During that time the total number of patients taken care of is somewhat over 3000 per cent of the rated bed capacity of the hospital. The organization sailed from the United States in March, 1943, and first set up the hospital at Constantine, Algeria. It moved to Italy in January, 1944, and at present occupies its second location in Italy. Although the building was not a hospital originally, it has been converted into one of the finest hospitals in this theater. Figures cannot be given, but the overall death rate has been slightly over one-tenth of one per cent.
