## CPL. WESTON L. LUGG SEP 19 1944 Pen Argyl Airman Killed In Plane Crash

Cpl. Weston L. Lugg, 22, foster son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Williams, of 505 George Street, Pen Argyl, was killed in an airplane crash at Scott Field, Ill., yesterday morning at 8:17 o'clock (CWT).

The news was received by the family by telephone late yesterday afternoon and was confirmed by the receipt of a telegram later last evening.

evening. Cpl. Lugg, an aerial gunner on a Martin Marauder bomber, was stationed at Lake Charles, La., for the past four months and was on a flight trip when the crash occurred.

trip when the crash occurred. He enlisted in the U. S. Army Air Corps and entered service on September 2. He was a member of the Bethany Evangelical Church, Pen Argyl.

He was a graduate of Pen Argyl High School, class of 1940, where he was active in all sports, being a member of the varsity football, basketball and baseball teams. After graduating he was active in baseball circles in the Slate Belt region, playing with the junior legion team of Bangor, the Sterling Mill team and independent games.
