Mrs. Lurliene V. Klotz, 545 Benner Avenue, received a War Department telegram informing her of the death of her husband. Cpl. Harold Klotz, who was killed in action in Germany February 28.

Father of a six-year-old son, Robert, he would have celebrated his 30th birthday anniversary next week. He enlisted March 10, 1943 and received anti-aircraft training in military camps throughout the Carolinas. He was transferred to infantry division before going overseas to England two months ago. Since then, Cpl. Klotz was again transferred to an anti-aricraft battalion which had seen action throughout Belgium.
