Corp H. D. Shook Killed In Accident In France, June 12

Mrs. Marjorie Shook, of Bangor R. 3, on Saturday afternoon received a telegram from the War Department, informing her of the death of her husband Corporal Harold D. Shook, in a motor accident in France on June 12.

Corporal Shook died as a result of a fractured skull, and was buried June 14 in Lyons, France.

Surviving other than his wife are his mother, Mrs. Jennie Shook, and the following brothers and sisters: Elwood, Stroudsburg; Russell, Bangor; Mrs. Melvin Brandes, Bangor; Mrs. Harold Messinger, Bangor; Mrs. William Dillman, Ruth, Shirley and Kenneth Shook, all at home.

Corporal Shook was inducted into the Army, December 30, 1942, and had been overseas for a year and a half. He received all his training in this country at Camp Gruber, Oklahoma. He entered France shortly after D-Day, and was assigned to the Third Army Engineers.
