Ex-War Prisoner



Lt. David L. Williams of the United States Army Air Forces, son of Mr. and Mrs. William John Williams of North Third Street, Bangor, who was a prisoner of the German government for almost two years, arrived home last evening to spend a short leave with his parents. Inducted into the armed forces among the first boys from the Slate Belt area, he was first assigned to the Army Engineers. Later he was assigned to the Air Corps and graduated as a Second Lieutenant and bombardier and was assigned to a Liberator and later a B-17. Sent to England, he was shot down over Germany with his crew in August, 1943, and was taken prisoner by that government.
