
## Kincaid, Frank T.

Mrs. Frank T. Kincaid, 1017 Pawnee Street, received the following citation from her husband who is now serving with the Third Army in southern Germany:

band who is now service the the third Army in southern Germany: "A Bronze Star Medal is awarded to Frank T. Kincaid, Pfc., FA, 273d Field Artillery Bn., who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by meritorious service during the period of September 5, 1944 to September 5, 1945, in France and Luxembourg. Pfc. Kincaid performed the duties as radio operator for the Reconnaissance Officer through December 31, 1944, with outstanding energy, resourcefulness and fidelity. On January 1, 1945, he assumed additional duties as a canoneer when extra men were needed in the gun crews. He has carried out all his duties in a superior manner with utter disregard for his personal comfort or well being, and in many instances under enemy artillery shell fire. His willingness and exceptional devotion to duty has measurably contributed to the success of his organization's operations against the enemy."

Pfc. Kincaid entered the service in October, 1943, going to Fort Bragg, N. C., and later to Camp Beal, Calif., before being shipped in July, 1944. In addition to his medal he is entitled to wear the Good Conduct Ribbon and E.T.O. Ribbon with Four Battle Stars.

He attended Bethlehem Schools Graduating from Liberty High in the class of '37. At the time of his induction he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company in the Cost Accounting Department.
