## BETTY STOLP THIRD HERE TO JOIN WAVES

Graduate of Moravian College  
for Women Had Been Hos-  
pital Technician.

Miss Betty Stolp, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Stolp, of 2112 Easton Avenue, has been accepted by the WAVES, the Navy's women's volunteer service group. She took the required examination last Wednesday in Philadelphia and was sworn in the same day for service in the technical division.

Miss Stolp was graduated from Liberty High School class of 1937, Moravian College for Women class of 1941, and is the first graduate of the college to enter the WAVES. Miss Peggy Madden, of Ninth Avenue, an alumnae of the Seminary Department, was the first Moravian girl to enlist in this Navy service.

While at Moravian Miss Stolp was a science major, taking the medical technology course. She was a member of Bi-Chem-Zo, honorary science club; Phi Mu Epsilon, social sorority; and the Math and Camera Clubs. Miss Stolp also was hiking manager of the Athletic Association and was active in all sports at the college. Recently, she was a technician at St. Luke's Hospital, New Bedford, Mass.

Miss Stolp is the third Bethlehem resident to be accepted for service with the WAVES. In addition to her and Miss Madden, Miss Frances J. Meck, of 13 West Church Street, cataloguer at the North Side Branch of the Bethlehem Public Library, has been sworn in.

Miss Meck is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank L. Meck, 230 Woodbine Street, Harrisburg; is a graduate of Syracuse University, class of 1940, and of the Library School of Drexel Institute of Technology, class of 1941; and is a member of Alpha Gamma Delta (social fraternity), Phi Kappa Phi, and Phi Beta Kappa. For the past year, she has been cataloger at the North Side Branch of the Bethlehem Public Library.
