

Lieur, L. E. MILLER Learn Son's Plane Fell Into Adriatic

Mr. and Mrs. L. G. Miller of 929 6th Avenue, have received letters from the War Department and the Bureau of Missing Personnel of the Air Corps concerning the mishap in which their son, 2nd Lieut. Louis Emerson Miller, was reported missing over Hungary on March 8.

According to the information, the B-24 bomber, of which Lieut. Miller was bombardier, was on the way to a target over Hungary, carrying a full load of bombs and supplies, when it suddenly went into a tailspin and fell into the Adriatic Sea.

Although rescue parties were immediately dispatched to the scene, no further information has since been heard of the 11 men aboard the plane. Lieut. Miller was on his ninth bombing mission when the accident occurred.

The 20-year-old airman, whose 21st birthday falls on June 21, entered service in June, 1943, and received his commission at Albuquerque, N. M., before being sent overseas in December, 1944.

Prior to entering the Air Corps, he was graduated from Liberty High School in 1942 and attended Lehigh University for one year. A brother, 1st Lieut. Edwin H.
