Made Instructor At Radio School

Sgt. William D. Randall, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. David Randall, of Bath Pike, has been made an instructor in the advanced radio school at Reno, Nev., where he has been training since returning from overseas in July, ranking high in his class.

Sgt. Randall entered the Air Corps June 12, 1942, and received his basic training at Keester Field, Miss. He studied at the radio school at Madison, Wis., before going overseas for 19 months.

While serving as radio operator on a transport in the Mediterranean theater of operations, he flew missions over India and the China border from Africa. He was furloughed home in July and spent a twenty-one day furlough with his parents.

Prior to entering the service, Sgt. Randall graduated from Moravian Preparatory School and Moravian College, class of 1942.
