Home After Three Years Of Service

Pfc. Jack Santoro, 30, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gregory Santoro, of 1233 East Third Street, is home on a 30-day furlough after spending three years and three months in the service without a furlough. He has just returned from the New Guinea theater.

Pfc. Santoro has participated in at least three major battles. He entered the service in July, 1941, and after completing basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., was sent to the Panama Canal Zone, arriving there only two days before Pearl Harbor.

Following a year of service in the Canal Zone he was sent to the South Pacific, where he was stationed until recently. He arrived home on Sunday and will report to Fort Dix, N. J., on Oct. 18, at the completion of his furlough.

Before entering the Army, Pfc. Santoro attended Bethlehem schools and was employed at the Bethlehem Steel Company.
