

# Nazareth Soldier Dies In France

Sgt. Joseph F. Nagy, 28, son of Mrs. Anna Nagy, 325 Madison Avenue, Nazareth, died Oct. 5, in France, according to a telegram sent by the War Department to his mother, yesterday.

The telegram reads as follows: "The Secretary of War asks that I assure you of his deep sympathy in the loss of your son, Sgt. Joseph F. Nagy. Report received states he died Oct. 5 in France. Letter follows." It was signed by J. A. Ulio, the Adjutant General.

Sgt. Nagy entered the service in June, 1942, and received his basic training at Camp Claiborne, La. He spent nine months at Fort St. John, Canada, and in February, 1943, came home for a brief furlough. He received his rating as a corporal at that time. He attended Officers' Candidates School at Fort Belvoir, Va., and was then sent to Greenville, Pa., from which place he was sent overseas on May 30, 1943. After about six months in England, he was promoted to the rank of sergeant.

On Sept. 29 he wrote home that he was fine and had seen action in Cherbourg, Valogues, St. Mere Eglise, St. Pieres Eglise and other parts of France.

He was a graduate of the Holy Family School, Nazareth, and the Nazareth High School. Prior to entering the service he was employed by the Lone Star Cement Corporation. He was a member of the Holy Family Church, Nazareth, and a trustee of the Holy Family Sick and Relief Society.

In addition to his mother, he is survived by four brothers and two sisters. They are Seaman 2-c John H. Nagy, U. S. Navy, Emerick, Luke and Frank; Mrs. John Keppel and Mrs. Louis Sakasitz, Jr., of Nazareth.
