Three Back in U. S. After Service Abroad

Three local GI's have returned to the various redistribution stations in the States after several months duty in the different theaters of war.

Cpl. Paul E. Hershey, 20, of Zion Hill, arrived at Charleston, S. C., several days ago by transport plane enroute home for 30 days. Cpl. Hershey was inducted into the Army June 1943 and went overseas to a base in Italy in January 1945. He has been awarded the Air Medal and Bronze Battle Star for his ETO ribbon. His father is John A. Hershey, Springtown.

Pfc. Herbert J. Ulshafer, son of James Ulshafer, 329 West Goepp Street, arrived at a Miami, Fla., redistribution center for reassignment processing. He served in the Mediterranean and European theaters as an Army medic for 33 months.

Pvt. Steve J. Meyer, 317 East Fifth Street, returned to an Atlantic City, N. J., station from the European theater where he served 16 months as a rifleman. He is a recipient of the European-African-Middle Eastern campaign ribbons, Purple Heart and Combat Infantryman's Badge. Before entering the service he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company.
