Major Lee is the son of Ellsworth M. Lee, the architect, and Mrs. Lee, Paterson, N. J., and was graduated from Lehigh University with the degree of bachelor of science in chemistry in 1937, and commissioned a second lieutenant. He received his master of science degree from Lehigh in 1938 and joined the Reynolds Research Corporation, at Kearny, N. J.

He and Miss Cooke were married in April, 1940, and they have one son, Robert. On February 1, 1941, Mr. Lee reported to the Ordnance School at Aberdeen Proving Ground, was promoted to first lieutenant, made leader of an Ordnance School section.
