**Nazareth Officer,
Among First In
Rome, Missing 25 1944**

Lieut. Fred Druckenmiller, 26, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. W. Druckenmiller, 433 East Center Street, Nazareth, has been reported missing in action since June 26.

A member of an armored tank division, he was one of the first tank drivers to enter Rome, having been attached to one of the advance units fighting in Italy. He has been in service for two years and 16 months overseas.

He is a graduate of the Ben Avon High School, Pittsburgh and attended the University of Pittsburgh for two years prior to his Tank Corps training at Fort Knox, Ky. He is a nephew of Dr. Stanley Druckenmiller, Lansford.

A brother, Pvt. First Class Garrett J. Druckenmiller is attached to the Canine Division at Fort Royal, Va. The parents and a sister, Mrs. Raymond G. Benjamin, reside in Nazareth. The latter's husband is also with the armed forces overseas, having entered the service while residing in New York City.
