Maj. Diamond Gets Award For Service

Major Maynard L. Diamond, husband of Mrs. Elizabeth Diamond, 130 Wall Street, has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for meritorious service as Executive Officer to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, 89th Infantry Division, in operations against the enemy in Germany.

"In the advance to and crossing of the Moselle River," the citation accompanying the award reads, "the assault crossing of the Rhine River and the subsequent swift offensive into Central Germany, he worked tirelessly and efficiently in solving the many complex problems presented by a fluid situation in which hostile forces were constantly changing."

"His foresight and sound judgment enabled him to provide at all times an accurate interpretation of enemy potentialities. His superior knowledge, keen intelligence and unselfish devotion to duty for long hours contributed much to the success of the division in its combat operations."

Major Diamond is the son of Dr. and Mrs. Hubert M. Diamond, 801 West Broad Street, and the grandson of the late Simon Lake, inventor of the submarine, who died this week. He received his lieutenant's bars at Camp Livingstone, La., in 1942, and was elevated to the rank of major in 1944, while stationed in California.
