Pvt. Alex Sakovics Reported Killed in Accident Last July A War Department telegram re- pany employe, he enlisted

A War Department telegram received yesterday informed Mrs. Alex Sakovics, 203½ East Morton Street, that her husband, Pvt. Alex Sakovics, died of injuries received in a jeep accident in France, July 2, 1944. Mrs. Sakovics, who had last heard from her paratrooper husband a month after he participated in the D-Day invasion, tried to get information concerning his whereabouts through the Red Cross. They notified her that Pvt. Sakovics' field director could not give any information except that her husband was no longer with the 377th Airborne Division.

A former Bethlehem Steel Com-

pany employe, he enlisted May 28, 1942, and completed his training at Camp Wheeler and Fort Benning, Ga., and at Fort Bragg, N. C. Pvt. Sakovics was sent to England for a rest after the invasion and had returned to active duty in France at the time of his death.

In addition to his wife and 3½-year-old son, Stephen, he is survived by his father, Sigmond; a sister, Irene, Bethlehem R. D. 4, and the following brothers, Joseph, Miller Heights; Steve, at home; Pvt. Charles, U. S. Army; William, U. S. Navy, and Julius, U. S. Army. Date of memorial services will be announced later.
