Brothers Back From Front Meet At Home

Two Bethlehem brothers in the armed services returned from overseas to meet while home on furloughs. They are Pvt. George Knibbs and Norman Knibbs, seaman first class, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Knibbs, 13 West Raspberry Street.

The soldier, on a 25 day furlough, will leave Tuesday for Staunton, Va., where he will marry Miss Ruby Coffman, of that city. He was in major engagements in Sicily and Italy. Africa was included in his travels during a year overseas. Private Knibbs was a riveter for Bethlehem Steel Company prior to his induction 15 months ago. He will report to Camp Lee, Va., April 2.

The sailor, overseas four of his eight months in the service, will report to Hoboken, N. J., Friday, after a four day furlough. Seaman Knibbs saw action in Africa. He had been a farm employe in Quakertown.
