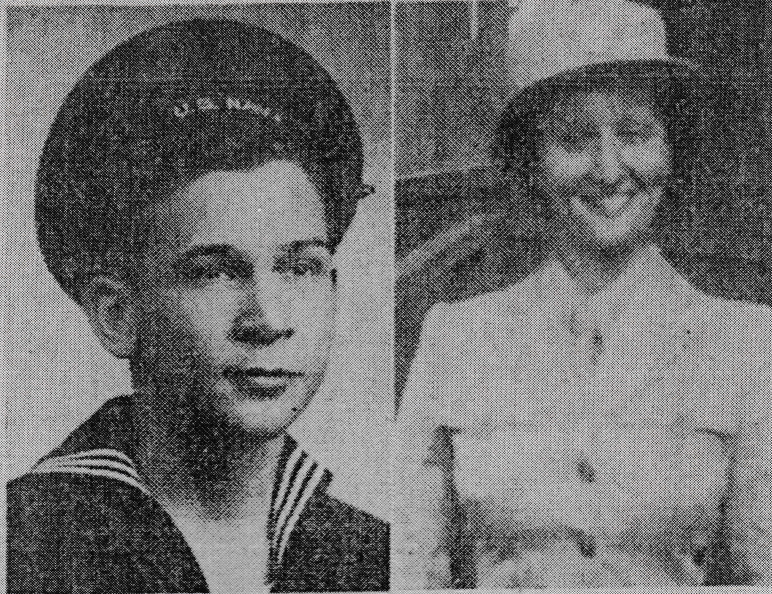

## W. J. Reichl Promoted As Sister Completes Training in WAACS

Recently advanced to the rank of Seaman Second Class, William Joseph Reichl, son of Police Officer and Mrs. William Reichl, 1528 High Street, has returned to his base at Quonset Point, R. I., following a brief respite, especially granted in order to receive his diploma at commencement exercises at Liberty High School. He had a perfect attendance for the past twelve years.

A Globe-Times carrier, he completed the prescribed course at Liberty High School early this year, and in March, enlisted in the U. S. Navy, being assigned to aviation ordnance. Following his "boot" training, he entered an advanced school at Quonset Point, and has completed four of a six weeks course.

He acquired a liking for the "briny" through frequent trips to fishing grounds off Cape May accompanying his father, who is a disciple of Izaak Walton. He never suffered seasickness, and since joining the Navy made numerous flights without feeling the effects. He told his parents that he plans to make the Navy his life work, declaring "it is just what I wanted."

A sister, Frances Reichl, also is in the country's service, recently completing her basic training in the WAACs at Daytona, Fla.

She has been assigned to one of the WAAC camps "somewhere in the United States." Prior to joining the service she had been an employe of the Roller-Smith Company.
