PVT. F. HUBER DIES IN ACTION

9-3 — 1942
Steel City Marine Enlisted in
April and Was Last Sta-
tioned in California.

Pvt. Frank Huber, 20, of Beth-
lehem R. D. 4, who enlisted in
the United States Marine Corps
last April 13, has been killed in
action.

Word to that effect, with the an-
nouncement from his command-
ing officer that details would follow
later, was received by the youth's
parents late yesterday.

Pvt. Huber entered the Marine
Corps by enlisting at the Allentown
recruiting station. He was sent to
Parris Island, S. C., for preliminary

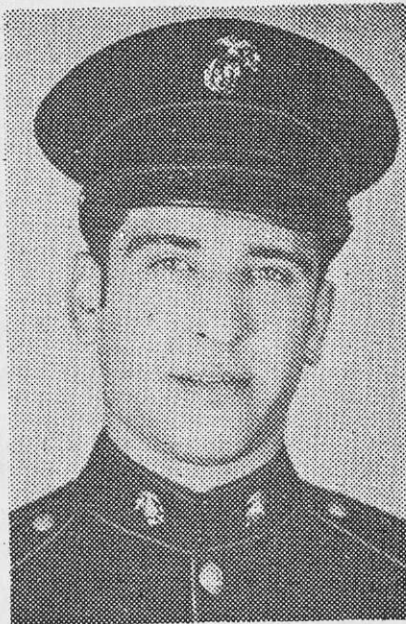

training and about two months ago
was sent to California.

Just where, how and when he was
killed in action has not been made
known. The last word his family
received from him was seven weeks
ago while he was still stationed in
California.

He had not been home on fur-
lough since enlisting, members of
his family said.

Pvt. Huber was a son of Joseph
and Mary (nee Kovach) Huber, and
was born in Lower Saucon Town-
ship. He attended Steel City schools
and served three years in a CCC
camp at Pine Grove Furnance.

Immediately prior to his enlist-
ment he was employed by Bethle-
hem Steel Company. He was well
known in Steel City and Lower
Saucon Townships.

Surviving, in addition to his par-
ents, are the following brothers and
sisters: Peter, Steel City; Joseph
Hellertown; John, stationed w/
the U. S. Army at North Caro and
Steven and George, at home
Mrs. Anna Dallna, Ohio.
