Stalag 4B, and returned to U. S.
military control, it was revealed in
a telegram from the War Department yesterday.
Corporal Erwin, husband of the
former Alma Bernhard, was reported missing in action during the
battle for Luxembourg on December

16. The date of his return to United States Army control was given as April 13/
He is the son of the late William H. Erwin and Olivia Stem Erwin of Rethlebon. H. Erwin and Olivia Stem Erwin of Bethlehem. A graduate of Staunton Military Academy and University of Pittsburgh he entered the army in March 1941. After training at various camps he went overseas in September, 1943. There he was stationed in England, France, Belgium, and Germany as a member of the medical corps.
