Warren H. Zingler, Machinist's Mate Second Class, U. S. Navy, is recuperating from injuries suffered in a recent engagement, according to information received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Zingler of 1737 East Tenth Street.

On February 2, his parents were notified of the injury to the young man, through the Navy Department. On January 29, a shipmate, wrote to the young man's parents, informing them of circumstances and telling them that their son was unable to write because both his hands and arms were bandaged.

On February 8 a letter was received from Zingler who told his parents that the bandages had been removed and he was again able to write. He was wounded "somewhere in the Mediterranean area."

Graduating from Fountain Hill High School with the Class of '39, he enlisted in the Navy on November 12, 1943. After receiving his boot training at Bainbridge, Md., he was transferred to Boston where he completed a prescribed course, graduating with the rank of Macihnist's Mate Second Class.

He was subsequently sent to New York City and later to a Virginia port, from which point he left for overseas duty. He has spent the past six months in active service.
