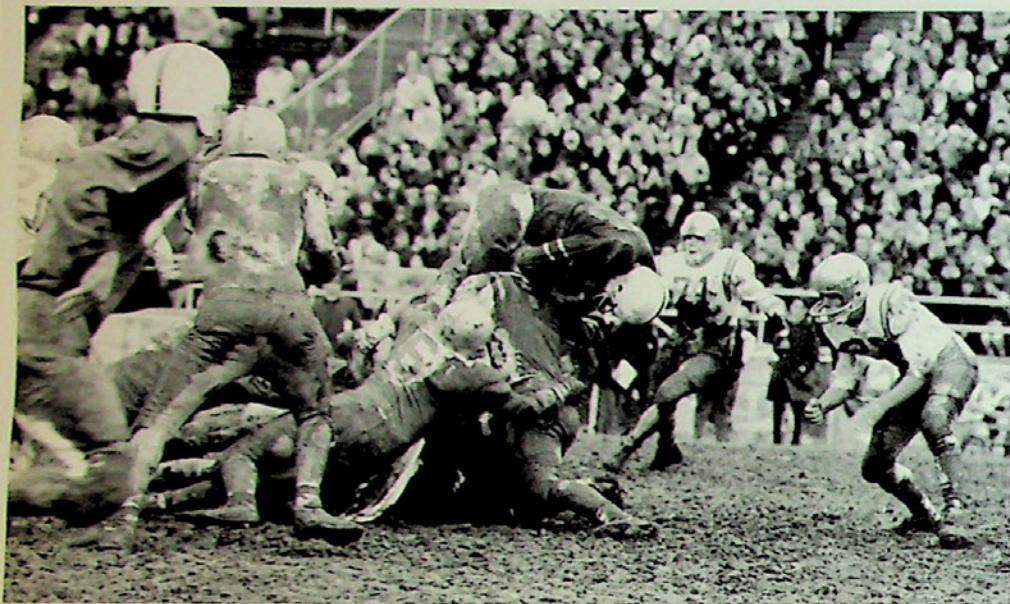


FOOTBALL

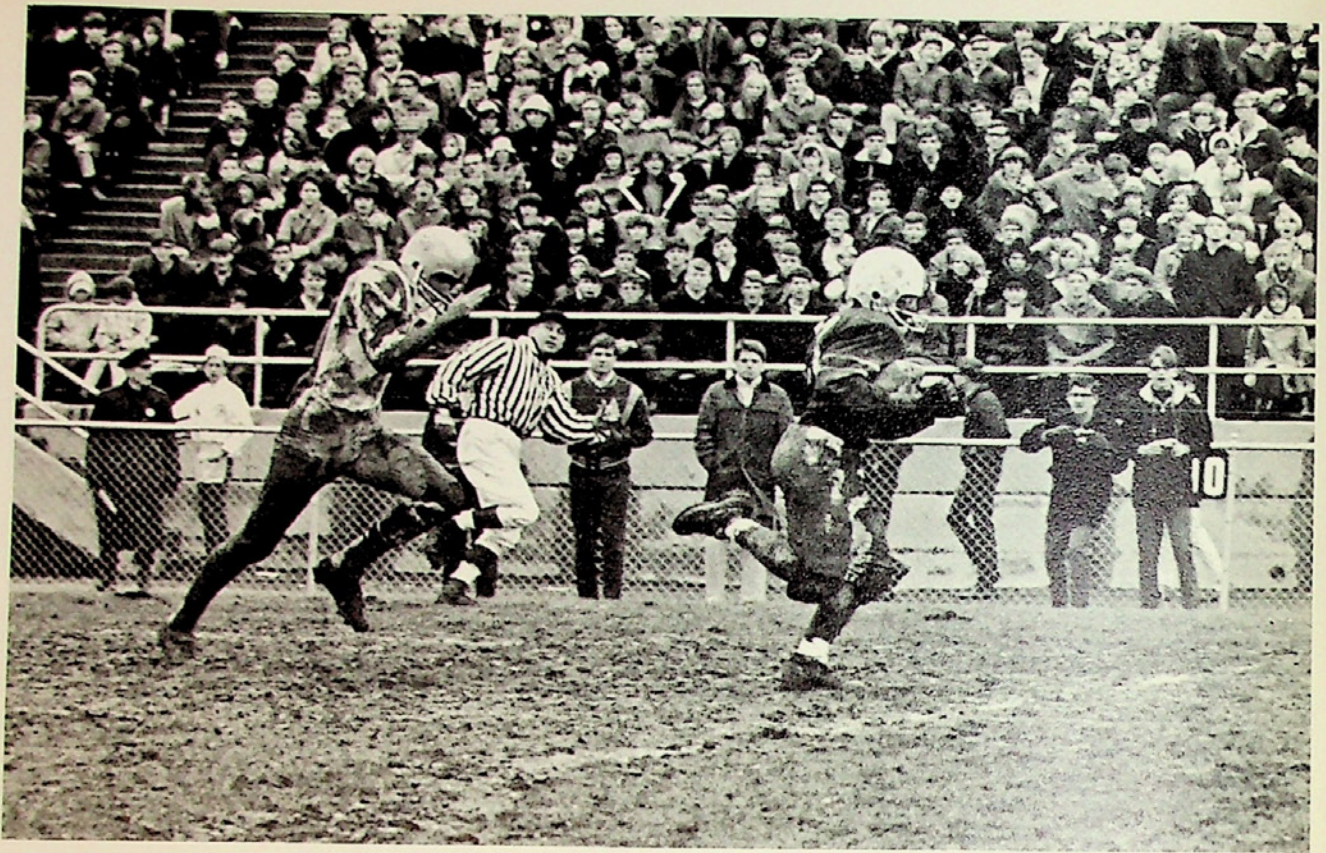

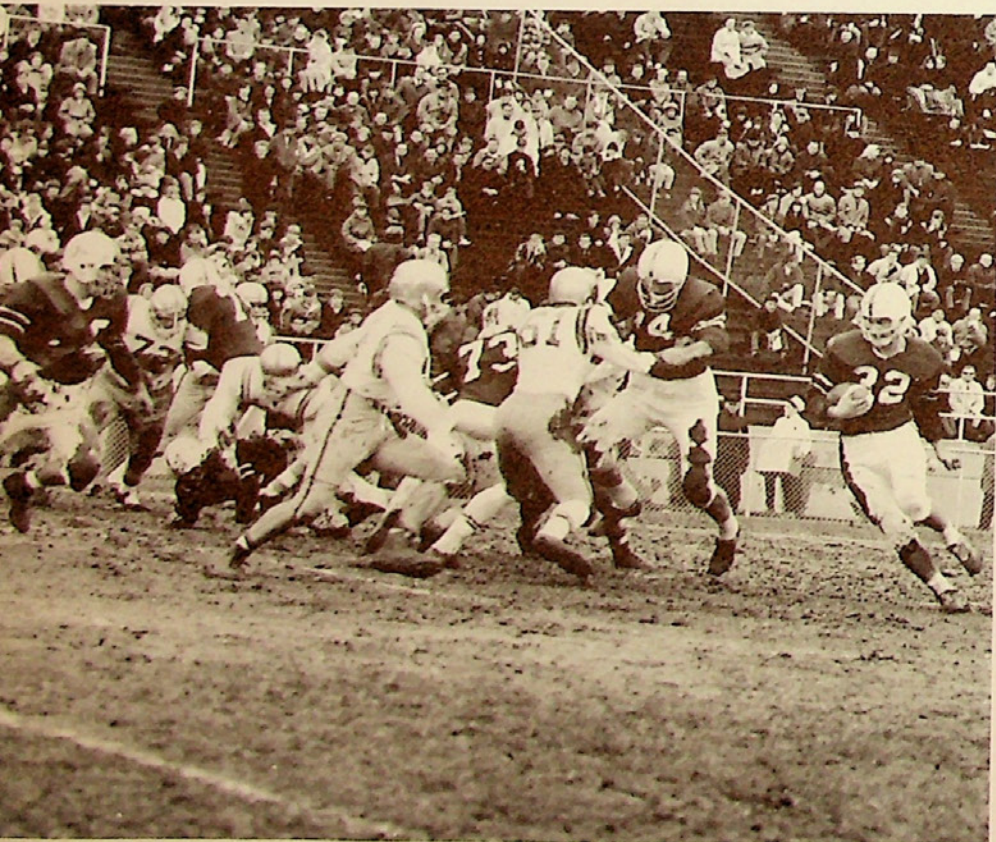

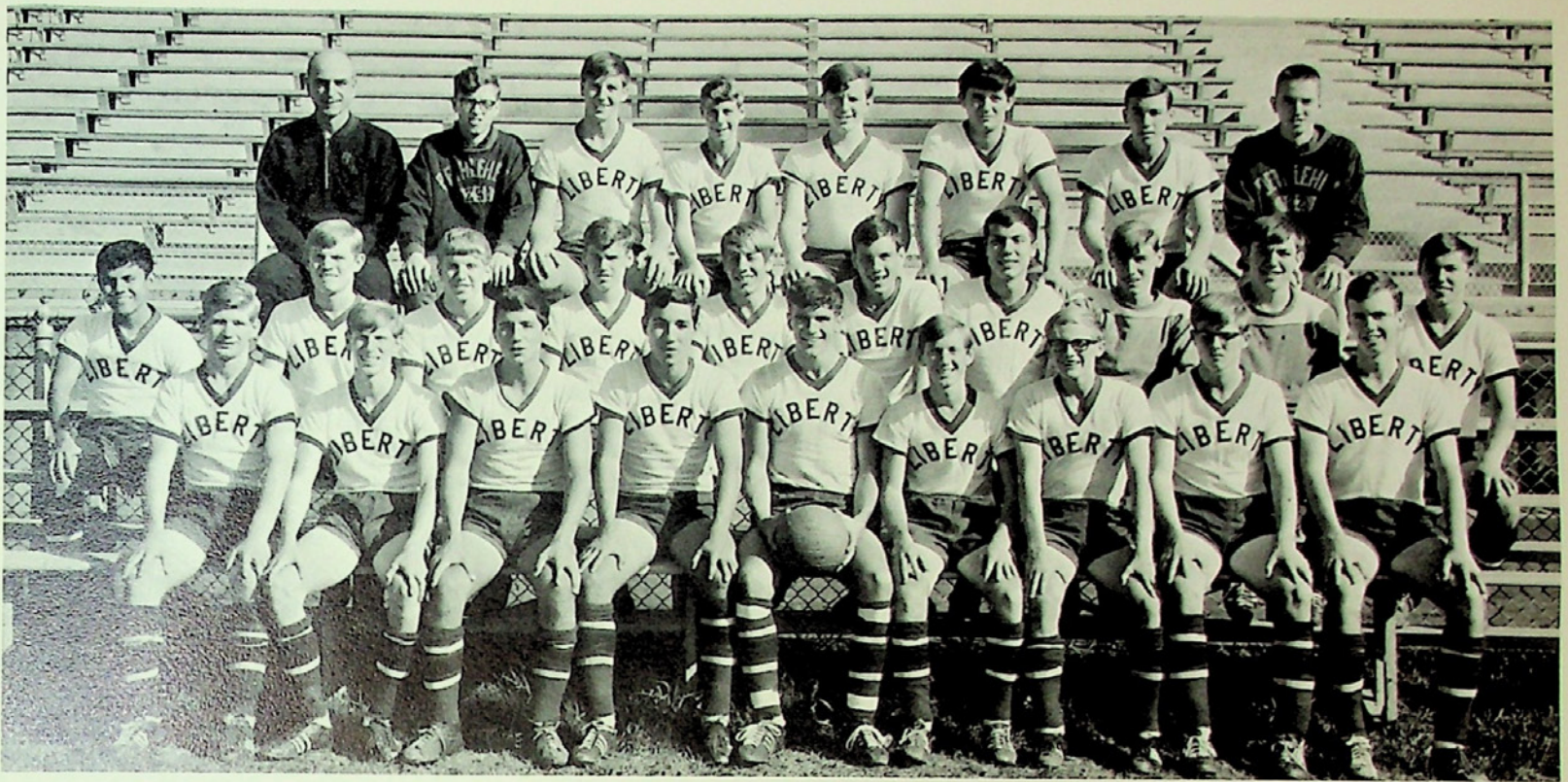

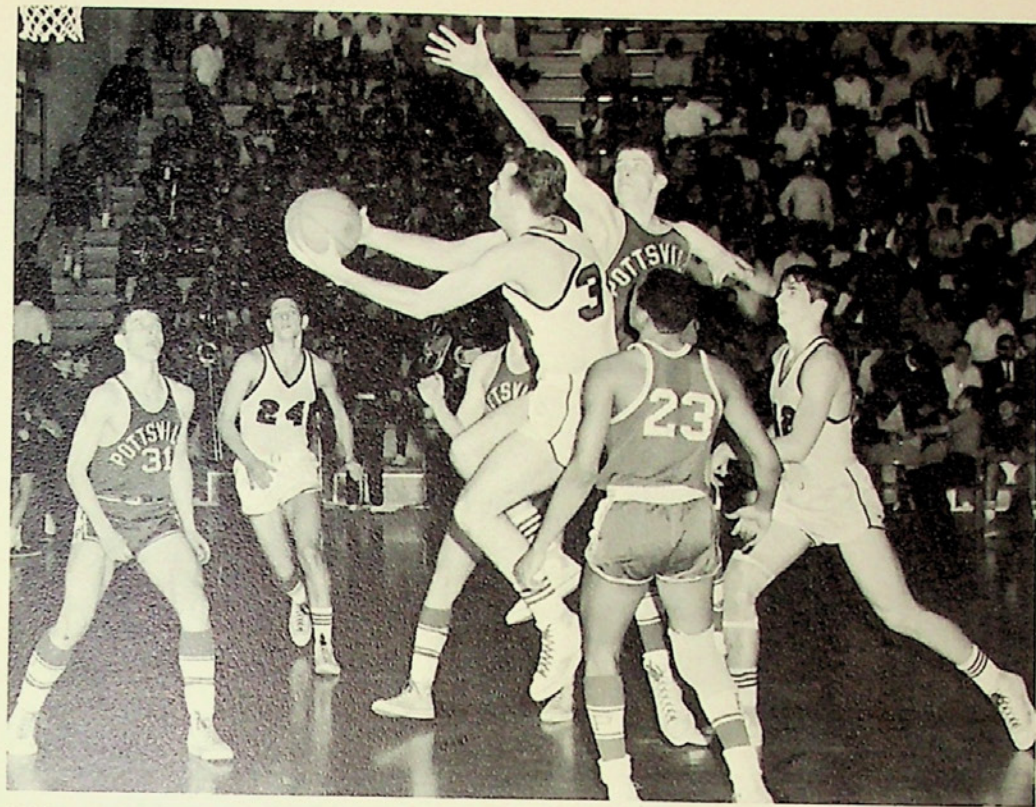

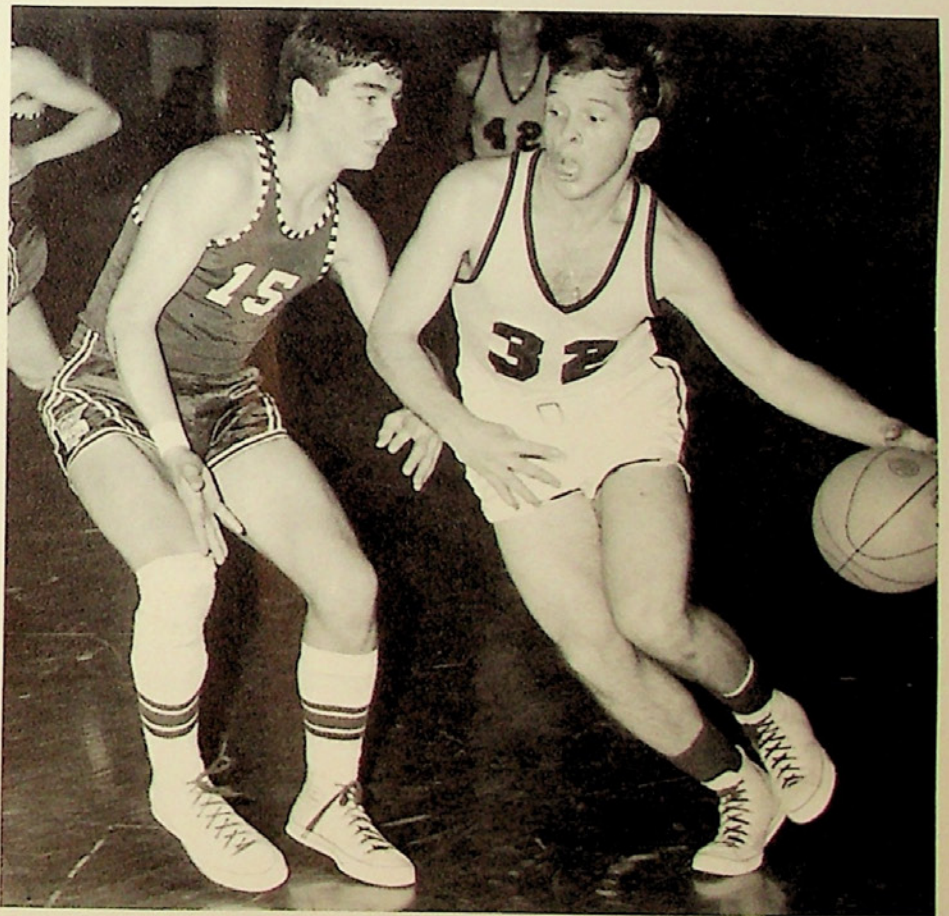

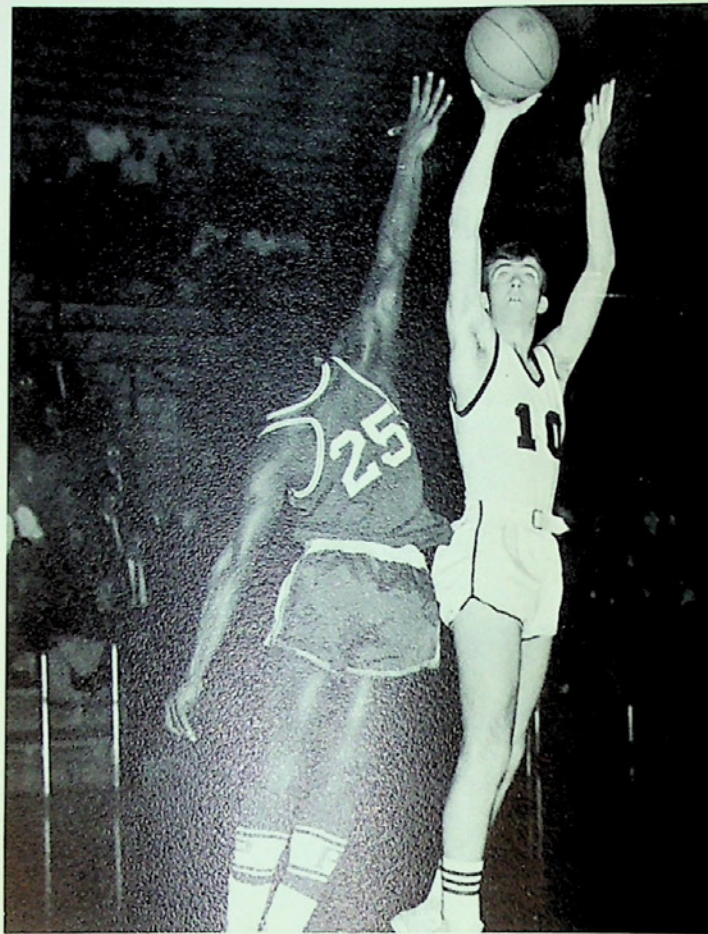

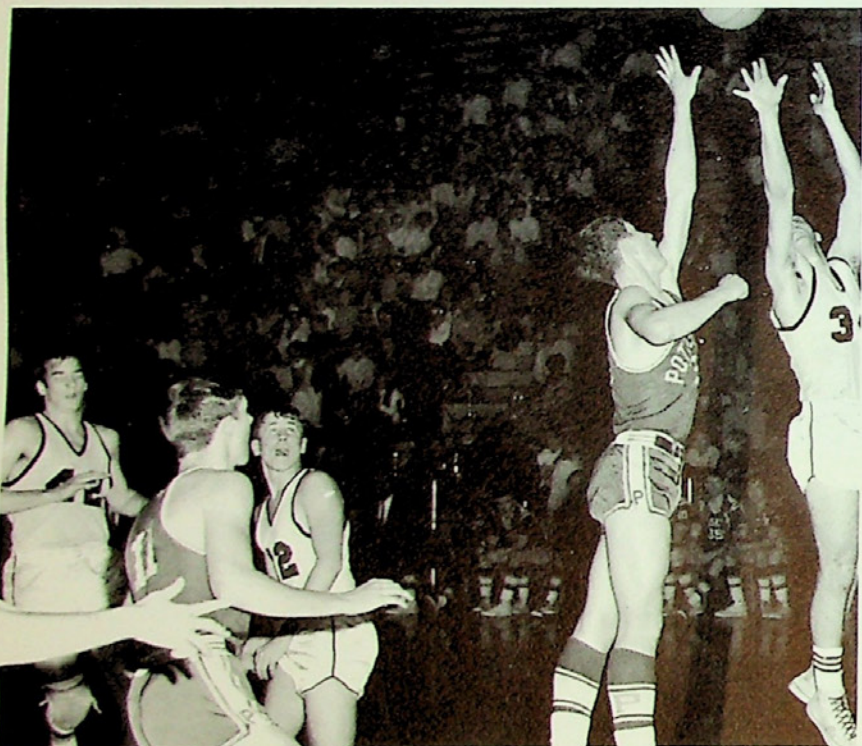

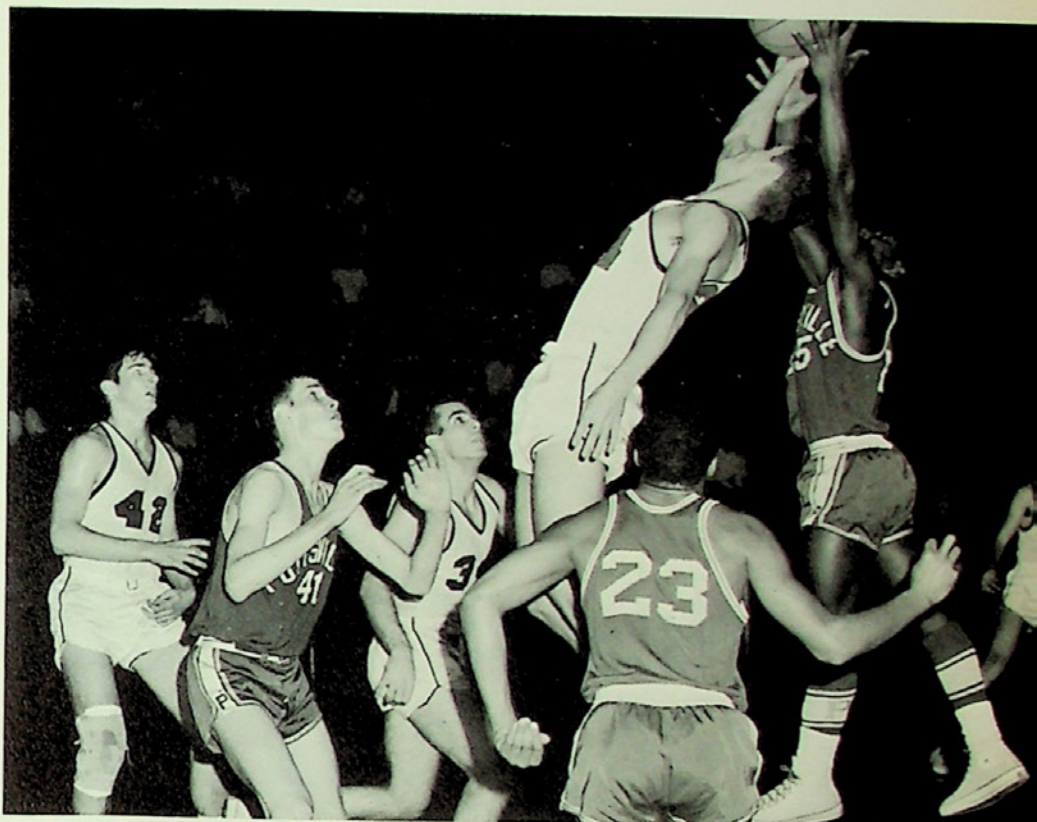

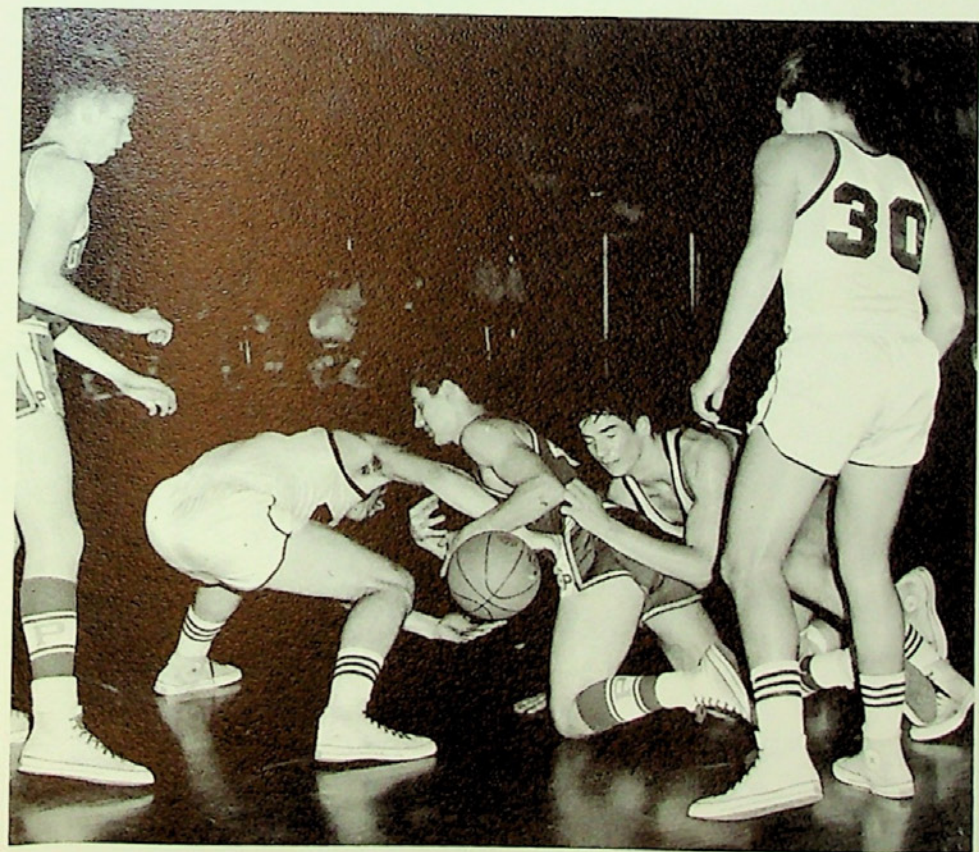

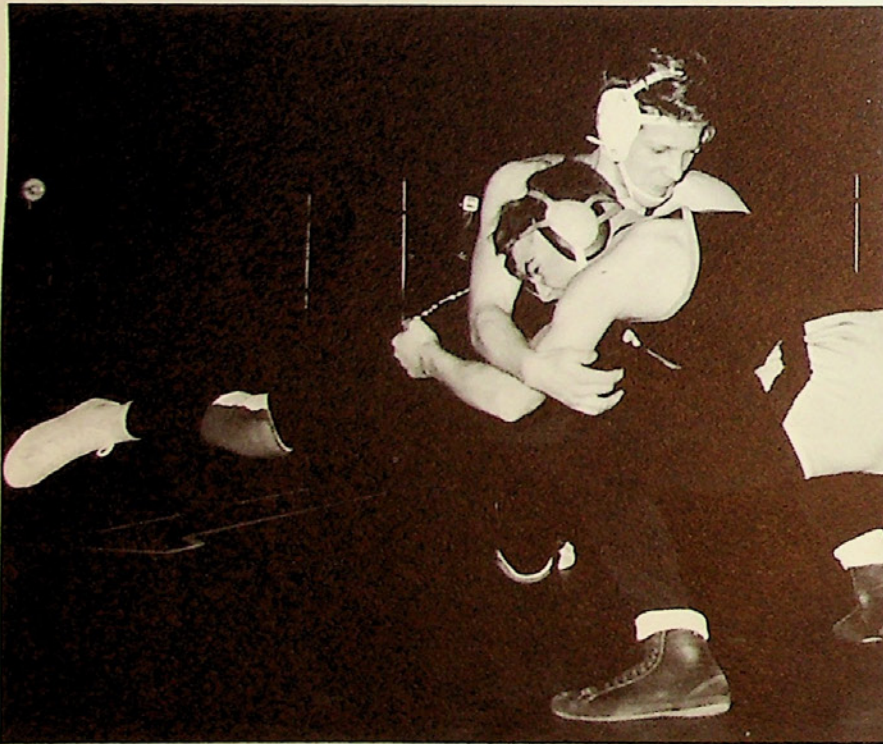

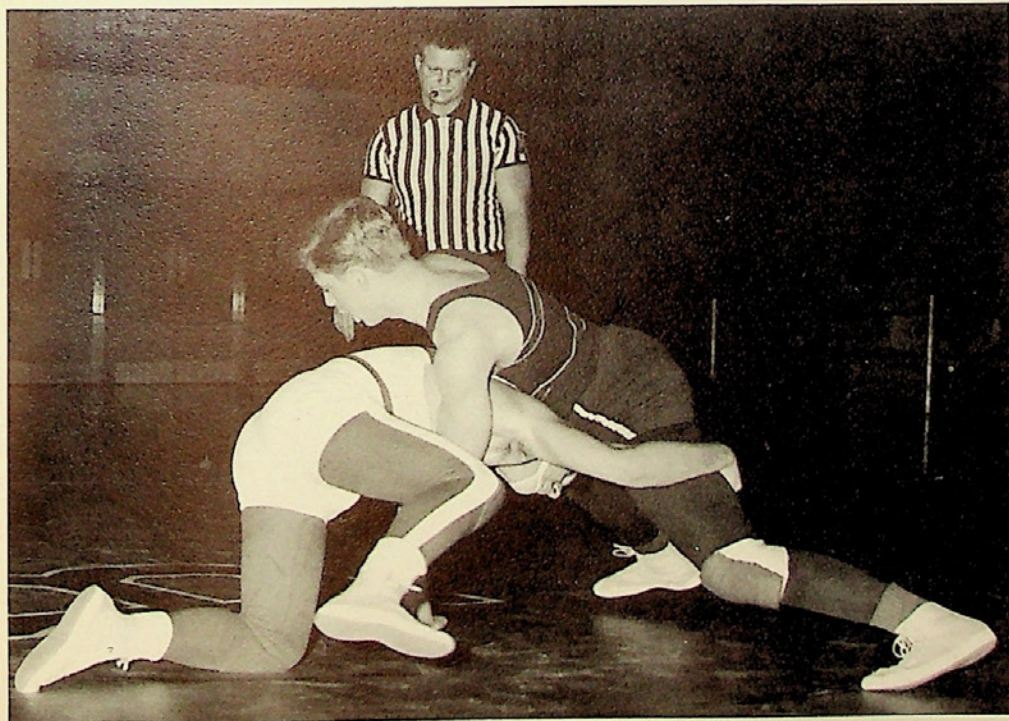

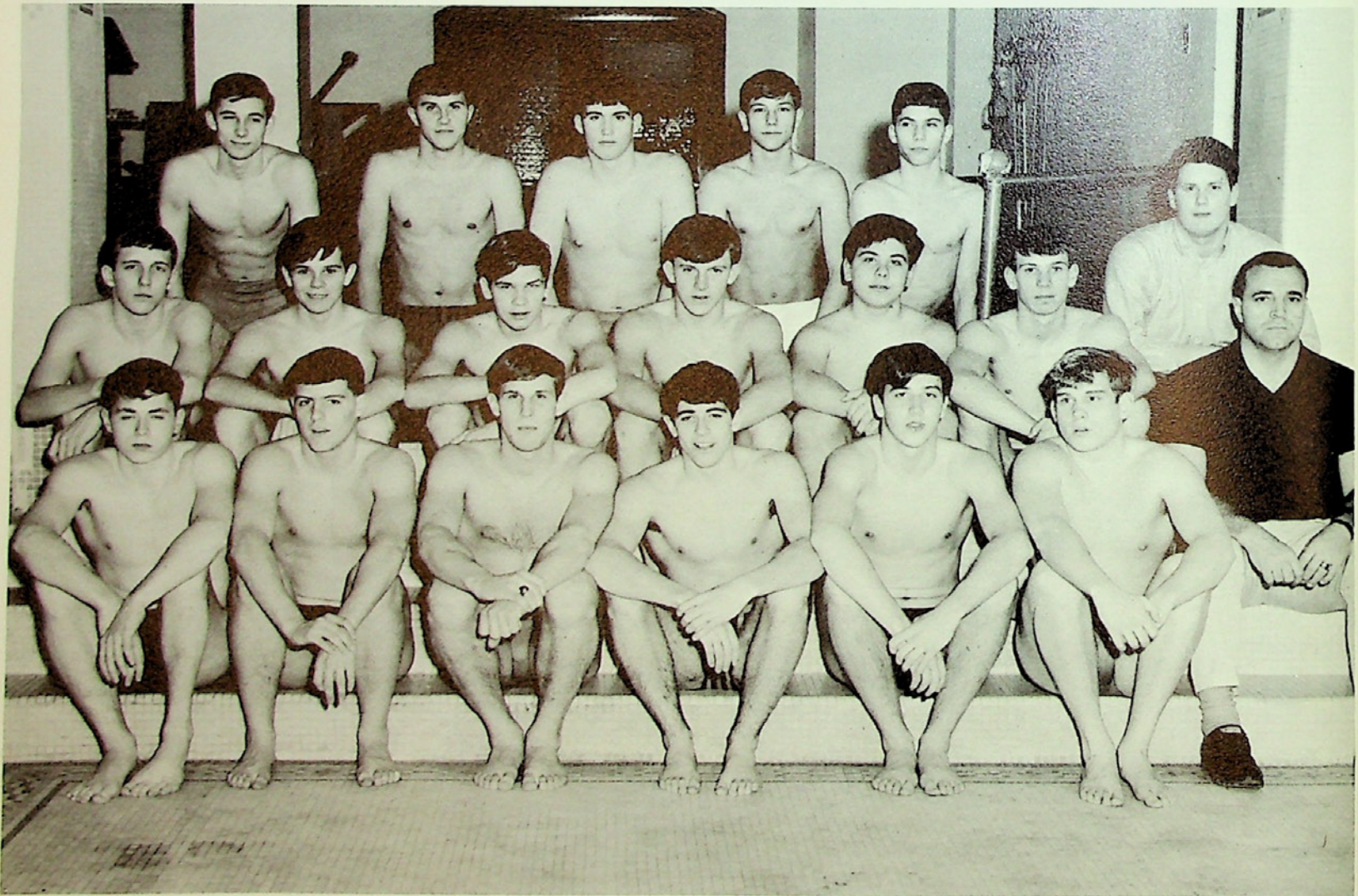
Finishing his first swimming season at Liberty High School, Coach Pat Garramone had a 1968 season record of 6 wins, 4 losses, and 1 tie.

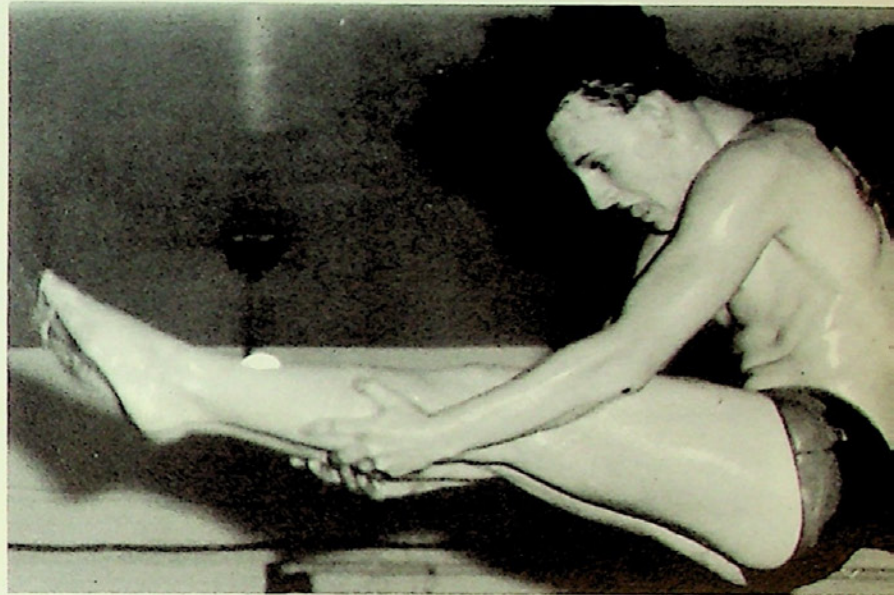

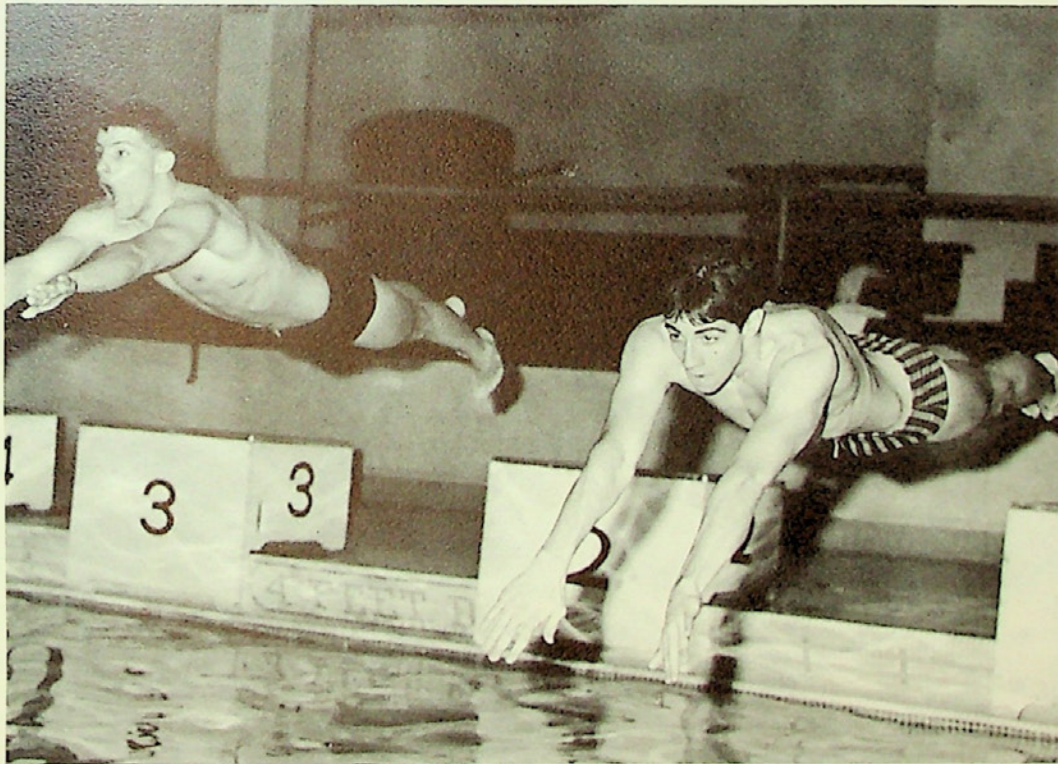

Building endurance with daily practice, Jack Feyrer strives to break the current pool record in the butterfly stroke.

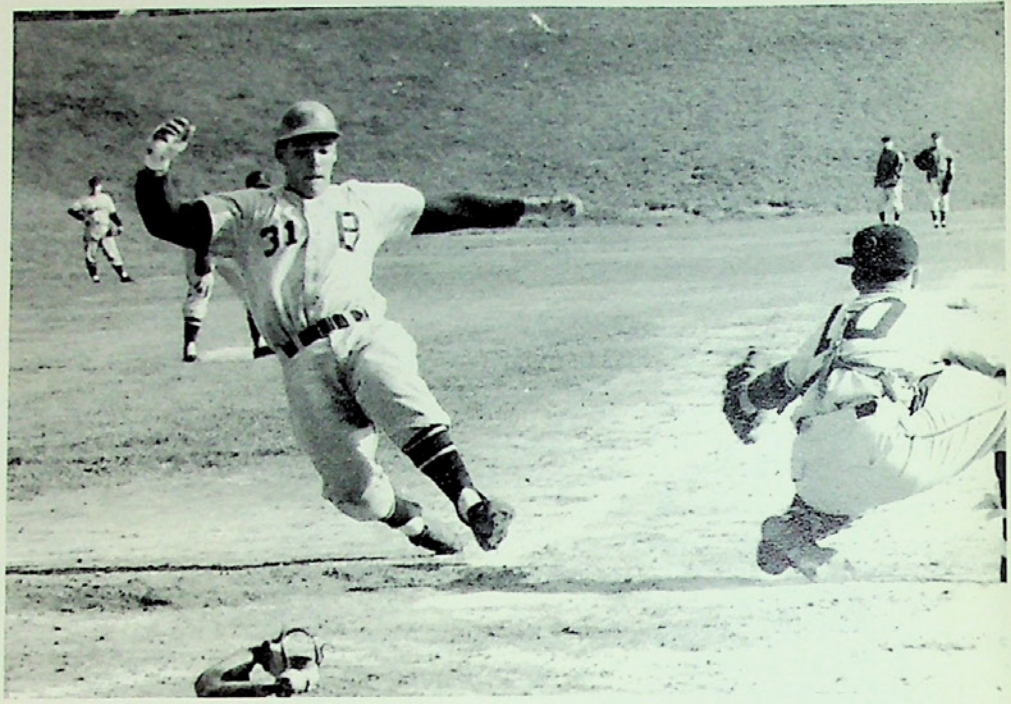

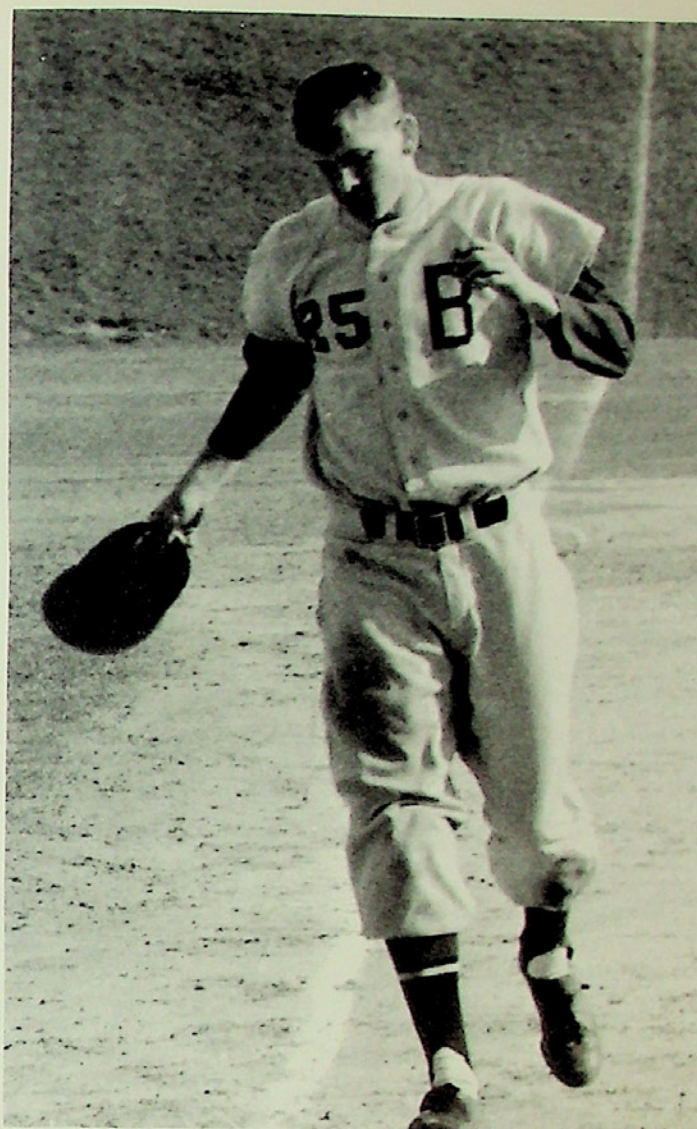
BASEBALL

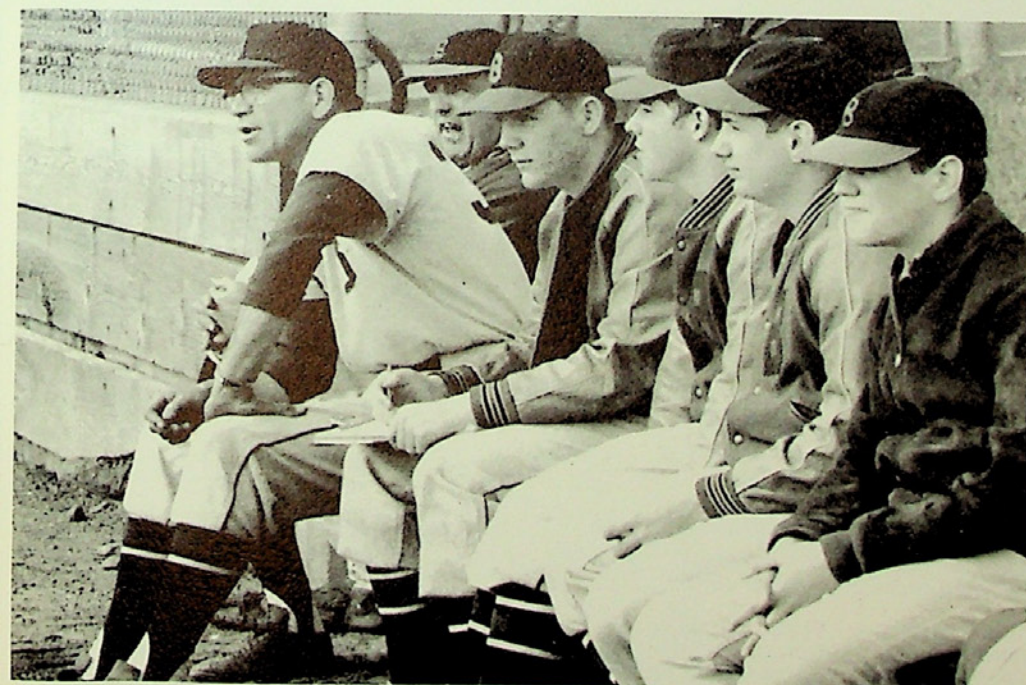

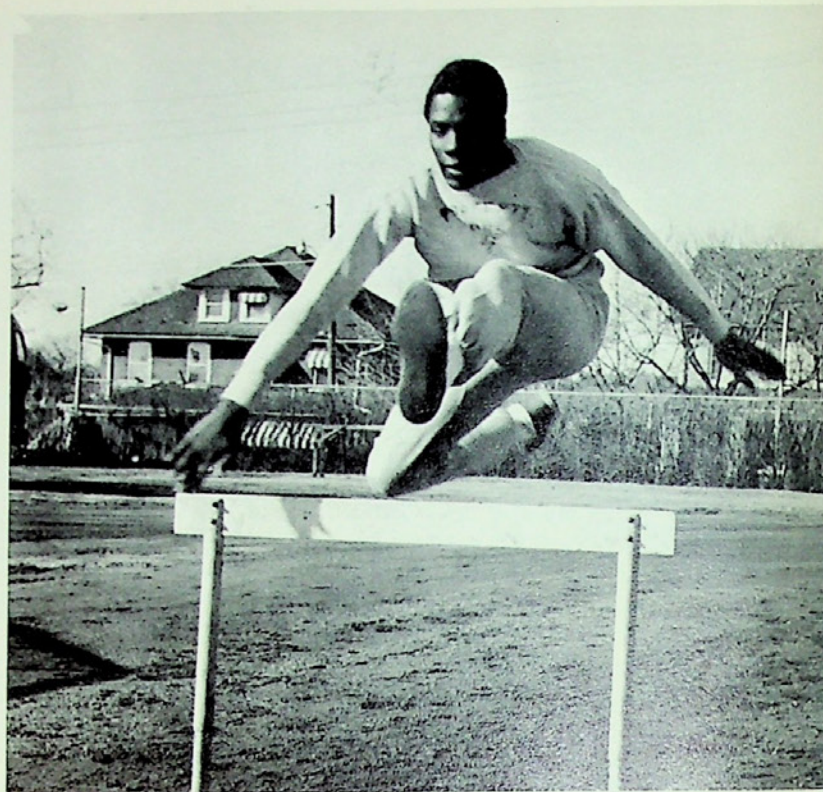

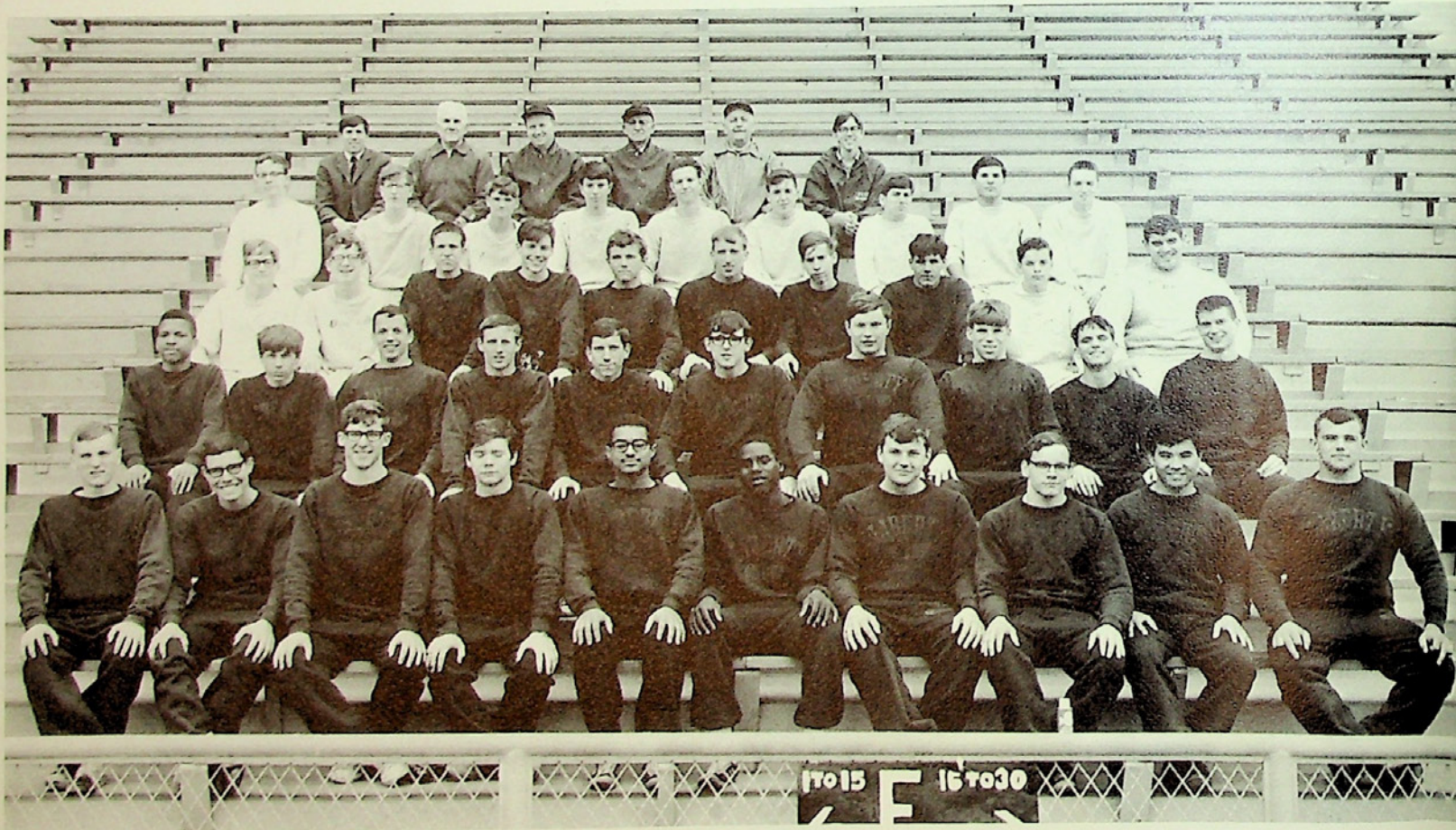
TRACK

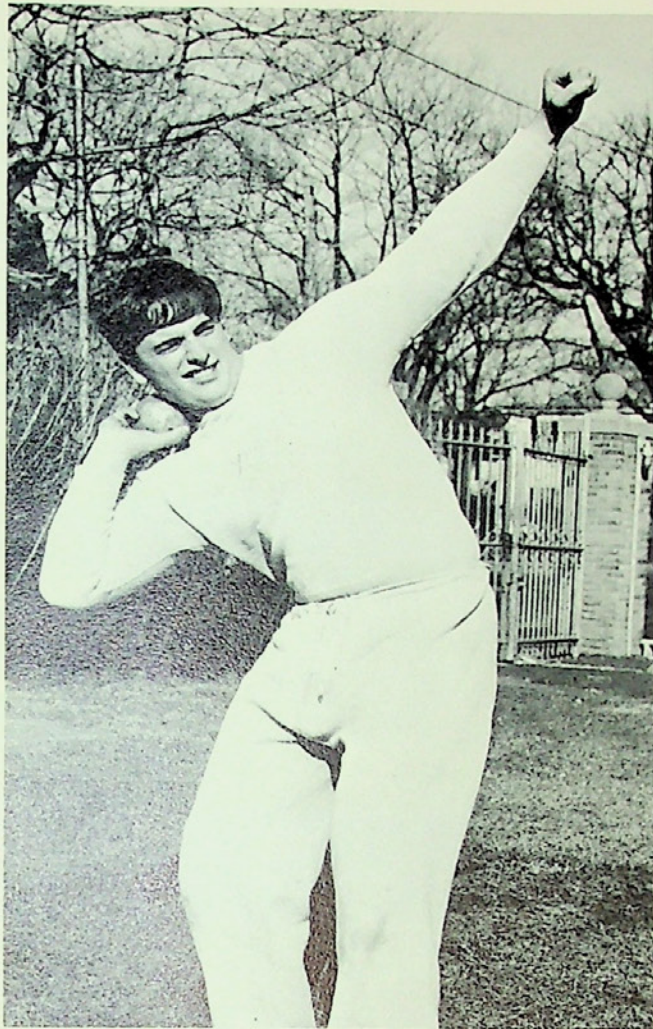


Lee Grimes shows speed and agility as he clears the hurdle.

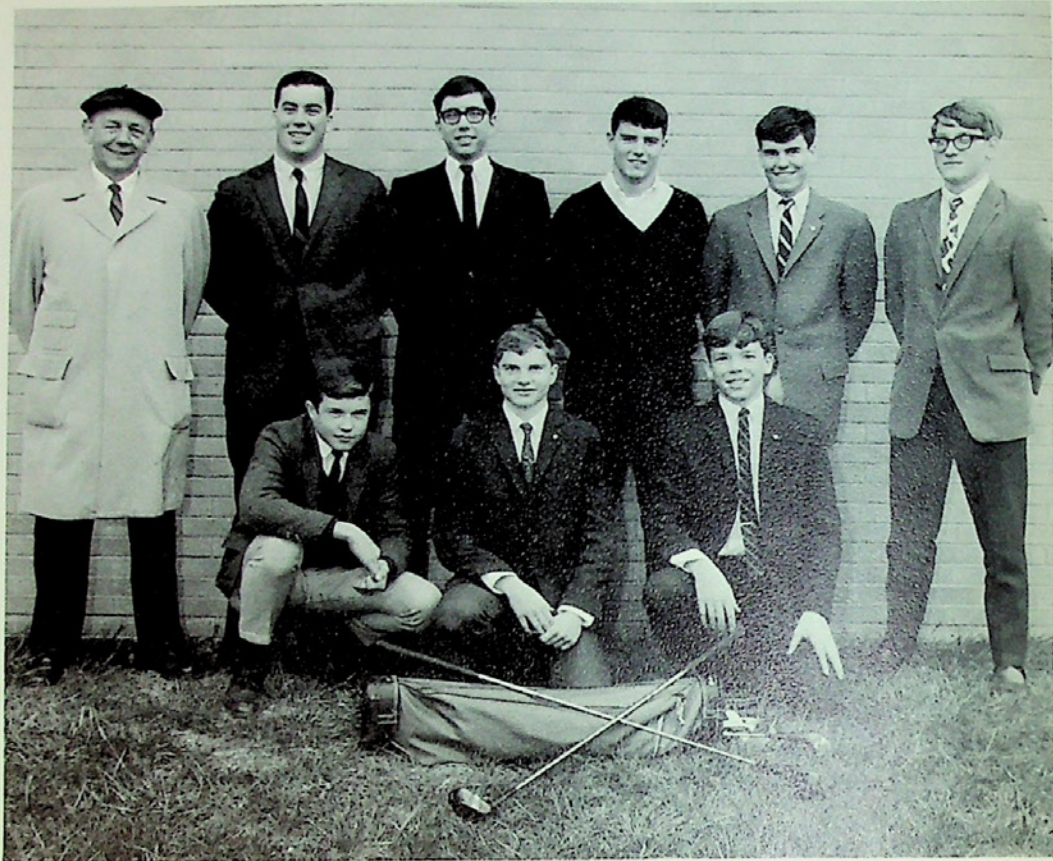

RIFLE

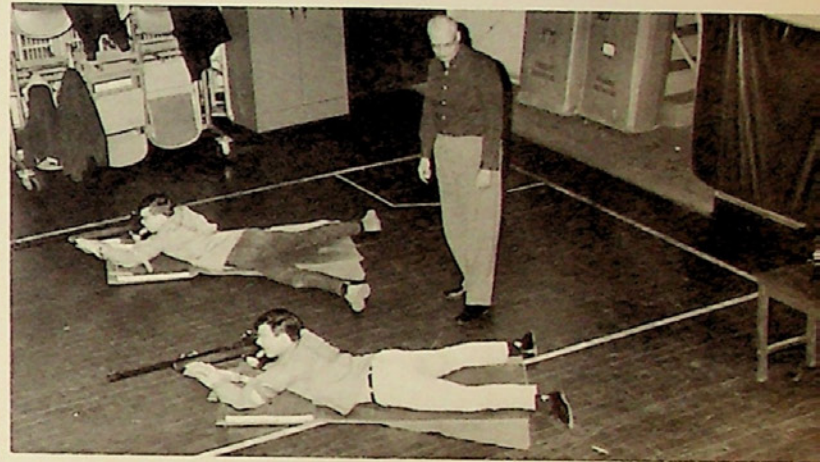
As a result of the successful record of last year's rifle team, competition continued throughout the 1967-68 season.

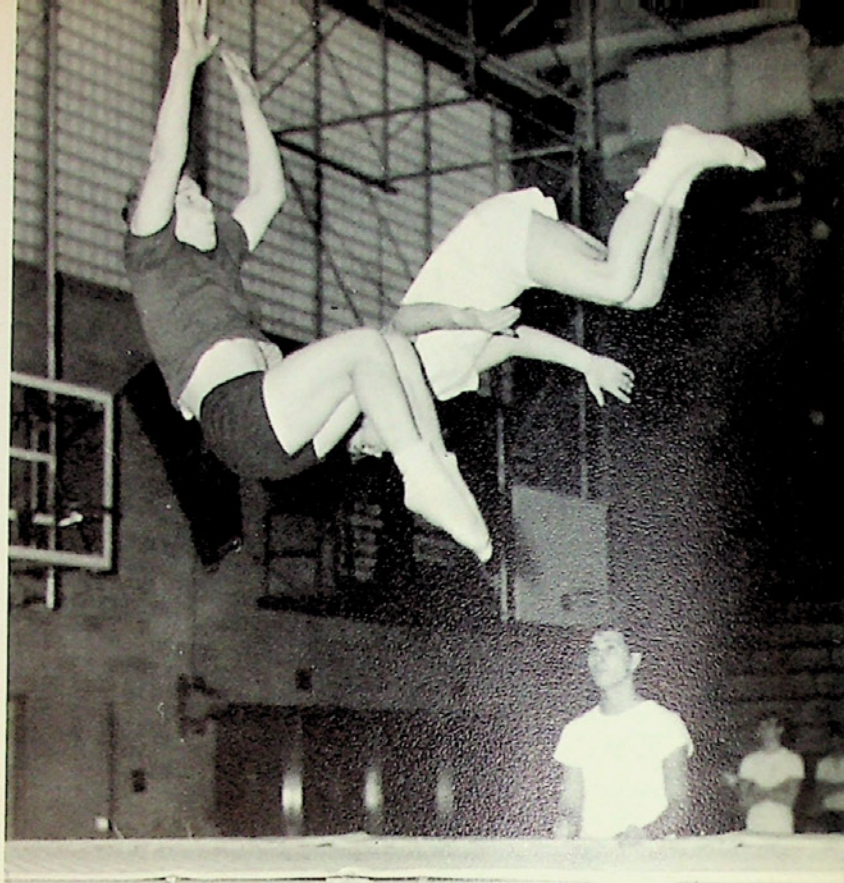

INTRAMURALS

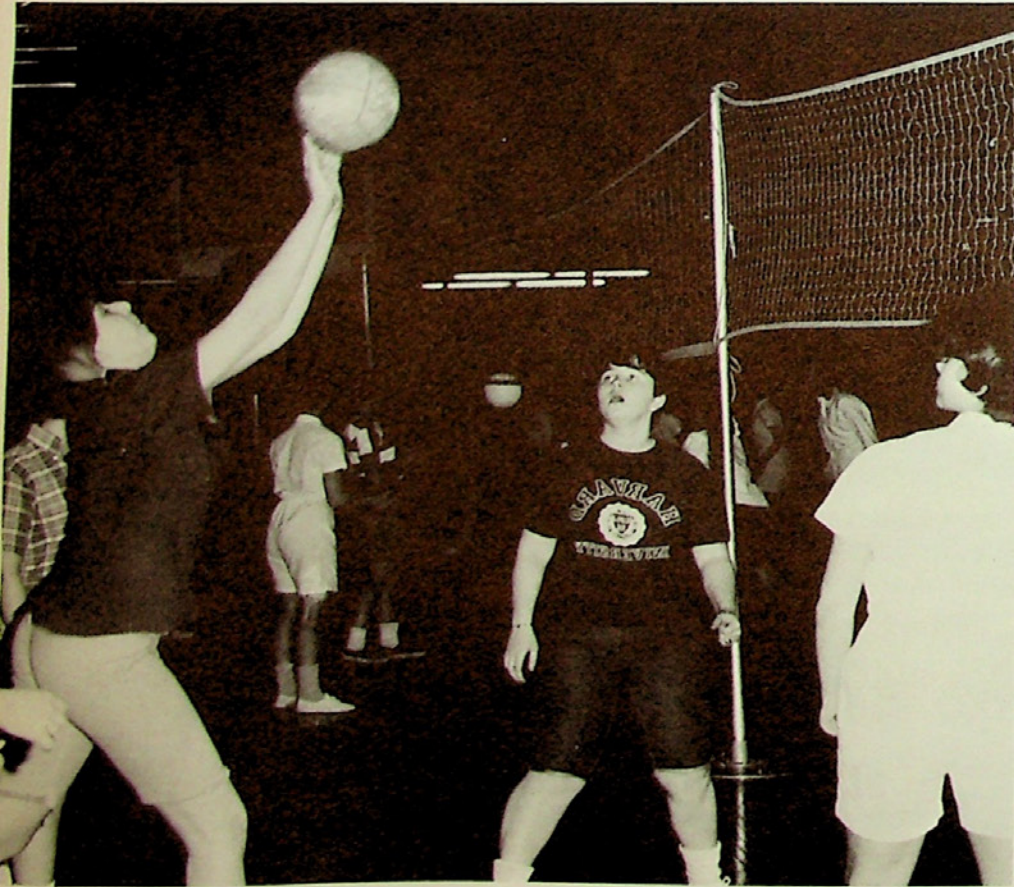

Keen competition was evident throughout the year's intramural program. Permanent teams were formed in most sports, although in others the students chose to select different teams each day.

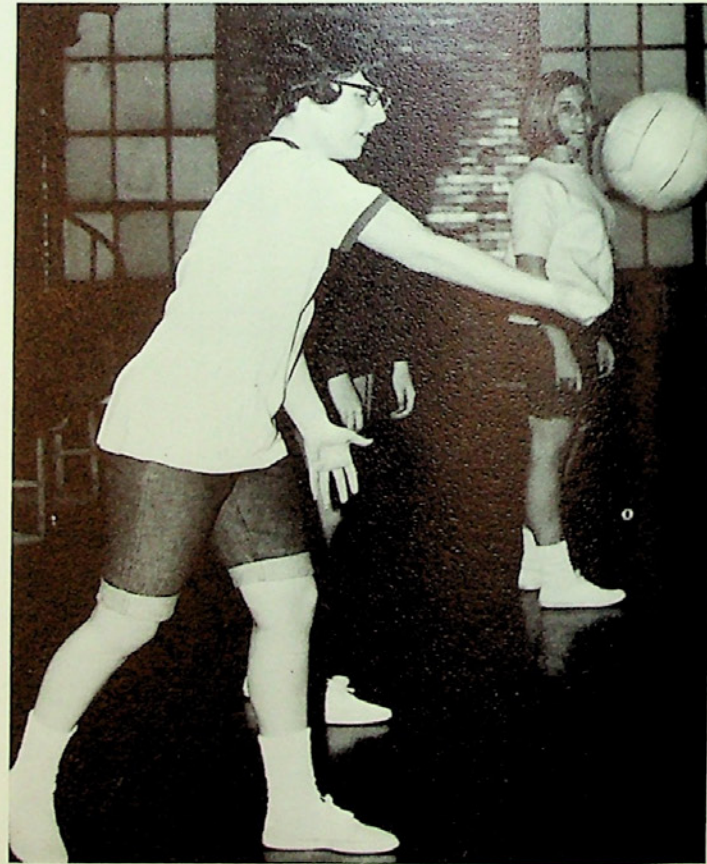

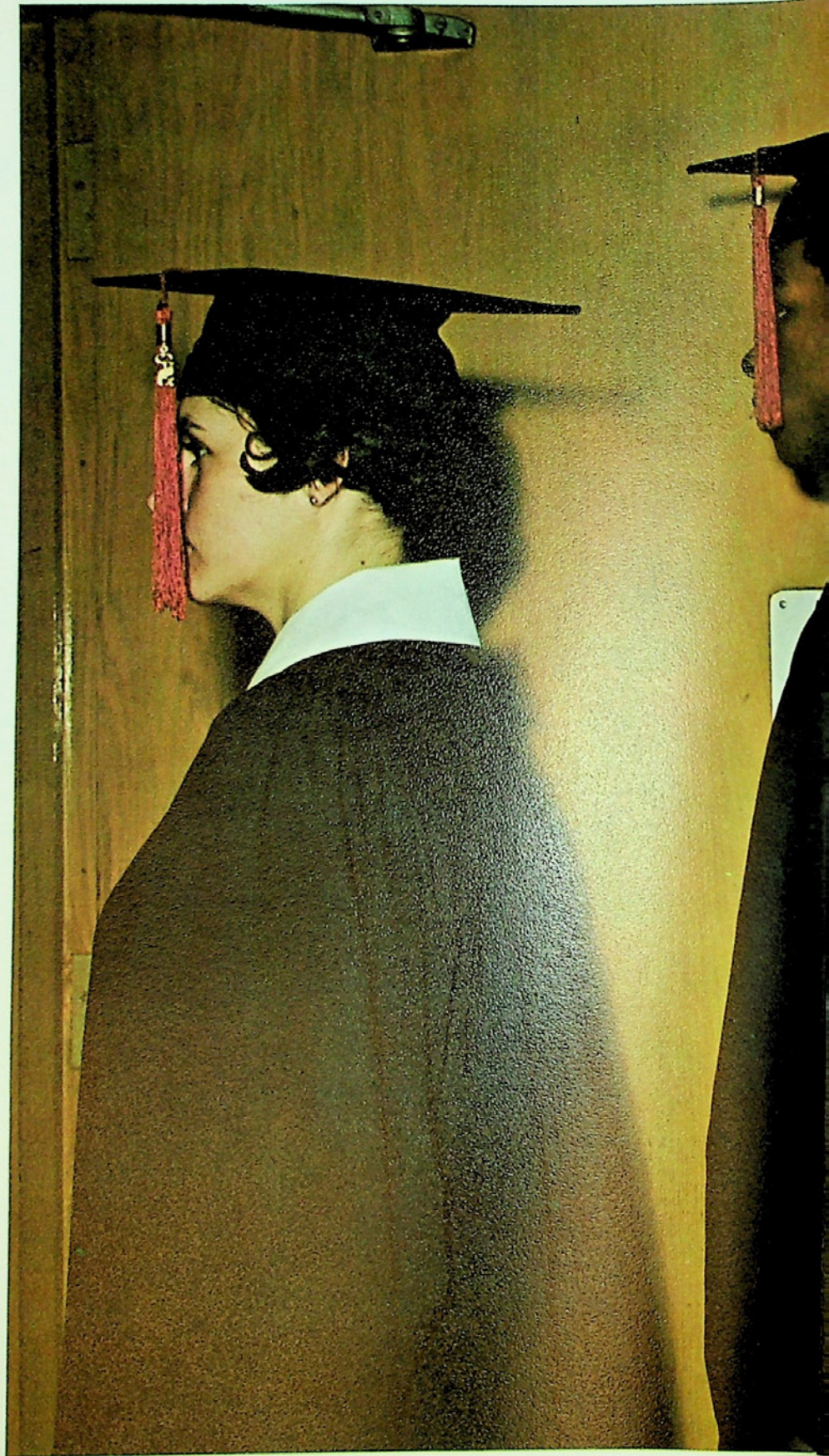
MERMAID CLUB

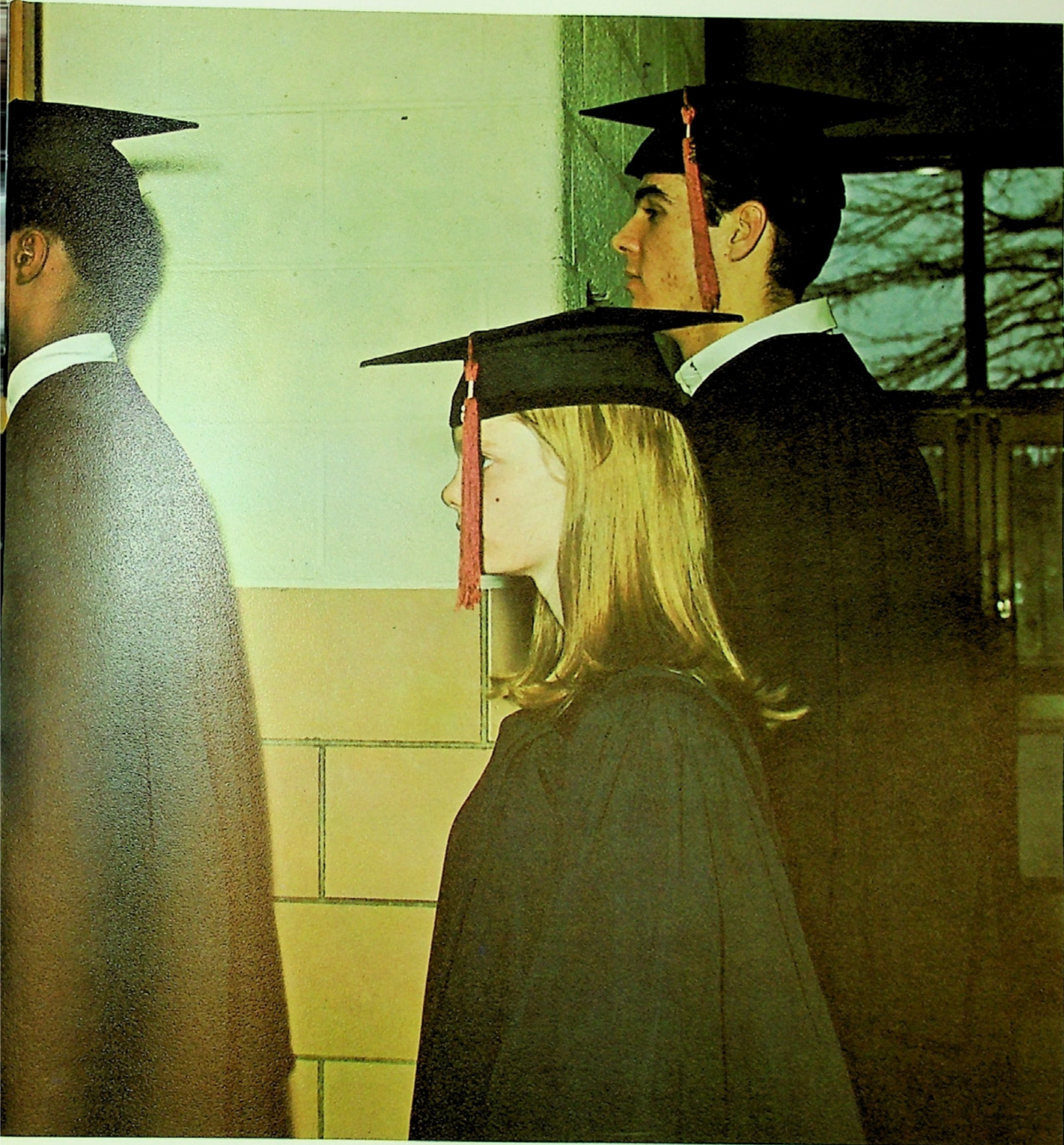

Luther Grandison, a sinister actor and playwright, overshadows the life of each character in "The Unsuspected." All are under his threatening control, and all but a few fear and hate him.

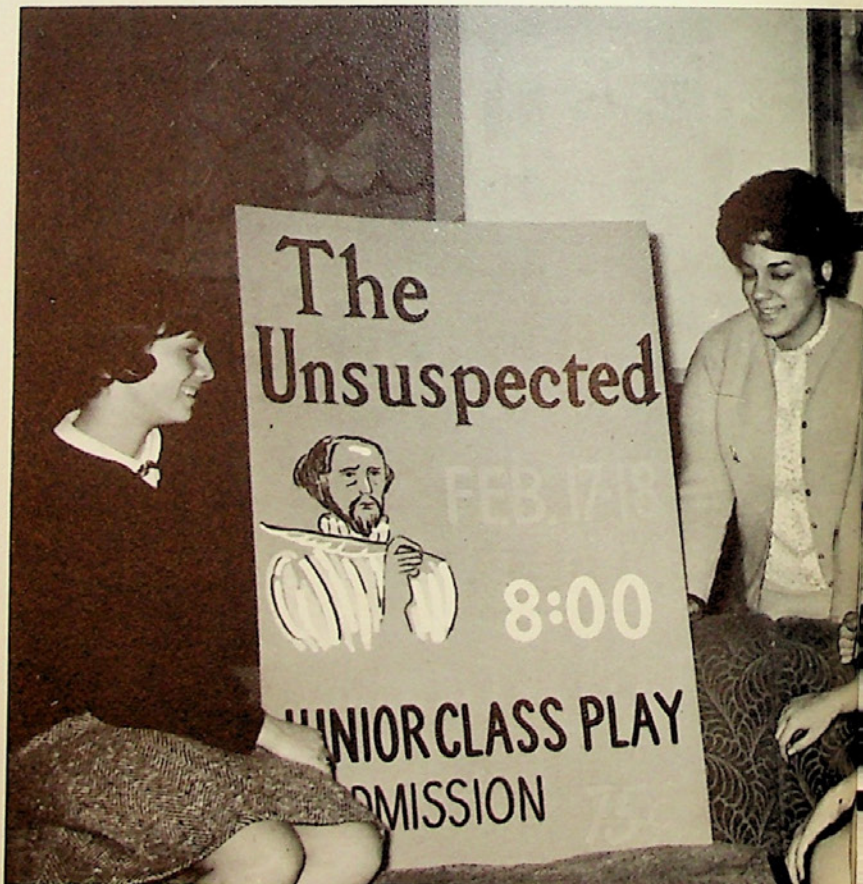
Tyl Frazier, a young heiress, and Althea Keane, a beautiful model, are Grandison's wards. Both girls adore him, and neither will believe that he is concealing wickedness behind a facade of virtue.

The play opens following the supposed suicide of Rosaleen, Grandison's secretary. Because Frank Moynihan, her fiance, suspects murder, he moves into the house posing as Frank Howard, a wealthy businessman, and claims to be Tyl's husband. Tyl insists she isn't married, but Frank attributes this to her loss of memory following an accident. Frank is adamant in his tale, and convinces nearly everyone, even Althea, of its truth. Living in the house under this guise, Frank uncovers several clues concerning Rosaleen's death. His sister, Jane, Grandison's new secretary, pretends not to know Frank, but schemes with him throughout the play.

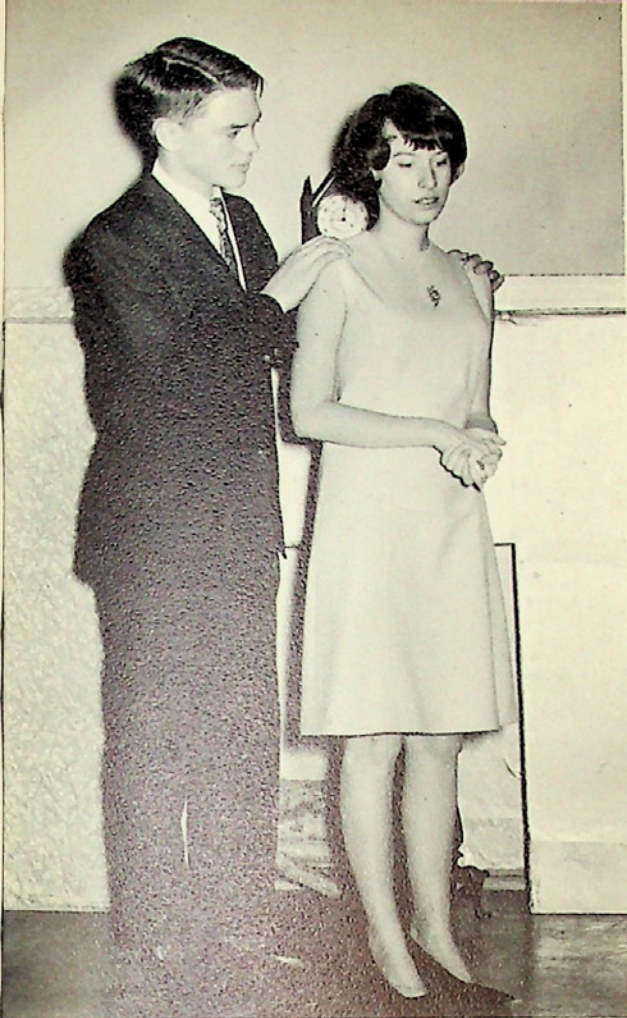

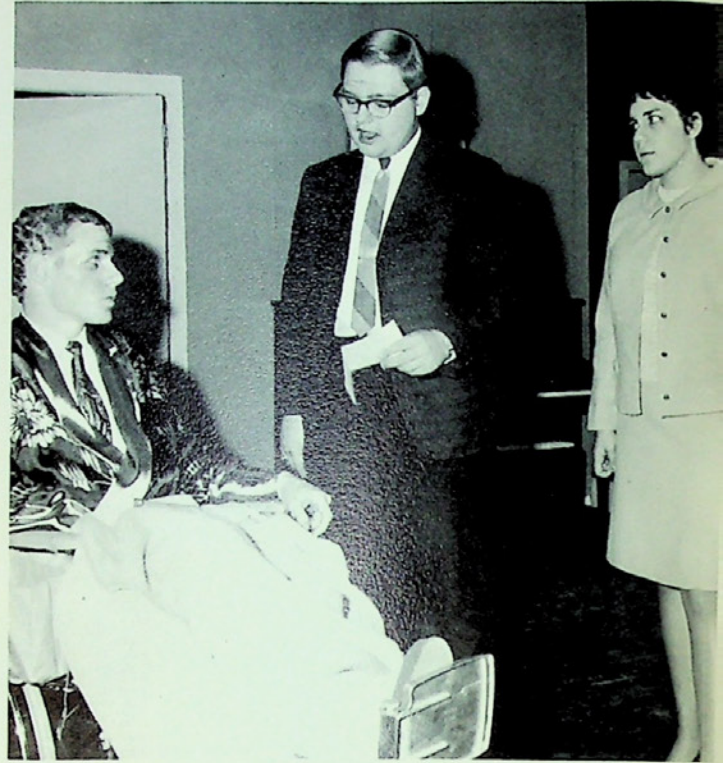
Seniors Present: "THE MAN WHO CAME TO DINNER"

Sheridan Whiteside, a famous stage and radio personality, is a man who has acquired a wide assortment of friends through his extensive travels. Among these are Lorraine Sheldon, a glamorous beauty disliked because of her many affairs and her fawning manner; Professor Metz, a brilliant entomologist who presents Mr. Whiteside with a glass-enclosed cockroach farm as a gift; Beverly Carlton, a handsome and debonaire English actor; and Banjo, a wildly impulsive Hollywood playboy. Maggie Cutler, Whiteside's personal secretary, appears to be his only normal associate.

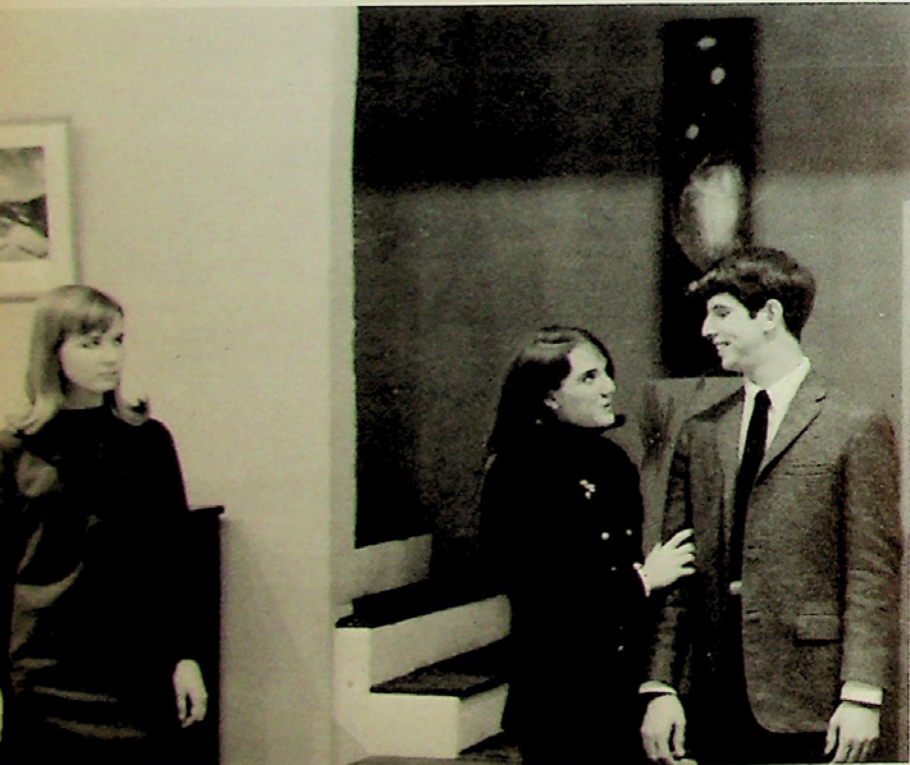
Due to an accident in which his hip was broken, Whiteside must be immobilized in the home of the Stanleys during the Christmas holidays. The Stanleys, a reasonably wealthy family, resent his disrupting presence in their home, and are aggravated by his sharp temper, bitter tongue, and domineering attitude.

Whiteside's interference in the lives of those around him, his strange acquaintances and their antics, his knack for getting himself into trouble, and his uncanny methods of repairing the damage done add to the lightness and comedy of the play.

Although Sheridan Whiteside, the man who came not only to dine, but to upset the lives of all the characters in the play, is basically a nasty and conniving man, his lines and actions abound in laughter-inducing sarcasm and wit.

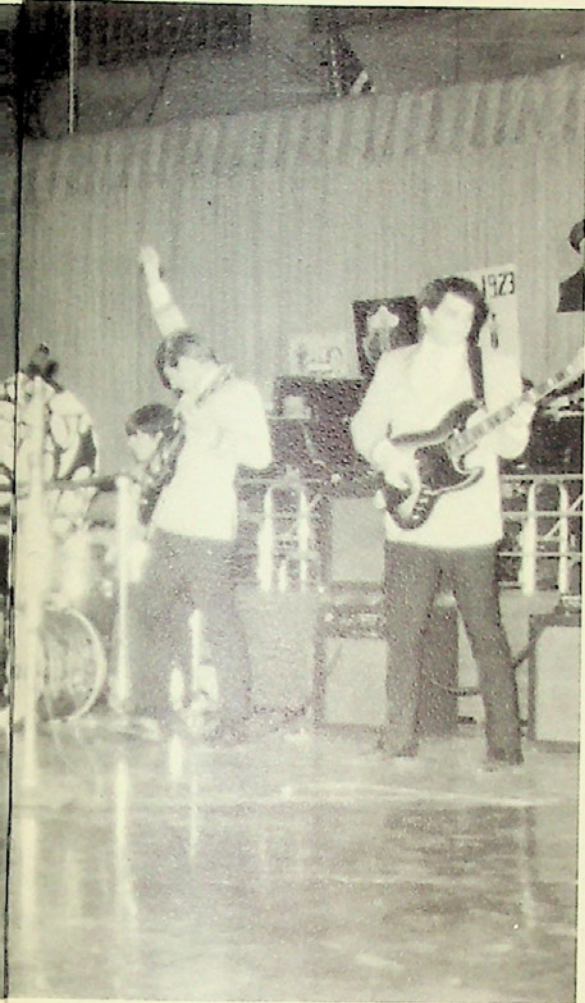

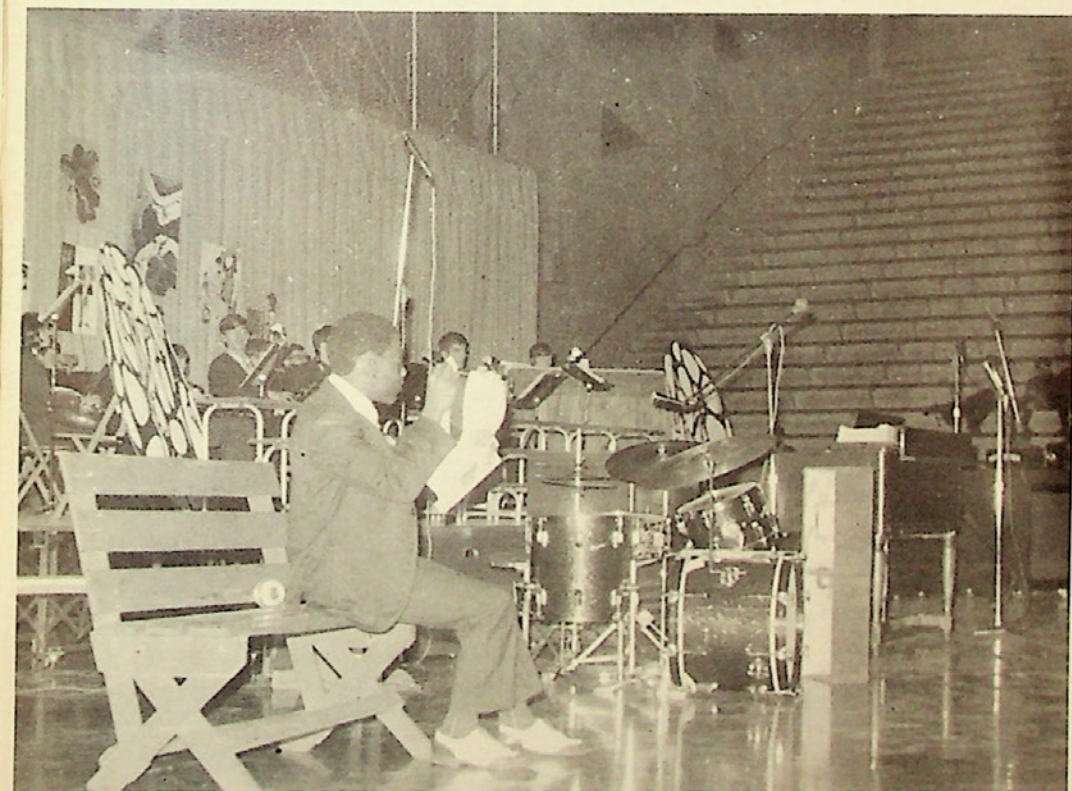

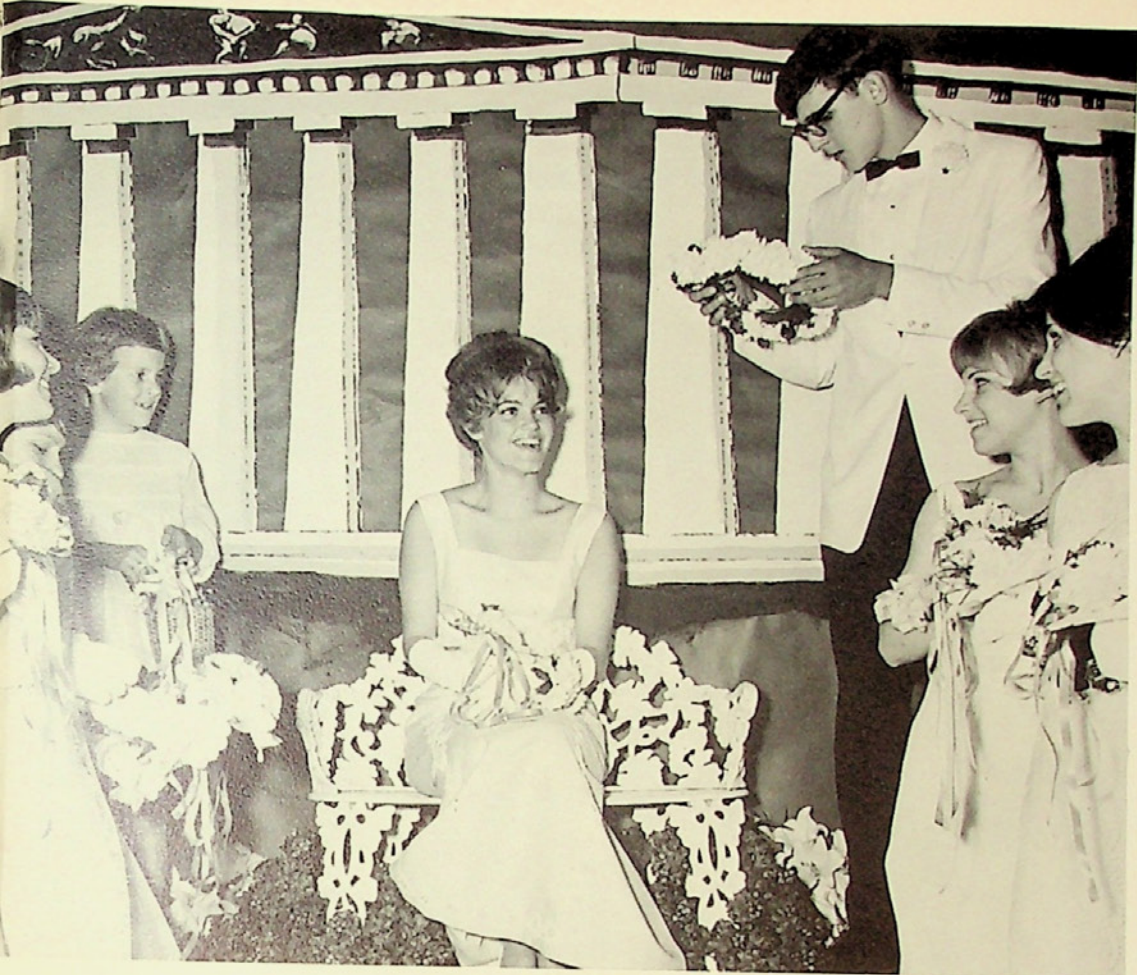

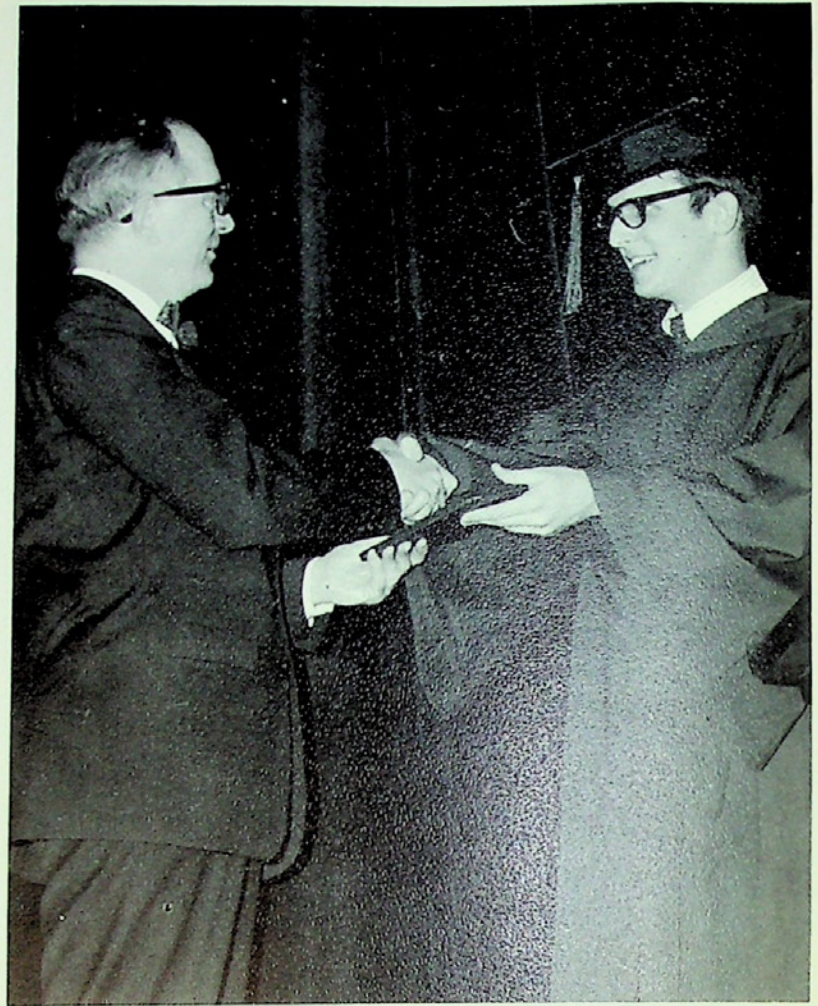

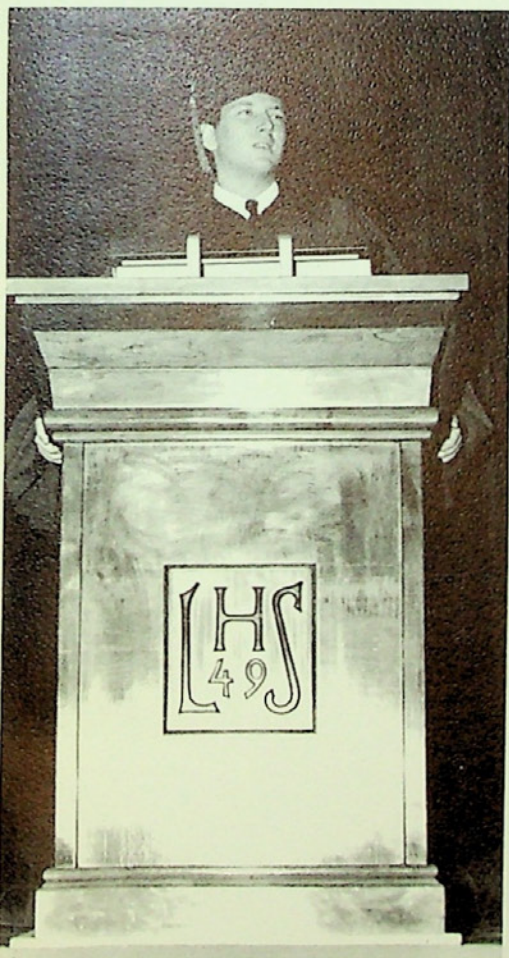
