Lindner has been a member of the band since its organization in 1935. Previously he played with the Liberty High School Band. The municipal musical organization has made arrangements to obtain a service fleg showing the number of members in the services, which has reached a total of eight with Lindner's induction.

Termination of the concerts at Taylor Stadium was made necessary because of the vacation season being at hand for the bandsmen. Eight formal concerts and the July Fourth appearance at the community-wide celebration marked the season at the stadium, first time in several years that the band played a series on the South Side. Ten concerts were scheduled originally.
