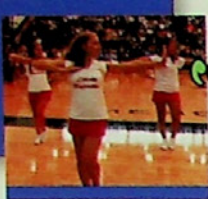

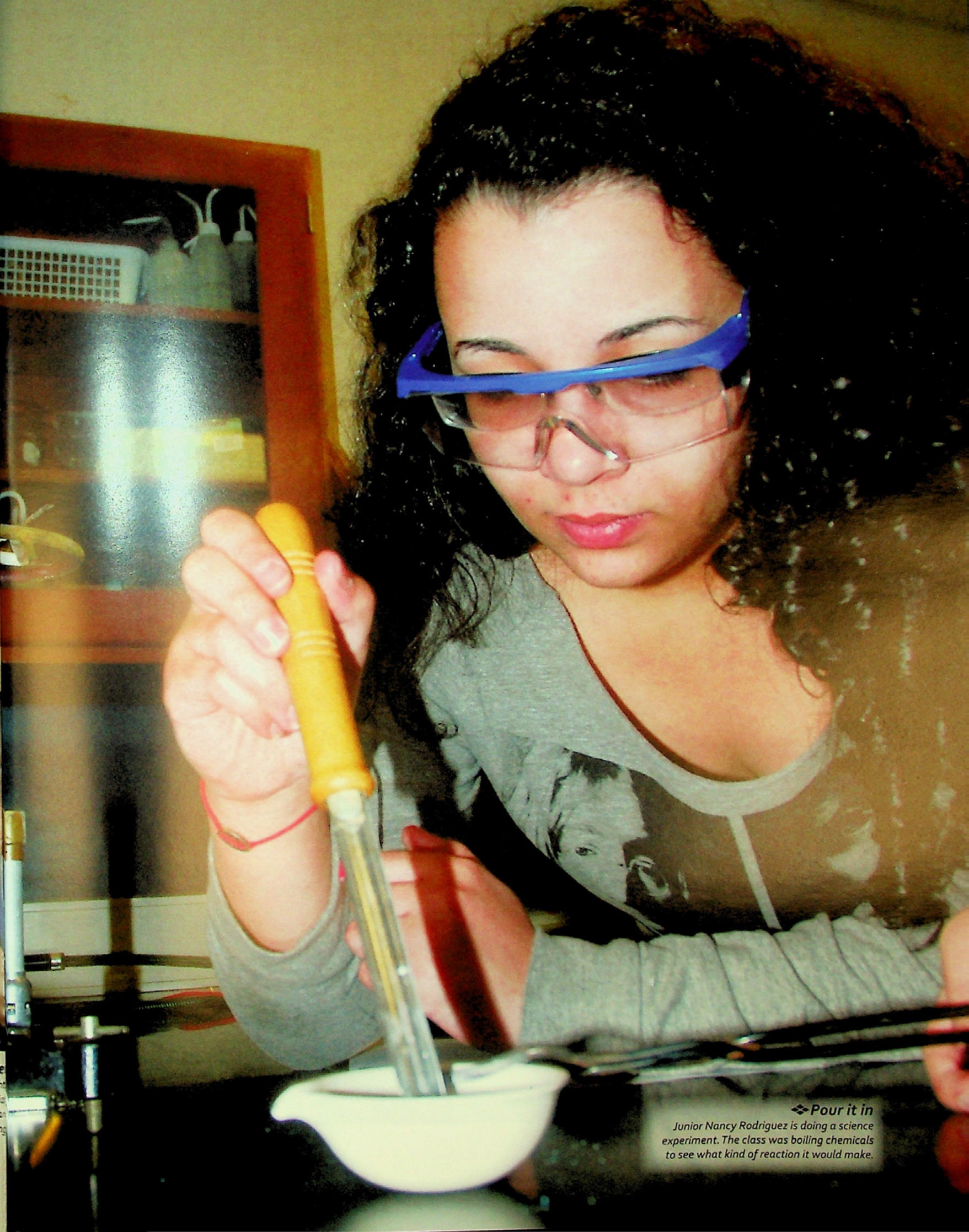

If students would just learn to have a little fun while getting some exercise, gym class might not be so bad. ❖

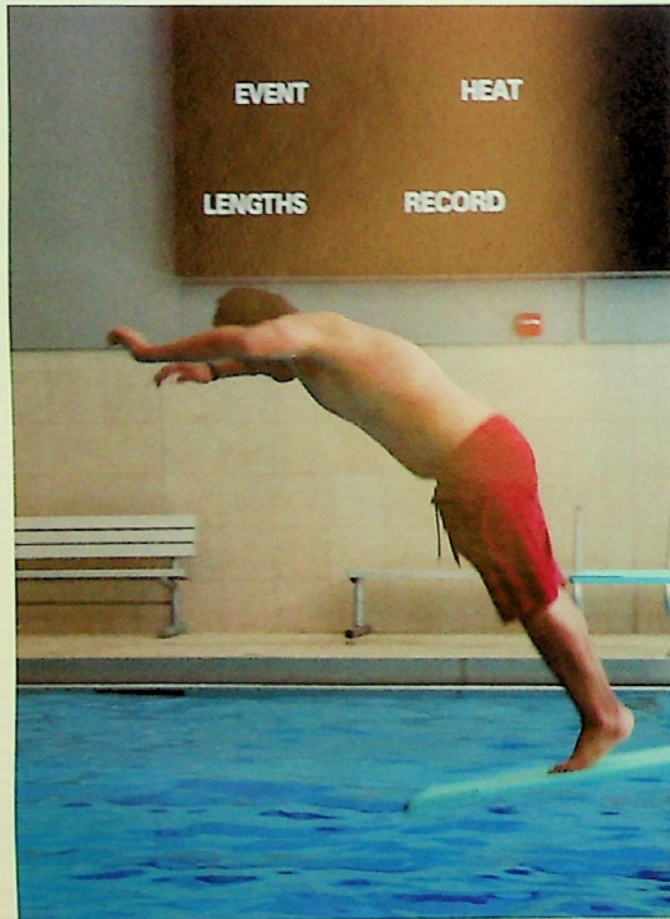

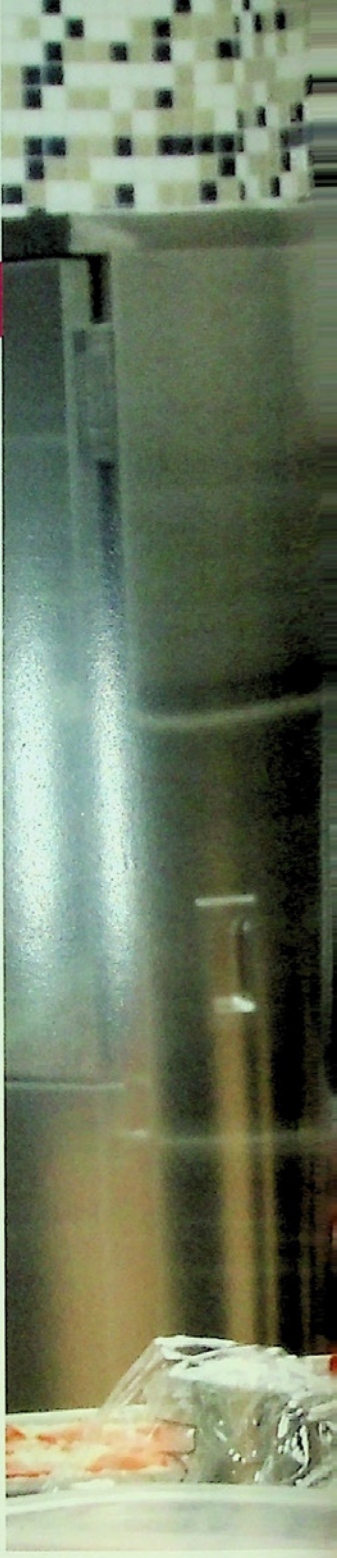

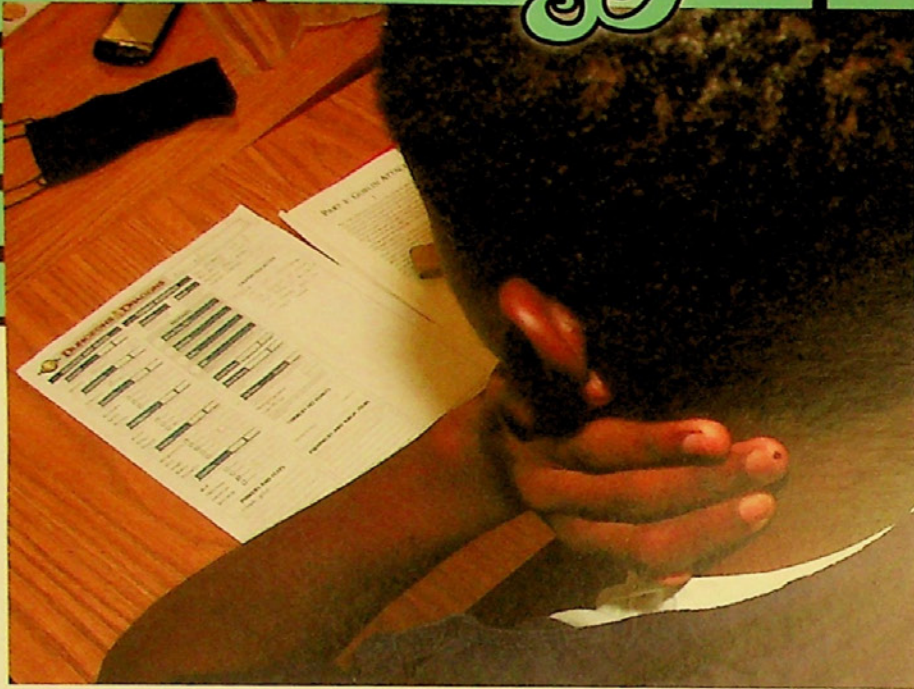

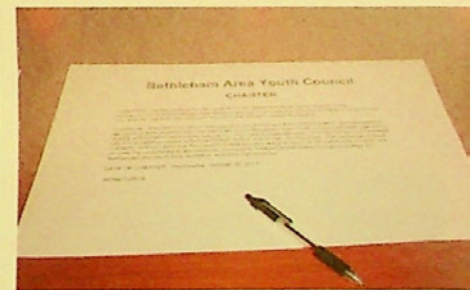

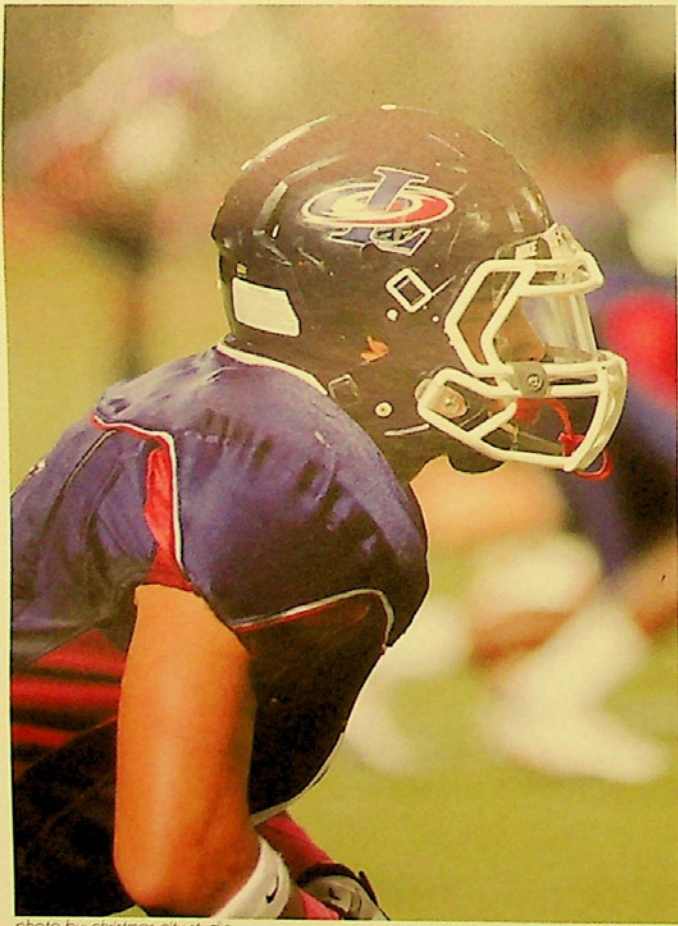

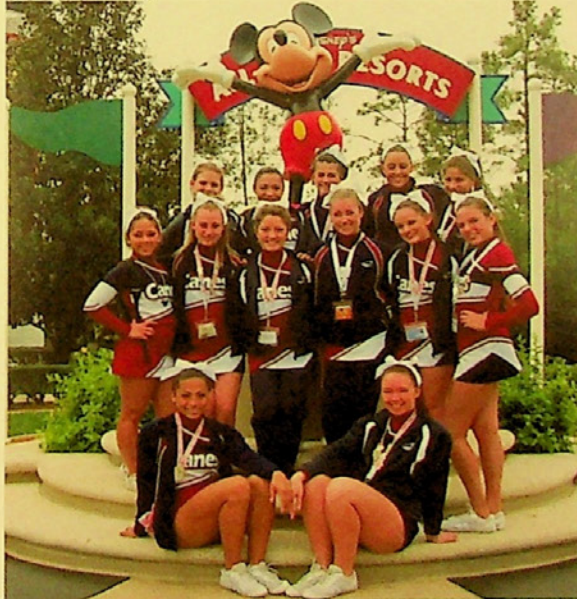

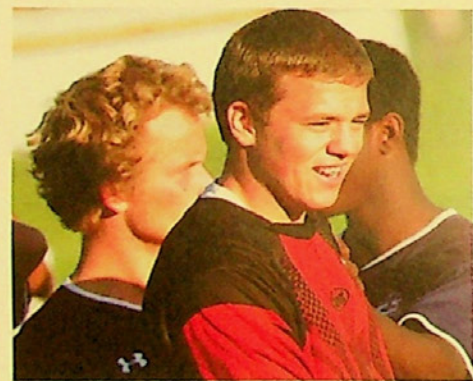

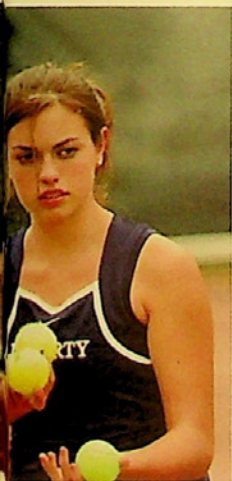

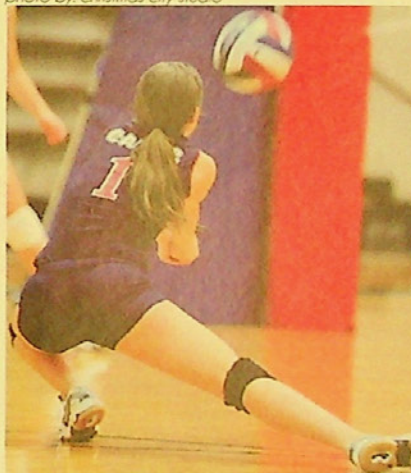

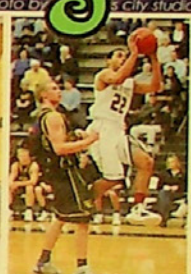

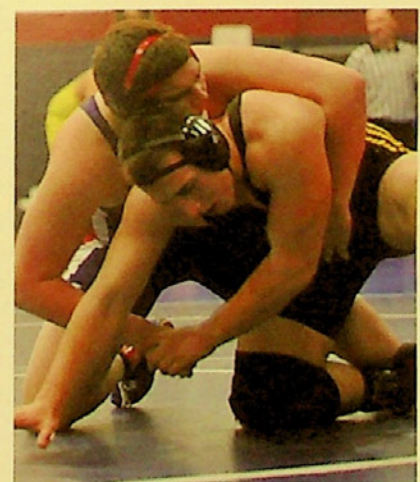

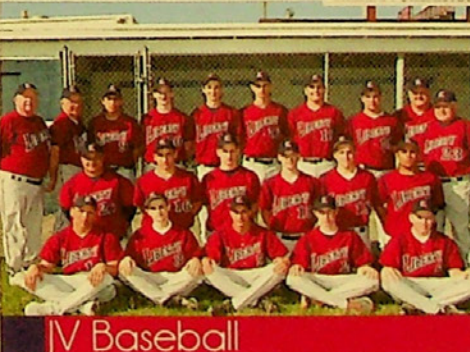

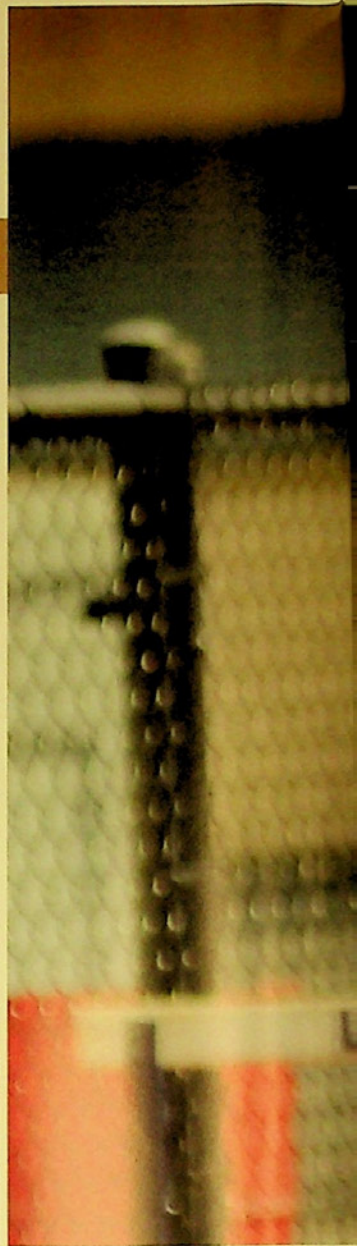

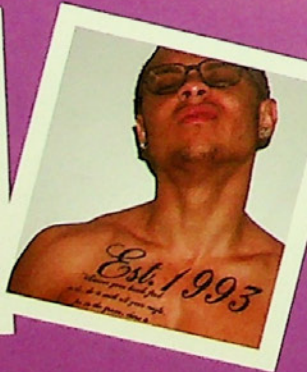
"Because I was a girl"

1 CHANCE 2 LEARN from history

On October 18, 2011 freshmen students were presented with a program from the Holocaust Awareness Museum and Education Center. Assisting with the coordination of this event was Mrs. Zions-Bernstein. This program was designed to teach students about the horrific events of the Holocaust while working with students to examine the basic moral issues and value systems of today. Students watched a short play that told the story of children and families growing up in Nazi Germany from various perspectives. They also watched a slide presentation and were broken into smaller groups to hear presentations from Holocaust survivors. This program was called the Witness to History Project. It was designed to give direct interaction between students or adults and Holocaust survivors. Participants "step into the shoes" of a survivor by learning his or her unique account of survival through listening to the survivor tell his or her story, asking questions, writing a biography, reviewing a videotape, and re-telling the story to others. It is the hope of this experience to teach students not only about history, but how to overcome the struggle against intolerance in the past, present, and the future.

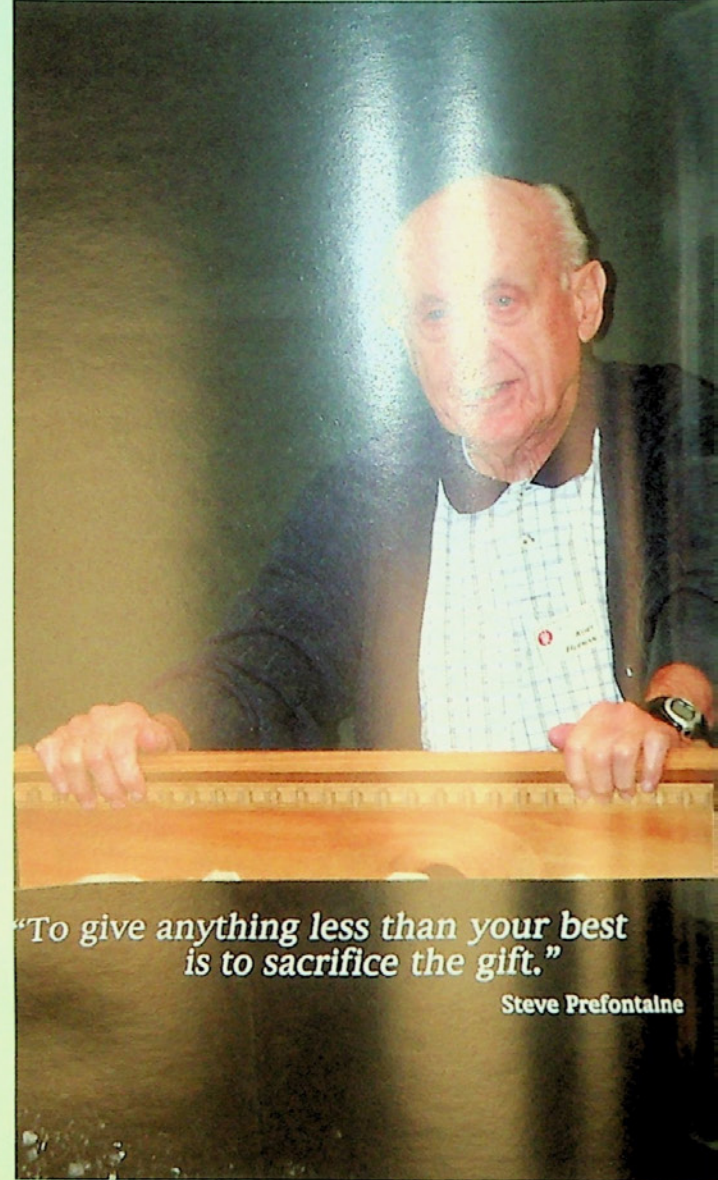
