Pen Argyl Girl Bride Sunday Of Lt. Cawley

The marriage of Miss Laenore Mae Yeisley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Clayton Yeisley, of South Robinson Avenue, Pen Argyl, to Lt. Harry Edwin Cawley, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Cawley, of the American Hotel, Bethlehem, took place Sunday afternoon at 4:30 p. m., in Faith Evangelical and Reformed Church, Pen Argyl, with the Rev. Amandus S. Leiby, pastor of the church, officiating at a double ring ceremony.

Miss Evelyn Yeisley, of Philadelphia, sister of the bride, was maid of honor for her sister, while the bridegroom was attended by Robert Hinkle, of Bethlehem, as the best man. Ushers were Capt. Lawrence Huth, an uncle of the bride, and Lt. Michael Tichy, of Pittston.

The church was decorated in the Christmas season motif. A recital was given prior to the wedding by Mrs. R. Earl Doney, church organist, together with organ and piano music with Miss Miriam M. Creitz, of Pen Argyl, at the piano. Mrs. Doney also played during the ceremony.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, wore a gown of old ivory faille taffeta with a wide ruffle of Chantilly lace a yoke of illusion. Her tulle veil, finger tip length, fell from a Juliet cap of latticed faille and seed pearls. She carried a prayer book with a white orchid marker and ribbon streamers.
