Battle Weary Veteran Back To 'See Town'

If you ever wondered what it's like to come back to the old home town after you've been away from it for a few years, just ask Staff Sergeant Andrew Cmorey who fought his way home from the Hawaiian Islands, Casablanca, Tunisia, Sicily and France—and the campaign ribbons, Purple Heart and Bronze Cluster he wears give mute evidence of what a tough fight it was.

Sgt. Cmorey enlisted in the U. S. Army in 1939 and this is the first furlough he has had since. He has taken part in the major European battles and received the Purple Heart for wounds received in April, 1943, in the Sicilian campaign. He was again wounded in France, August 28, 1944, and awarded the Bronze Cluster.

Prior to enlisting S-Sgt. Cmorey was a student at Bethlehem Technical High School. When asked what he was going to do while at home with his father, Andrew Cmorey, 805 Hayes Street, Sgt. Cmorey replied, "I'm going to see the town—it's changed quite a bit since I left."
