BROTHERS GET STRIPES

Edward and Alfred Stark Made Corporals in Army.

Brothers-in-arms who are advancing step by step in rank in the United States Army are Edward and Alfred Stark, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Stark of Butztown. Both have recently been promoted to corporal in their respective units of the service.

Edward, who is 19, has written of his safe arrival in Africa, where he is now a member of the invasion forces. A graduate of Liberty High, he enlisted in June of 1942, and has been training at various military centers since he completed his basic work at Camp Lee, Va. He was time-keeper for the Bethlehem Fabricators before "joining up."

Alfred, 21, donned Uncle Sam's uniform in January of 1940. A machine gunner with an infantry outfit, he was at Schofield Barracks, Honolulu, Hawaii, when the Japs attacked on December 7, 1941. He was wounded during the engagement and hospitalized for some time. Right now he is still in the Pacific area. He is a Liberty High alumnus, class of 1939.
