Cousins Meet After 14 Months Separation 26 1944

Fourteen months of separation due to commitments with Uncle Sam's armed forces ended in a reunion for two Bethlehem cousins somewhere in England and Cpl. Robert A. MacWilliams, Jr., and Cpl. Donald L. Shellenberger were enabled to spend January 14 and 15 together as guests of the Red Cross. They met in a Red Cross canteen in Cambridge, according to the report.

Cpl. MacWilliams is the nephew of Mrs. Dora L. O'Cock, of Bethlehem, and brother of Gloria MacWilliams, 201 West Broad Street. He is a graduate of Bethlehem High School and Moravian College and was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company before he entered the service.

Cpl. Shellenberger is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Shellenberger, 832 Hawthorne Road. He entered the service January 2, 1942, from employment by the Bethlehem Steel Company.
