MAN WITH NO DRAFT REGISTRATION, IS HELD

Julius Vargo, 39, Applebutter
Road, Given Hearing Before
U. S. Commissioner.

Julius Vargo, Applebutter Road, 39 years of age who claims that he had never registered for selective service military training but who knew something about the war, was given a hearing on Friday before U. S. Commissioner T. R. Gardner, Allentown. He was held in \$1,000 bail for a further hearing on Thursday, December 17, at 2 p m.

Vargo, who on a number of occasions had applied at Bethlehem police headquarters for a night's lodging, was searched a few nights ago by Sergeant Harvey Blank, and when it was found that he did not have a registration card, he was placed in the cell block. Following an investigation by FBI agents, he was arraigned before the U. S. Commissioner.

He informed Commissioner Gardner he was unable to read or write English and had been working on farms, cutting wood, in the vicinity of Quakertown and Richlandtown.

He explained that he was born in the United States but at the age of about four months was taken to Hungary by his mother. He returned to this country 21 years ago and has been living here since.
