Corporal Russell Trimble, son of James A. Trimble, Fountain Hill, is doing his bit with the Seventh Army, and according to a letter received by an intimate friend, "they are going places."

In part the missive said: "We are really moving now, not stopping for anything but Berlin.

"We had a lot of trouble with rain and mud, but now, it is as cold as _____. It is a swell break for us.

"Met quite a few fellows from Pennsylvania, two of them from Bethlehem.

"The German whiskey is good and has a _____ of a kick.

"We liberated a great many places, the largest being Saarburg. We had a hot time there.

"Food is good and plenty of it. We are well taken care of. And the French girls _____."

The letter was written on Nazi stationery.
