**Pfc. W. R. Rowe  
On Way Home  
From Germany**

Pfc. Walter R. Rowe informed his wife, Mrs. Walter Rowe, 108 Vineyard Street, that he is now on his way back to the "good old U. S. A." from Germany.

Pfc. Rowe arrived in England Oct. 5, 1942, and since D-Day has seen action in Normandy, France, Belgium and Germany. He holds the Good Conduct Medal and a certificate from his commanding officer, Maj. General Gerhardt, honoring him for fighting with the 29th "Blue and Gray" Infantry Division during the capture of St. Lo. Overseas for the past two years and seven months, Rowe recently sent home a few souvenirs.

Pfc. and Mrs. Rowe have a daugh-

ter, Barbara Ann, whom the young soldier saw when she was only three weeks old. Two of his brothers were killed in action, Pfc. George P. L. Rowe, killed in Italy, and Pfc. Edward F. Rowe, killed in Germany.
