Today word was received by Mrs. Earl Beltzner of 629 Second Avenue, that her husband, Pvt. Earl Beltzner of the First Marine Division, was wounded while serving in Okinawa. A letter from the young man describes the wound as being a hit in the ankle by a Jap mortar shell.

Pvt. Beltzner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Beltzner of 629 Second Avenue, was a former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company. He was inducted March 27, 1944, and left for overseas duty the following December. His wife, the former Gladys Koerner, is now employed at Sure-Fit Company. One daughter, Virginia May, celebrated her third birthday last week.
