### With First Forces To Land In Japan

George Stephen Sabol, SF 3/C, whose wife Mrs. Katherine Dorothy Sabol, resides at 214 Warren Square, took part in the Occupation of Japan in the initial landing with the Tokyo Task Force from the 1st of September to the 28th of September, 1945, aboard the USS LST 558. In his second voyage to the land of the Mikado, he reached the Northern Japanese Islands, landing at Otaru, Hokkaido, October 27.

SF 3/C Sabol, who joined the Navy in December of 1943, has been on the LST 558 since May, 1944. He is entitled to wear the American Theater Service Ribbon, the Asiatic-Pacific campaign ribbon, with 4 battle stars; for participation in the assault and occupation of Anguar and Peleliu in the Palau Islands; Leyte, Lingayen Gulf and Zambales Province in the Philippines; Okinawa in the Ryukyus and the Philippine Commonwealth Liberation ribbon with one star for action at Leyte.
